STAY THE COURSE

We now head into the last quarter of our Temple year - April, May and June - and I am proud to say that life around our Temple will be as busy as ever this time of year, pandemic or no pandemic. When this issue is distributed, we will be in the middle of Pesach. Yom Hashoah will be observed on Thursday, April 8 with a holocaust survivor and our 7th graders heading the program. This will be followed by our Yom Ha'atzmaut commemoration later in April. We are starting our usual Bar/Bat Mitzvah season and school will be barreling



towards a conclusion. More people are coming to services as more people get vaccinated. The weather is getting nicer so we will be able to do more outside. In other words, the arrow is pointing straight up.

Even where we have had to adapt to COVID realities to remain safe, we have been finding ways to engage our membership. There is no better example than our Purim festivities. While we could not have the planned Purim Shpiel with its extensive cast all sharing the bema, Cantor David knocked it out of the park with his Billy Joel Purim songs, with the support of Rabbi Judy, Deborah Tract and our Temple band. Approximately 175 people viewed the "Billy Joel" Shpiel, either in the sanctuary that night or via streaming. The annual Purim Wax Museum was more fun than ever even though done on zoom, with each of our amazing 5th and 6th graders dressing up and taking turns giving a presentation about his or her chosen Jewish celebrity, followed by questions from the rest of zoom audience. Because it was on zoom, one of our member's sons out of town at college who had participated in the Wax Museum several years ago was able to join in the fun. Kudos to Deborah and the rest of her team for all of the hard work that made this happen so smoothly.

However, we must remain vigilant and stay safe. Whether you have been vaccinated or not, wear a mask at all times when in temple. Maintain proper social distancing. Check in and go through our simple COVID-19 protocols when you come to Temple. If our wonderful students coming to school every week can do it, so can you. We have had a remarkable safety record this year due to the hard work of our COVID-19 Safety Task Force chaired by Steve Finkelstein, with the enthusiastic cooperation of Deborah and our clergy, office staff and teachers.

Whether in person at the Temple, through our many zoom activities and meetings, or by streaming our services, stay connected to our Temple. We have gotten through the worst of it and are emerging stronger than ever.

Rabbi's Corner:

Yom huledet sameach l'Yisrael, happy birthday to Israel. Israel is 73 and we celebrate on the 5th of Iyar. This year, 5 Iyar falls on Shabbat so the Israeli celebration will be on the preceding Thursday, which corresponds to April 15th. We will celebrate at Temple on Erev Shabbat, April 16th.

Ever in the press, Israel has some exciting developments. As of this writing, Israeli elections are still a few weeks away, on March 23rd. Israel allows only in person voting, so with the accommodations planned for Covid precautions, results might take a day or two longer. Not much is expected to change in this fourth election in two years. However, Israel is anticipating a first. It is very likely that Rabbi Gilad Kariv, an Israeli lawyer ordained as a Reform rabbi by Hebrew Union College in Jerusalem, will be seated as a member of Knesset from the Labor Party. There are many rabbis who have been MKs before, but never a Reform rabbi. I am hopeful that his influence will allow Israelis to see Judaism from another angle.

Another recent development is the Israeli Supreme Court's long (15 years) awaited decision that Jews who converted under Reform and Conservative auspices in Israel are Jewish for the purposes of citizenship. This means that these people will be automatically eligible for citizenship under the Law of Return and not need to wait for naturalization. Sadly, the Chief Rabbinate doesn't take the same view and these Jews by choice are not enrolled as Jews for ritual purposes.

Finally, despite Michael Che's ill placed joke about Israeli vaccination programs, along with the Jewish residents of Israel, Arab citizens are sharing equally in vaccine plans. Even Arabs in the West Bank are being vaccinated by Israel, despite political disputes over who is actually responsible for health matters in the West Bank. Abba Eban said that the Palestinians never miss an opportunity to miss an opportunity. I am sorry that the Palestinian Authority did not take more responsibility for getting vaccines into West Bank residents' arms. Doing so would have shown a constructive step towards becoming an independent state. A huge missed opportunity.

Join me and Cantor Katz for a joyous Yom Ha'Atzma'ut (Israel Independence Day) celebration with Nishamah and the participation of Bar Mitzvah candidate Wesley Sigler on Friday, April 16th at 7:30 PM.

It's that time again, when we all muster up the courage to escape bondage and cross the Red Sea! Is there an Egypt or Red Sea in your life that you are having trouble crossing? Something that you just cannot seem to muster up the courage to face?



Well.....if you think back to the very first crossing of the Red Sea by Moses and our ancestors, you may be able to find some inspiration there.

Why would I be writing about the Red Sea in this Shofar article? Because we are celebrating Passover as this April Shofar is being published. Each holiday in the Jewish Year is designed for more than just celebration or commemoration. There is always a deeper meaning and understanding that the holiday represents.

We are taught at a young age that the main meaning of Passover is Freedom. Freedom not only from a physical "Pharo" but also from our own personal internal "Pharo." However, there is also another message in the Passover story, one of courage.

Torah Notes:

April 3 – 7th day of Pesach: Beshalach (Exodus 13:17–17:16)

Pharaoh changes his mind, and chases the Israelites. Trapped between their pursuers and the Reed Sea, the Israelites panic and God splits the sea for them. In the desert God provides water, manna and quails.

April 10: Shemini (Leviticus 9:1-11:47)

This portion is primarily concerned with the Temple sacrifices, laws for the Coheinim (the Priests) and dietary laws of the Jewish people. It contains a fascinating story of two young priests who enthusiastically offer a sacrifice to God. The Torah calls this sacrifice "strange fire," to which God responds by taking their lives. Their names were Nadav and Avihu. Their father, Aaron, struggles to mourn for the loss of his two sons while meeting the needs of the greater community. The portion concludes with an in-depth discussion on kashrut, including its laws and potential reasons for them.

April 17: Tazria-Metzora (Leviticus 12:1-15:33)

Tazria (Leviticus 12:1 - 13:59)

Tazria deals with laws of purification. These laws are considered to be both hygienic and 'levitical', related to religious law. This chapter deals in specific detail with purification after childbirth and the laws associated with the disease of leprosy. The health of the community was of sacred concern among the Israelites, so as to achieve spiritual well-being. Priests were given the responsibility for healing. We are taught that how we live, what we eat, how we think and act in our everyday lives is an important aspect in our religious/spiritual lives.

Metzora – (Leviticus 14:1–15.33)

In Metzora, the rites and rituals of purification of a leper and the cleansing of the infected home are covered, as are other items of ritual impurity dealing with physical secretions

April 24: Acharei Mot/Kedoshim (Leviticus 16:1-20:27)

Acharei-Mot (Leviticus 16:1-18:30)

Achrei-Mot deals with preparations by the High Priest for Yom Kippur. Only on Yom Kippur could the High Priest enter the Holy of Holies where the Ark of the Tablets was kept. Each Israelite was required to fast and atone on this day and to seek forgiveness from God and from each other. Also listed are the laws of prohibited marriages of close relatives, which was then common practice amongst the Egyptians and Canaanites.

Kedoshim (Leviticus 19:1-20:27)

Kedoshim contains a survey and summary of the foundations of Judaism. Israel must consider life as sacred. "You shall be holy for I your God I am holy." Everything we do is to be considered in terms of how it fits into God's plan for us.

May 1: Emor (Leviticus 21:1-24:23)

A presentation of the Law of the Priests: for mourning, marriage, factors that disqualify a priest, laws of the Sabbath and Holidays, duties of the priests, keeping the sanctuary lamp burning, freshly baked challot on the table each Sabbath, as well as other laws dealing with blasphemy, murder, assault and punishment for crimes. Equality of treatment for all is mandated.


