President's Message: The Good, The Bad & The Ugly

Even on the secular calendar, November is a strange month of contradictions. The beautiful crisp autumn air of October is gone, and the skies get grayer and grayer, but at least we have not yet reached the winter doldrums. We have the joyous family celebration of Thanksgiving, but we pause on Veterans Day to give thanks to those who have served in our country's military, including those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our freedoms.



So too, this November will be a month on our Temple Calendar that, to borrow a line from a famous Clint Eastwood movie, contains the Good, the Bad and the Ugly, replete with celebration and commemoration. Luckily, most of it is good. We have bar/bat mitzvahs to celebrate in our sanctuary every single Saturday this month. These

services are open to all members of the temple, and you get to share in the joy of the occasion.

We always praise our selfless volunteers as the lifeblood of our temple and on Friday, November 12, we are having a Volunteer Recognition Erev Shabbat Service. Come out that night to pay honor to the multitude of people who have worked so hard on your behalf. Our volunteers offer their talents out of pure love of our Temple and we would be nowhere without them.

Chanukah this year begins in late November. Join us for one or more of our Chanukah Candle lighting ceremonies, whether it's coming to our parking lot when we light up our gigantic menorah outside, coming to the Chanukah service in the sanctuary on Friday, December 3 or going on zoom on the other nights when we each light our candles at home but chant the Chanukah blessings together. The Bad and the Ugly are wrapped up as one, in our annual Kristallnacht commemoration on Tuesday evening, November 9. That night of the broken glass in 1938, when mobs encouraged and sheltered by the Nazis destroyed Jewish homes and businesses, foreshadowed the horrors of the Holocaust that was to come shortly thereafter. Details of our Kristallnacht program can be found elsewhere in the Shofar. We can never let ourselves or succeeding generations forget what happened, since those who ignore history are doomed to repeat it. Anti-Semitism is unfortunately not dead and buried anywhere in the world, including right here on Long Island. We must constantly be vigilant to make sure that no 21st century equivalent to Kristallnacht ever happens here.

This film records the collaborative process between students and survivors to bring the stories of these Holocaust survivors to life. I am grateful to UJA-Federation for providing us with this inspirational program. Avi Abraham Benlolo has founded the Abraham Global Peace Initiative to combat antisemitism globally and work for more connections between Israel and the Arab world in the vein of the Abraham Accords. Torak Notes:

Novober 2: Bereshit Genesis 1:1-6:8

The narrative of creation, including Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, the tree of knowledge of good and evil and the forbidden fruit. Cain murders Abel, thus initiating the corruption of mankind and leading to the disastrous flood in Noah's time.

Novober 9: Noach Genesis 6:9 – 11:32

Humanity had become corrupt, forgetting that they were created in the image of God and failed to live decent, ethical and peaceful lives. The portion recounts the stories of Noah and the Ark, the Great Flood, God's promise, through the symbol of the rainbow, never again to deluge mankind and cause such mass destruction and the story of the Tower of Babel.

Novober 16: Lech Lecha Genesis 12:17 – 17:27

The life and experiences of Abraham, Judaism's remarkable pioneer, are told here. The establishment of the faith in One God and God's covenant with Abraham that the land of Canaan shall be the land of the Hebrews. Unable to have children with his wife Sarah, Abraham takes Hagar to himself as wife and has a son, Ishmael.

Novober 23: Vayeira Genesis 18:1-22:24

Abraham welcomes three visitors into his tent. They announce that Sarah will soon have a son, at the age of 90. Abraham argues with God about the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah, though ultimately the cities are destroyed. Isaac is born, circumcised, and weaned. Sarah sends away Hagar and her son Ishmael, and an angel saves them. God tests Abraham by asking him to sacrifice Isaac on Mount Moriah.

Novober 30: Chaye Sarah Genesis 23:1-25:18

Although this Torah portion means "the life of Sarah," it begins with her death. Abraham purchases the cave of Machpelah in which to bury her. Abraham sends a servant to find a wife for Isaac. He finds Rebecca, who shows the servant great kindness in offering to draw water for his camels at the well. Isaac and Rebecca get married. Abraham remarries. At the age of 175, he dies, and is buried alongside Sarah, by Isaac and Ishmael.






