
# **Time Correction-Weekend Trap**



#### CIVILIAN MARKSMANSHIP MATCH REPORT

Our September 12th CMP match was an "award winning match," with three competitors scoring high enough in their respective categories to be awarded pins. The highest scorer was our member **Cary Triplett**, using a vintage bolt action Swedish Mauser. He shot a score of 275-7X, which earned him a silver pin. **Chris Jen**, our representative from Salinas, CA shot a 267-3X to earn a bronze pin for the M-1 as-issue Garand category. **Alan Tier** announced that he got "The Best Prone Slow Fire Ever", a 98-4X using a scoped AR-15 in the unlimited modern military category. Alan also did well in the rapid fire prone competition. Then came the offhand stage and the standing stage, which breaks many hearts. Alan just missed getting a pin award, shooting about ten points below what was needed.

For the second relay, I (**Chuck Riglick**) actually shot a bronze pin score! I was using a Swiss K-31, 7.5 X 55MM, that I acquired from a fellow trap shooter, **Bob Morell** a couple of years ago. My score was a humble 262-3X, but it put me in the bronze range for vintage bolt, foreign military category. Range officer **Samuel Schrader** checked my targets and signed my scorecards to make it official! I guess it was the fatter, wide front sight, that helped my almost 70 year old eyes get a sight picture in the middle of the paper. Bob Morell, this pin's for you. Bob has since passed away and his memorial is on the trap field honor wall at Dillman Range.

Our October 10th match was memorable in that a long time member, but first time CMP competitor, **Clay West**, shot with us. Clay was using a really nice looking Springfield M-1903A3 in this match. Clay learned much about the different positions and use of the sling in prone position. Hopefully, Clay will enjoy this CMP match as much as competing in the Club's Multi-gun matches.

For the year 2021, the LRC has been approved for 11 CMP matches. Basically, it is on the second Saturday of each month, EXCEPT MAY, for the CMP John C. Garand Course "A" matches at Dillman Range. Entries are taken at 7:30 am with matches starting at

8:00 am. The match fee will remain \$15, and each competitor will need a minimum of 35 rounds to complete the course of fire. There were 113 competitors in this match and Lincoln may not have taken home any top awards, but as always, our presence is known, and our kids are getting on the board. **Will Brandt** still working hard at building his shot plan finished with a 362.3, then his sister **Rachel** wrapped up with a 390.4, inching closer to **Carleton Liden** who finished with a 397.3 and **Tori Watts** came in 20th place with a 410. All respectable scores and a great day on the Range.

The very next weekend was the Midway USA 2020 Hometown Challenge. This was a 60 shot offhand match and all 12 of our kids participated; several bringing their A game to whoop it on...coach **Steve** even shot, but we don't need to mention his score □. Out of a total possible 600 points, the top scores for our team were put up by **Tori Watts** (586-37x), **Morgan Vander Linden** (584-35x), **Lily Polakovic** (578-32x), and **Logan Michael** (576.25x). Several of the other kids put up solid scores and are well on their way to easily qualifying for the Junior Olympics 2021.

Our next big match will be held on the weekend of November 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>, where the kids will compete in the Best in the West competition, which is a CMP Cup 3 Position Air Rifle match on Saturday and a CRPA Standing Air Rifle Match on Saturday.
