THE 2024 FISCAL YEAR

The Lincoln Rifle Club Foundation had an amazing year in 2024. We were able to go over our expected income in several categories and even had some unexpected income thanks to the Donation Drive. Our income budget for 2024 was \$350,000 and our expense budget was to break even at \$350,000. At the end of the year, we had brought in \$398,531 and spent \$363,689. Leaving us with a net income of \$34,841. Our biggest, unexpected costs were several rifle purchases for the Junior's Division and the November Ormsby Range project. All in all, we think this was a very successful year for our club and we look forward to what 2025 will bring us. This year will come with several major changes as we continue with completing our Corporate merger to become a Non-Profit once again. Currently one of our attorneys from Michel and Associates is working with the Secretary of States office to expedite our filing.

1ST ANNUAL SAFETY DAY FAIR

The 1st Annual Lincoln Safety Day Fair hosted by Lincoln Gun Exchange took place on September 14th last year and we think it was a huge success! Both the Lincoln Rifle Club and the Placer County CRPA hosted booths in Beerman's Plaza and an estimated 1000 people came through. During the event we had the chance to speak with tons of people who maybe weren't familiar with shooting, and we learned so much about our towns demographic. Many of the attendees were younger children and our Junior's Program received a lot of attention and several children who signed up on the spot! This event was great for getting in touch with the citizens of Lincoln to spread information about our Club and we hope to attend again next year! We'd like to thank Randy and Helen Johnson of the Lincoln Gun Exchange for hosting the event and helping us a bunch on the day of! Be sure to keep an eye out for the next one coming up in September.

ANNIE GET YOUR GUN 2024

Last year's Annie Get Your Gun Match started with 90 registered participants and a waiting list. Our participants ranged from complete beginners to women who are fire-

arm instructors themselves. Shooting Squads were divided into 9 teams of 10, led by a Squad Leader to provide instruction and direction. In addition to the Squad Leaders, we had 9 stations of Rifle, Pistol, or Shotgun Instructors ready to help the different squads through their course of fire. The ability to put on such a large event safely is a credit to both the volunteers who worked diligently to ensure the safety of everyone involved, and all the ladies who participated being excellent students. Many groups stepped up to help make this Annie Get Your Gun possible. The LRC Multi-Gun Division, The Gold Country & Sierra Foothills Chapters of A Girl & A Gun, and Girls Guns & Giggles to name a few. We also had several local firearm instructors, LRC Members, and Range Safety Officers who volunteered; Kathy Zick provided lunch catering to all participants and volunteers as well. Officially we had over 25 volunteers; unofficially however, many participants also stepped in to lend a hand where they could, be it directing parking, assisting with participant check-ins, or helping set up tables and canopies. 


We had a great turn out for the 250th anniversary of the "Shot Heard Around the World".

CLUB HIGH POWER

he new season for the 2025 Club High Power match started in April. This match is one of the longest, if not the longest running match sponsored by the LRC. It is conducted like a practice match for shooters wishing to learn how to shoot high power competitively or just want to improve on their marksmanship skills. At the Dillman Range, on the 2nd & 4th Thursdays of each month, beginning in April through September, (October is the 2nd and 3rd Thursdays). The 1st match of each month has shooters firing in the standing slow fire & rapid prone shooting positions. The second match of the month has shooters fire from the slow prone & rapid sitting positions. All courses of fire are fired on standard NRA 200 yd. targets. CMP & NRA high power rules allow for the use of scopes. While NRA & CMP have specific rules for the type of rifle used in the Service Rifle or Match Rifle categories, we are very lax on these rules for the club event since the scores are not sent into the NRA. Please come with a rifle that can easily be reloaded with a magazine or striper clip that holds at least 5 rounds of ammunition and can easily fire 10 rounds in 60 seconds.

You will need 25 rounds of ammunition for this match. Match fee for this match is \$5.00.

This match is a great way to improve your marksmanship skills with your rifle and have fun in the process. Most shooters are shooting some type of AR-15 chambered in .223. While this is not a requirement for this match, it is the easiest rifle type to use for these matches. We do have a limited number of Club Rifles that can be used for this match, but these will need to be requested in advance of the matches to be made available. Club ammo is also available for a fee. Please let me know in advance to make sure we have ammo available.

Please contact me if you would like more information about the Thursday Night Club High Power matches and I hope to see you on the range.

Occasionally, at the Sunday matches, we adjust our machine to throw doubles; yep, two at a time. This is an additional challenge and can humble the absolute best trap shooters.

The shotgun sports include more than just trap. We are fortunate to have other shotgun challenges available to us at the nearby Golden State Shooting Center (GSSC), formerly Coon Creek. At this facility, you can take your shotgun out and take part in not only trap, but also, skeet, 5-stand, wobbles, and sporting clays. All have their own charm and provide the opportunity to master the art of shotgun shooting. There is nothing quite like following the target across the sky and seeing it break into pieces. ur March match was held on the 15th with excellent shooting conditions. Ian McIntyre was using his scoped AR platform rifle entered in the unlimited modern military category. Ian shot a great score of 284-7X / 300 which earned him a bronze award pin in that category. His only stage which held back the silver or gold pins was the unsupported off-hand / standing position. He needed about ten more points.

tomatic with "as-issue' weight limitations that is used in the 21st Century by the U.S. or foreign militaries. 20th Century foreign military bolt rifles are in the Vintage Foreign Military class, U.S. Springfields are in the 1903 or 1917 class, The match is named for the principle rifle used: The U.S. Rifle, Caliber .30 M-1. There you have "as-issue" class and if using a national match M-1, the Unlimited Garand class.

I was using a M-1903A1 and made the mistake of relying on the old ladder sight range numbers. I had not used the rifle in a while and needed a much better reference guide to "the old Timey" sight that does not have click adjustments. The Moral: practice a few times at the range before shooting the rifle in a match which you want to score well in.

Any semi-automatic U.S. or foreign 21st century weapon that is CA legal, but uses a telescopic / optical sight is in the Unlimited Modern Military class. The one that you need high points to medal in. The M-1-A (the civilian version of the M-14) is in Modern Military category if it is without a scope.

Sometimes, I get emails from club members that ask the question: "What type of rifle can I use to compete in a CMP match?" The best answer is any CA legal bolt action military rifle (small arms) that was used in the 20th Century or any CA legal semi- au-

Another question I get asked is: "can I order CMP rifles or a M1911 pistol from the CMP?" The Lincoln Rifle Club is an affiliated club of the CMP. This means any member of our club that has met all of the CMP requirements to purchase a firearm, may order from the CMP and have the rifle / pistol shipped to a licensed FFL dealer (CA law). If there is a requirement to participate

- in an organized shooting competition, shooting in one of our LRC matches will satisfy that requirement. When you shoot our match for the first time, you will receive a Certificate of Achievement which can be sent to the CMP with a firearm order forms package.

Our next shoot is on the 19th of April. We will first participate in the California Rifle and Pistol Association's event: "The Shot Heard Around the World" (April 19th 1775) This one shot event will take place just prior to our CMP John C. Garand course "A" match. Our match requires a minimum of 35 rounds of ammunition and the cost of the match is \$15.00.

As a little plug to the CRPA, I would like to report a very successful day on Wednesday April 9th 2025. This was CRPA's Capitol Day. This event hosted more than 50 representatives from around the state that met with CA Assembly Members and State Senators. The delegation was led by CRPA's lead legislative man, Rick Travis and his assistants, Kurt Williams and Kevin Small. This team presented to individual legislators, the CRPA's positions on various proposed state laws dealing with firearms and hunting.

The next Capitol Day in August will feature Women in the Shooting Sports. So, all women who want to explain their positions on gun laws, can sign up through the CRPA to attend the next Capitol Day.

Our next sanctioned CMP matches will be on 17 May and 21June 2025. See you "down range"
