PASTOR'S CORNER

Blessed Are the Poor in Spirit Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family,

In today's Gospel, Jesus sits down on the mountainside and begins to teach. He does not shout. He does not command with power. Instead, He speaks words that surprise us:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit... blessed are the meek... blessed are the peacemakers."

This is not how the world usually defines blessing.

In many Native traditions, elders teach that true strength is not loud, and true wisdom is not rushed. A person becomes wise not by standing above others, but by walking humbly with the people, listening to the land, and respecting the Creator's ways. Jesus speaks in that same spirit today.

To be "poor in spirit" does not mean to be weak. It means to know our need for God. It means to stand before the Creator with open hands and an open heart, trusting that everything we have is a gift. The meek, the merciful, the pure of heart—these are people who choose kindness over pride, peace over violence, love over power.

The Beatitudes remind us that God's kingdom grows quietly—through compassion, forgiveness, patience, and

care for one another. In our families, our communities, and our reservations, we see these blessings lived out every day: in grandparents who pray faithfully, in parents who sacrifice for their children, in elders who carry stories and wisdom, and in young people who seek what is right.

This Sunday, Jesus invites us to ask:
Where do I need to be more humble before God?

How can I bring peace where there is hurt or division?

How can my life reflect the gentle strength of Christ?

May we walk the path Jesus shows us—slowly, faithfully, and together—trusting that those who walk with humble hearts are truly blessed.
