Artist's Statement

Crystal D. Evans is a multidisciplinary artist working across photography, sculpture, painting, installation, video, sound, text, and poetry. Her practice is rooted in phenomenology, exploring how perception, memory, and emotion shape the way we experience the world.

Based in the UK, born to a Malaysian-Chinese mother and a Ugandan–South African father, Evans is drawn to cultural intersection, identity, and the unseen forces that connect us. Her work interrogates narrative bias, challenges assumptions, and embraces imperfection as a mode of truth-telling.

Evans uses art as a tool for transformation—provoking reflection, disrupting the familiar, and pushing for deeper understanding. Whether through fractured ceramics, intimate photography, or immersive installations, she creates work that resonates emotionally and politically.

Her art has been exhibited internationally, including during the Venice Biennale 2025, at COP29 in Baku, and in The Arts Society Magazine. She continues to show work across national and global platforms, using art to shift perception and activate change.
