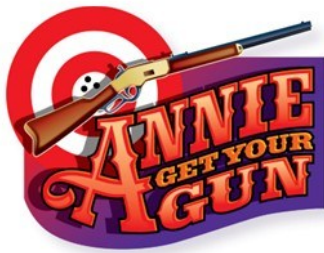

On July 10th Lincoln Rifle Clubs Junior Precision Team headed back to Camp Perry, OH to shoot in the National Championships. This year we took 8 kids and we competed with both the Smallbore and Air Rifles. I could not have asked for a better group of kids and parents. Our kids traveled as a team, helped each other on and off the line and ultimately, had fun. And EVERYONE was so over-the-top helpful, kind and did their absolute best to set a great example to the other competitors. While traveling and everywhere we went, we wore our LRC National Team jackets, making our presence with the

shooting community known.

On the 12th we started our Air Rifle PET (Pre Event Training), then on the 13th had our first match for Air rifle. Cleaned up our gear and got on the line for Smallbore PET. Each day ran a very similar schedule, shooting both guns, almost back-to-back, with the afternoons off to rest. Each day we ate lunch and dinner togeth-

Since we shoot our matches in the comfort of relatively cool mornings, the summer matches took place with not much sweating. For our July match, everyone on the first relay line were using M-1 Garands. We all had a good time, but not one of us reached a score which earned an award pin. One thing for sure, those who shoot competitively, get more practice and know their rifle better than the person who keeps their rifle in a safe, (or closet) and shoots it once a year.

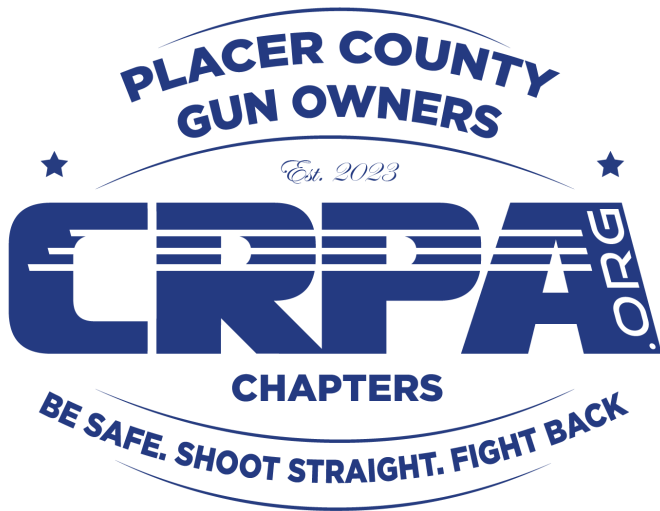
Then came the second relay. One of our regular shooters, who re-fires a different rifle in the second relay, Jaime Bagtas, switched to a scoped AR platform in the Unlimited Modern Military category. He scored a 277-4X, which in that category earned him a bronze award pin. More modern the rifle, the higher score needed. Congrats Jaime, I owe you a bronze pin- on back order.

Our August match consisted of only one relay. My wife was hospitalized a couple of weeks prior to match date, and I needed the time flexibility to be available for medical updates. This time, most

of the shooters had M-1's, only one used a scoped AR. Nevertheless, Cary Triplet from our club, shot a 93-2X in prone slow fire, an 88-1X in prone / from standing rapid fire, and an 85-1X in offhand (standing) position for a total of 266-4X earning a bronze pin award. Great job, Cary its an accomplishment to shoot "The Beast Rifle". Jaime Bagtas just missed the bronze by three points.

Now, for some BIG NEWS, HOT OFF THE PRESS!! : 100,000 + surplus M-14, yes, M- fourteen, rifles are expected to go on sale by the U.S. Military to the public. Sales will be handled through THE CMP. This is to begin early next year. The weapons must be certified to be SEMI-AUTOMATIC only. Once this process is complete, the sales will be offered by the CMP. Rumor is, that a ball park price figure will be @\$2,000 per rifle. Those who are interested start saving up, and be prepared to write out a lot of paperwork.
