PASTOR'S CORNER

Faithful Stewards in a World of Many Masters A reflection on the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's Gospel (Luke 16:1–13) gives us one of Jesus' more puzzling parables: the story of the dishonest steward. At first, it seems as though Jesus is praising dishonesty. But if we look closer, He is pointing us to something much deeper: urgency, creativity, and commitment in how we live our faith.

The steward, when faced with losing his position, acts decisively to secure his future. Jesus uses this example to ask us: Do we live with the same urgency when it comes to eternal life? Do we use the resources God has entrusted to us—our time, talents, wealth, and relationships—to serve His kingdom, or only ourselves?

In our Kumeyaay traditions, and indeed in many Native ways, stewardship of the land, water, and community is a sacred duty. The earth is not something we own; it is something we care for on behalf of the generations yet to come. In this way, Jesus' call today is very familiar: be faithful in small matters, so you may be trusted in greater ones. Integrity in the

little things builds trust, unity, and peace in the bigger picture.

We also hear Jesus' unforgettable words: "You cannot serve both God and mammon." Money, possessions, and status can easily become false gods if we allow them to rule our hearts. But if we choose the Lord as our master, then even the things of this world can be used as blessings: food shared with the hungry, time spent with the lonely, resources used for the good of family and community.

Here in San Diego, on Kumeyaay land, we are daily invited to live as faithful stewards: caring for our families, our elders, and the earth around us. May we have the courage to live with urgency and integrity, so that when people see our choices, they see not self-interest but God's justice, mercy, and love at work.
