PASTOR'S CORNER

Be Ready, and Trust in the Promise A reflection on the Nineteenth (19th) Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's readings call us to live with faith, trust, and readiness—like people waiting for their beloved to return at any moment.

In the Gospel, Jesus says, "Gird your loins and light your lamps... You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." (Luke 12:35, 40) These are not words meant to instill fear, but to awaken us to live with purpose and hope.

We are reminded that faith is not passive. As the Letter to the Hebrews tells us, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." Abraham, our father in faith, followed God's call into the unknown—trusting not in his own understanding, but in God's promises.

The First Reading from the Book of Wisdom recalls how the children of Israel were delivered from slavery in Egypt. Their faith was tested, but they believed in the God who keeps His promises. So, must we.

For many Indigenous peoples, these themes resonate deeply. Our ancestors often journeyed through uncertainty—through forced relocations, broken treaties, and cultural suppression—yet many never gave up hope. Their perseverance, like Abraham's, was rooted

in trust that the Creator walks with His people.

Today, we are called to be ready—not with anxiety, but with joy and expectation. Readiness means living each day with love, justice, and compassion. It means walking in right relationship with God, our neighbor, and creation.

May we keep our spiritual lamps burning brightly. May we not fall asleep in indifference but stay awake in love. May we trust that no act of faith, however small, is ever wasted in the eyes of God.

Let us stay ready—not because we fear the end, but because we long to meet the One who loves us more than we can imagine.
