

This year the Junior Precision Rifle Team took it to a new level.

had the amazing opportunity to take the Lincoln Rifle Club's Junior Precision Team to Camp Perry where they competed in the 3 Position be on the line at 0730 (that's 0430 at **Smallbore National Championships** and the Air Rifle 60 Shot Standing National Championships. We had 10

kids and 12 parents on this trip and every single person contributed in making this an amazing experience. Like last year we stayed in the cottages

right on Camp Perry where we had a chance to swim in Lake Erie and watch the amazing sun rises. It's definitely a tough trip and it tends to test the kids resolve. We all meet at SMF

at Odark30, travel 34 the way across the country to compete in the eastern time zone, where we are expected to home). But our kids handled it like champs. They shot 4 days in a row, the first day was practice (formally

> known as PET or Pre Event Training), then on days 2 and 3, they shot two matches each day, one at 0730 and the second at 1230 and on day 4 they

shot in a team event. Then to add even more pressure, this match is an "open", meaning that anyone in the country can show up and shoot...and they did. For each discipline there



were 4 relays of about 75 shooters and the nation's best were there to compete, including two Olympic Medalists. Which is pretty cool for our kids and Lisa Diaz (mostly Lisa 2), Dan to say that they have competed with Olympians. That said, they worked hard to put up some amazing scores. Five of our ten girls shot personal bests and three others held on to amazing scores even though they had never shot in a national match before. Notably, was Eva Carbajal, that was so sick the first morning she didn't even shoot, then she got on the line late in the day to shoot a personal

best of 606.3, only to beat that score the next day with a 613.5. After the matches, and following tradition, we took the kids to Cedar Point where they rode the largest and fastest roller coasters in the world, and I logged about 20k steps, ate the most amazing funnel cake and stayed until they closed so we could collect Ava's cell phone that was lost on a ride.

I am so grateful for our team, the kids are absolutely wonderful and truly want to excel in this amazing sport; I really am blessed to a part of this organization. Lastly, I could not have done this without the help of the parents, especially, Robert Lusk, Michael Scholz, Matt Costello, Sarah Carbajal and Phil Shen, you all are amazing and I am so grateful for everything you do.

#### THE CONVENTIONAL PISTOL SEASON WILL BEGIN THIS NOVEMBER.

We will be shooting the second <u>Wednesday in November and December then the second, fourth and fifth Wednesday each month.</u>

Doors will open at 1:30, relays at 2:30, 4:00, 5:30 and 7:00. There is a \$10 registration fee, then \$5 cost per match.

Conventional Pistol is a 65 round, seven course of fire match with two categories: standard-one hand, and "F" class- two hands. We average thirty shooters per year with male/female, farther/daughter, father/son, husband/wife, younger and older shooters. The match is open to club members and their spouse if both are present.

#### **Free Conventional Pistol Class**

Do you have a .22lr pistol you enjoy shooting? Come to the CP class and learn how easy and fun this match is. The class will be October 29th, 7:00 PM at the indoor range. Pre-registration is required as there are limited shooting lanes. Shooters will need a .22lr pistol, 70 rounds of ammunition and eye/ear protection.

# CIVILIAN MARKSMANSHIP PROGRAM

irst off, I wanted to thank Sam Schrader and Steve Micheli for officiating the CMP match on June 21st while I was visiting my little granddaughter. An award was earned at that match by Jaime Bagtas in the unlimited modern military category, a bronze pin using a scoped AR platform. Thanks Sam and Steve for "holding the fort" and a safe fun match.

Our July match featured a new shooter, James Carson, who really did his research about the CMP and the John C. Garand course "A" match in general. He also appeared to be a "natural" using an M-1 Carbine. He actually shot well with what the Government intended to be a "replacement earned Jaime a silver award pin. A few more in certain situations for the M1911,45 cal. Semi-Auto pistol. Considering this, his scores were very good at 100 yards in prone position. In a full carbine match, it consists of 40 shots, and adds a sitting/kneeling position to the Garand course "A" match which is 30 shots for record.

In the second relay, James used a type 99 Japanese Arisaka, 7.7 mm. He shot acceptable scores in prone slow fire and used the stripper clips very well in the prone rapid fire stage. The offhand/standing position needs some work, but it was so interesting to see something out of the ordinary in the vintage foreign military category. James said his grandfather took part in the invasion of Okinawa (April through June 1945), and brought the Arisaka home as a war souvenir. There are a few scratches on the stock, but the rifle functions very smoothly.

In the July match, Jaime Bagtas again was entered in the unlimited modern military category. He was using an scoped AR. His prone slow score was a 100-3X /100-10X possible. Prone rapid, 99-3X/100-10X possible and an 89-1X / 100-10X possible. This points needed in offhand/standing to get the gold.

September and October 2025 matches will be held on the THIRD Saturday (Sept. 20th, and October 18th) entries taken at 0730h, 7:30AM and the fee to shoot the match is \$15.00. Come on out and have fun




