# PASTOR'S CORNER

Walking the Narrow Path Together A reflection on the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings invite us to see our faith as a journey — one that requires strength, discipline, and commitment, but also one that opens the way to the Creator's house, where people of every nation and language are welcomed.

In the first reading from Isaiah, we hear of God's vision: people are gathered from all corners of the earth to worship him. For Native peoples, this speaks to the deep truth we already know — that Creator placed His Spirit in every nation and that all the tribes and peoples of the earth are part of his sacred family. This passage is like a vision of a great powwow where every nation comes together in unity, honoring the Creator with the gifts they have been given.

In the Gospel, Jesus challenges us: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." The narrow path is not easy, just like the trails our ancestors walked when traveling long distances, facing obstacles, hunger, or storms. The way of discipleship is not the wide, comfortable road, but the smaller trail that requires courage, humility, forgiveness, and sacrifice. It is the way of love — not only for our Creator, but for one another and for the earth that sustains us.

The Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that discipline is part of God's love. Just as our elders and parents corrected us so that we might grow strong and wise, so too the

Creator allows us to face trials so we may walk the good road. Discipline is not punishment, but guidance — the way a skilled teacher helps a young one learn to dance, hunt, or sing the songs of our people.

For us today, this means asking: Are we just standing nearby, claiming to know the Lord, or are we truly walking with Him each day? To walk through the narrow gate is to live faithfully, to forgive when wronged, to stand for justice, to protect the sacred gifts of creation, and to care for family and community.

Creator of all nations,
You have called us to walk the good road,
a path of love, humility, and truth.
Help us to choose the narrow way each
day,

not the wide road of selfishness and pride.

Strengthen us with Your Spirit as our elders once strengthened us on life's journey.

Teach us to forgive, to protect the gifts of creation,

and to welcome every person as a brother or sister.

When the road is hard and our hearts grow weary,

remind us that You walk beside us. And when our journey is complete, may we find our place in Your eternal lodge,

where all nations gather in peace and joy.
