This program is a developmentally age-appropriate program in which we have implemented Learning Without Tears curriculum as well as Foundations for phonics. Our daily classroom routine provides a predictable schedule that enables the children to feel confident and comfortable while at school. Our amazing teachers have developed and designed many multi-sensory activities and projects which are stimulating, fun, and play based.
