PASTOR'S CORNER

Walking in Balance with God and Creation A reflection on the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Word of God today speaks to us about the cost of discipleship. Jesus tells His followers: "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." These are not easy words. They remind us that following Christ is not simply about comfort or convenience, but about commitment, sacrifice, and trust.

In the first reading from the Book of Wisdom, we hear how limited human understanding can be. We often see only the surface of things and struggle to grasp the deeper meaning of God's plan. But through his Spirit, the Creator reveals wisdom and strength that go beyond our own ways of thinking. This is a reminder that our ancestors—those who walked these lands before us, who lived close to the earth and to one another—also understood that life requires humility before something greater.

For us, here in the sacred lands of Southern California, these words invite us to reflect: What does it mean to follow Jesus here and now? Our Kumeyaay brothers and sisters remind us through their traditions that everything is connected—the land, the waters, the people, and the Creator's Spirit. To follow Christ is to live in that same awareness: that our choices matter, that our discipleship is not just private, but affects the community and creation around us.

Jesus asks us to count the cost. Like a builder who plans before raising a home, or a warrior who measures before battle, we too must ask: Are we ready to walk with Christ when it is not easy? Are we willing to set aside selfishness and live with generosity, compassion, and justice?

In a world so often divided by violence, greed, and indifference, discipleship means something radical: to live differently, to choose peace when others choose anger, to share when others hold back, and to forgive when others cling to resentment.

This week, may we hear Jesus' call with open hearts. May we carry our crosses with courage, not alone, but together as a community walking with one another. And may the Spirit give us the wisdom to see beyond our own understanding, to trust that God's love will guide us on the path.
