PASTOR'S CORNER

"Hosanna, Son of David! Hosanna in the Highest!" A reflection on Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Today, we gather to celebrate Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week, as we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The crowds waved palm branches and laid them along His path, shouting, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Luke 19:38). It is a moment of joyous celebration, filled with the hope and excitement of a promised Savior.

Yet, as we reflect on the significance of this day, we are reminded that the very same crowd that proclaimed Jesus as King would soon turn on Him. The palm branches of triumph would give way to the cross of suffering. The Hosannas of adoration would transform into cries of "Crucify Him!" Palm Sunday marks the beginning of a journey that will lead us through the mystery of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection.
