Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus looks upon the crowds and is moved with compassion because they are “troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd.” He sees their pain, confusion, loneliness, and spiritual hunger. His heart goes out to them, and He tells His disciples, “The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few.”

What a beautiful reminder that God's love begins with compassion. Jesus does not look at people with judgment or indifference. He sees them with mercy. He sees their struggles, their wounds, and their deepest needs. The same Jesus who looked upon the crowds in Galilee looks upon us today with that same compassionate gaze.

Our world continues to experience many forms of suffering: divisions within families, uncertainty about the future, violence, addictions, loneliness, and a growing loss of faith. Many people are searching for meaning and hope. They may not always say it, but deep within their hearts they are longing for God.

As members of the Church, we are called to be laborers in the Lord's harvest. This mission is not only for priests, religious, and missionaries. Every baptized Christian is called to share Christ's love through prayer, kindness, service, and witness. Sometimes the

most powerful form of evangelization is simply being present for someone, listening with compassion, offering forgiveness, or helping a neighbor in need.

Here at St. Kateri Tekakwitha Parish, we are blessed to be part of a rich Native American heritage that values community, respect for elders, care for one another, and gratitude to the Creator. These values reflect the Gospel and help us become effective laborers in God's harvest. Every act of love, every prayer offered for someone in need, and every effort to strengthen our community helps bring Christ's presence into the world.

Jesus also asks us to pray for vocations. The Church always needs holy priests, deacons, religious sisters and brothers, and dedicated lay leaders who will answer God's call. Let us pray that young people may have the courage to listen to the voice of the Lord and respond generously.

As we gather for the Eucharist this Sunday, let us ask ourselves: *How is God calling me to be a laborer in His harvest? Whom can I encourage, help, or bring closer to Christ this week?*

May we never grow tired of sharing God's love. May the compassion of Jesus fill our hearts, and may we become instruments of His peace, healing, and hope.
