President's Message:

Getting Better All the Time

I know things are on the upswing when I can use a lyric from a Beatles song as the title of a column. As we do more and more in person inside the Temple, thing really are looking up (hey, I even got to throw in a Gershwin lyric).

My motto since my Presidency started in July of 2020 is that we will do the maximum we can that is safely possible, whatever extra work is required to do so. March epitomized that philosophy, as with input from our Safety Task Force, Comedy Night returned to our ballroom after a two-year absence.

We were able to do a full-fledged musical Purim Shpiel up on the bema, with Clergy and congregants performing "Friday Night Fever," the Purim story told through the lens of the Disco era, songs included. This Shpiel was the epitome of perseverance, as it was originally set to be performed in March of 2020 when the COVID-19 pandemic started and forced its postponement. March also saw the opening of our Temple services and events to all, regardless of vaccination status, although for safety reasons we are still requiring masks for those who are not fully vaccinated at Temple services and events. Masks are optional at services and Temple events for those who are fully vaccinated (2 shots). I urge all our members who have not already done so to become fully vaccinated and to receive a booster unless there is a medical reason. For our Religious School classes, we are following the local school districts in not requiring either vaccination or masks to attend, although I again encourage all our Religious School parents to have their children vaccinated after consulting with their doctors.

My optimism is also based on how our April calendar looks. Friday night onegs are now back in the ballroom with coffee and tea set-ups. The group "Gathering Time" is planning for an encore performance at the Temple on Friday night April 29. If you saw the group when they came to our Temple previously, you know that is something not to be missed.

The Spring "Bar Mitzvah season" started up in March and will go into full mode later this month after Pesach. Likewise, later in April we commence the cycle of Friday night services led by different classes in our Religious School. The common denominator of these services is that we are aiming to have fuller sanctuaries filled with the infectious joy of our children and their families. Share in the delight by coming to these services. Your spirits are sure to climb, you will be supporting our children and you get a glimpse of the bright future of the Jewish people.

To paraphrase yet another classic song lyric, there's no use sitting alone in your room, come hear the music and other joys of our Temple. Life may not be a cabaret, but there are plenty of delights just waiting for you.

Rabbi's Corner:

Passover is soon upon us with Bedikat Chametz, the search or checking for leavened substances, being performed on Thursday, April 14. The Seders are Friday, April 15 and Saturday, April 16. We will not have services so that we might join with family and friends at what might be our first inperson Seders in two years.

I mentioned checking for Chametz, but that is not the only checking being done at our Temple. The Ritual Committee has embarked on a process of having all our Torah Scrolls inspected and evaluated. Torah Scrolls are all organic and we don't call the Torah a tree of life gratuitously. All the components of a scroll are natural, klaf, parchment made from the skin of a kosher animal, sewn together with the gut of a kosher animal, displayed on wooden rollers called atzei chaim (trees of life) and ink organically made.

As careful as we are with our Torah scrolls, age and environment take their toll. Jill Kaplan, who may be familiar to you as a past Director of Education at TOE or as the Sofer (ritual scribe) who refurbished one of the CRT Torah Scrolls, has been examining our scrolls. She will prepare reports for the Ritual Committee describing the condition of each scroll and make recommendations for any work needed to make sure our scrolls are kept in good form. Then the committee will be able to make informed decisions about how to proceed.

We are blessed with many Torah Scrolls including our Holocaust Torah on loan to us. That one will remain untouched by agreement with the Memorial Scrolls Trust. Another of our scrolls was refurbished recently by Jill Kaplan just before the consolidation and the rest will be examined.

This is an ongoing project. I will keep you informed at each step. Think of it the same way you think of maintaining your own health. Our Torah scrolls will get check-ups. Our Sofer, however, makes house calls!

Torah Notes:

April 2, 2022 Tazria – Levit. 12:1-13:59

Tazria deals with laws of purification. These laws are considered to be both hygienic and 'levitical', related to religious law. This portion deals in specific detail with purification after childbirth and the laws associated with the disease of leprosy. The health of the community was of sacred concern among the Israelites, so as to achieve spiritual well-being. Priests were given the responsibility for healing. We are taught that how we live, what we eat, how we think and act in our everyday lives is an important aspect in our religious/spiritual lives.

April 9, 2022 Metzora – Levit. 14:1–15.33

In Metzora, the rites and rituals of purification of a leper and the cleansing of the infected home are covered, as are other items of ritual impurity dealing with physical secretions.

April 16, 2022 First Day of Passover – Exodus 12:21-51)

This portion describes the bringing of the Passover Offering in Egypt, the Plague of the Firstborn at the stroke of midnight and how "On this very day, God took the Children of Israel out of Egypt."

April 23, 2022 8th day of Passover- Deuteronomy 15:19-16:17

The week of Passover culminates on Shabbat with verses that discuss the Passover sacrifice and the laws of Passover. The Torah reminds us not to eat *chumetz* (leavened bread) during the seven days of Passover. (Although Passover is a seven-day holiday, many Jews in the diaspora choose to celebrate it for 8 days). Since our ancestors did not have time to wait for their bread to rise, we eat scrumptious unleavened bread as they did during the exodus. Beginning on the second day of Passover, the Torah then instructs us to "count off seven weeks" between Passover and the holiday of Shavuot. Shavuot marks the beginning of the grain harvest. It is also the date on which we receive the Torah from God each year.

April 30, 2022 Acharei-Mot - Leviticus 16:1-18:30

Achrei-Mot deals with preparations by the High Priest for Yom Kippur. Only on Yom Kippur could the High Priest enter the Holy of Holies where the Ark of the Tablets was kept. Each Israelite was required to fast and atone on this day and to seek forgiveness from God and from each other. Also listed are the laws of prohibited marriages of close relatives, which was then common practice amongst the Egyptians and Canaanites.

The Board of Directors wishes everyone a happy and healthy Passover.






