## THE LAITY as FISHERS OF MEN

A reflection on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

A despondent man complained to his mother, saying: "I've stopped going to church for two reasons: I don't like the people, and the people don't like me."

The mother gazed at him compassionately and said: "My son, you should go back to church; I'll also give you two reasons why: You're already 59 years old, and you are the parish priest!"

When the Lord started His ministry, He called a core group: Peter and Andrew, James and John, and others to become henceforth "fishers of men" (Mk 1:17).

And like that despondent parish priest in the story, these chosen followers were to continue Christ's mission after He had ascended to heaven regardless of whether the people like them or not.

FOR LAITY TOO. Unfortunately, many have the wrong notion that the call of Christ to be "fishers of men" is addressed only to the apostles and their successors: Bishops and priests. That's not true. Gone are the days when the laity simply say "Amen" or obey, pray, and PAY.

The Decree on the Laity of Vatican II states: "Incorporated into Christ's Mystical Body through

baptism and strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit through confirmation; the laity are assigned to the apostolate by the Lord himself"

Today we know of more and more numerous lay Catholics who sacrifice time, treasure, and talent for the church. Think of the lay ministers, lectors, collectors, choir members, and yes, the various parish organizations like the Knights of Columbus, Cursillo Movement, Legion of Mary, Catholic Women's League, who render their services *gratis et amore*. Consider, too, the numerous lay Catholic renewal movements such as Marriage Encounter, Couples for Christ, PREX.

The most basic and effective form of being a "fisher" is through the TESTIMONY of Christian living. If people recognize a special "something," like genuine charity and joyful service, they might eventually be attracted to the Christian faith.

The British TV journalist Malcolm Muggeridge was a celebrity who did not care much about God and religion. He did something he swore he would never do – become a Catholic. What led to his conversion? He had an assignment to write about the late Mother Teresa of Calcutta. Travelling to India, Muggeridge thought the trip was just the usual work, but the amazing thing was in the course of his talks and days of observation of the kindly nun, he experienced a change of heart. Muggeridge said: "Words cannot express how much I owe her. She showed me Christianity in action... She showed me how one loving person can start a tidal wave of love that can spread to the entire world."

ASK YOURSELF: Would lukewarm and non-Catholics be edified by your way of life so that they, too, would want to become (better) Catholics? As a baptized Christian, you share in the apostolate of Christ as "fisher of men."
