After all the excitement of Annie Get Your Gun settled down, we jumped right into the holiday season and preparations for the New Year. The 5 Days of Christmas Sale, held during the second week of December, is one of the highlights of the season. This year we sold \$4,640 worth of Range Passes. This year's sales almost *doubled* the amount of passes we sold during our 2024 Christmas sale! Also in December, we were finally able to roll out a new CCW Instructor scheduling portal on our website. CHUCK RIGLICK CMP MATCH DIRECTOR

On Saturday December 20th, 2025 we held our last 2025 John C. Garand, Springfield, Vintage Foreign Military and Modern Military Rifle match. But don't worry, we will be back in 2026, holding our match the third Saturday of each month. We share the range with NRA High Power and the Trap Match. The range is closed to all other shooting until 1:00PM, so it is used for competitive shooting only.

Catching up with what happened in previous matches, since the last article in Kinetic Energy; our November 15th match, well nature gave us a real challenge in that the fog was so thick (how thick was it ??) It was so thick that we could only see out about 25 yards. The 100 yard and out was completely clouded. No black target centers visible. We waited until around 9:30 AM and started. For that ordeal, shooters got the awards (pins). Jaime

Bagtas shot a 265-2X with his M-1 which earned him a bronze pin. James Carson was one point off from a bronze ion the Unlimited Modern Military category.

In the second relay (re-fire match) Jaime used a scoped AR in the Unlimited Modern Military class and shot a 280-9X for a bronze pin. Then James Carson shot his M-1 Carbine, which is a 40 shot match. He shot a score of 330-2X which earned a bronze Carbine pin.

Pretty good jobs for a foggy morning.

Then we come to our last 2025 match. This time James Carson used a British Mark I Enfield in .303 Cal. He shot an awesome score in prone slow fire, a 95-1X with that vintage bolt rifle! His offhand score just pulled him 4 points shy of a bronze pin. Jaime Bagtas shot his M-1 and shot a 98-3X in

-prone slow, 91-1X in rapid, and 88-0 offhand for a final of 277-4X. This was a Silver M-1 score. In relay two, Jaime shot a 283-9X for a bronze in unlimited modern military (scoped AR-15).

James Carson still on the vintage track, used a Japanese Type 99 Arisaka 7.7X53mm in the second relay. His prone scores were very good. With a little more practice in offhand, James would definitely earn an award pin with this rifle.


