Confirmation 2022

Chase Brodsky and Alexandra Damast Confirmed

Affirming their commitment to Judaism, this year's confirmands Chase Brodsky and Alexandra Damast helped lead the Shavuot service held on June 5. Because of the pandemic, this was the first live confirmation service held at TOEaCRC since 2019.

Joined by their families and worshipers, Chase and Alex recited prayers and read from the Torah. Both teens have remained active in Jewish life since their Bat Mitzvahs and said they will continue to do so. In fact, right after the service, they both rushed off to a BBYO event.

"I'm so proud of Chase and Alex for committing to this," Rabbi Judy told congregants during the service. Speaking directly to Chase and Alex, Rabbi Judy told them: "I know that I express the pride of everybody who's here and everybody in our entire congregation in you, and the maturity that you show in being able to sort of analyze your experiences up through now and see where you are going both in the Jewish world and in the rest of your lives."



Director of Education Deborah Tract presented gifts to Chase and Alex, calling them role models. "A few years ago, you stood on this very bema and celebrated your Bat Mitzvahs, and during this time, I knew you both, would continue practicing what you have learned as young Jewish women in our community," she said.

This is my last monthly column as your President. It has been an honor and a privilege. First and foremost, with the guidance of our invaluable Safety Task Force, we have come through the COVID-19 pandemic keeping ourselves connected to the Temple and to each other.

Everyone went that “extra mile” to be sure that we did as much in-person as was safely possible, even when no other temple was doing so. We used the zoom technology to do what could not be done live. With a few precautions in place, we are back to pre-pandemic levels of attendance at Friday Night services, with Onegs in the ballroom. Even while public schools were still doing remote learning, parents could still bring their children to our temple and know that they would be safe, and the kids were so delighted to be here. Some of my most gratifying moments have been hearing congregants of all ages express their appreciation for our efforts.

I have seen our two legacy temples truly become one, as we got to know each other better despite the physical limitations during parts of the past two years. As in any “marriage,” when two parties live together for the first time they learn how to resolve their differences and go forward together. We certainly have done that! We learned “new traditions”, as we incorporated the best of both legacy temples and found new paths. I eventually stopped worrying about anyone’s legacy temple and simply appointed the people who I thought were best for the job at hand.

I am also proud that we are starting to develop a new generation of leadership. We are seeing more and more of our younger families get active on key committees and join our Board of Trustees. That is the only way to ensure the long-term future of our Temple.

We faced challenges during these two years but came through them stronger than ever. I have the upmost admiration for Rabbi Judy, Cantor David, Mrs. Tract and her teachers, our office staff, custodians, and our dedicated Executive Committee, Board of Trustees and other volunteers.

The biggest thank you of all goes to my amazing wife Laura. She had to put up with the demands on my time and my stresses that go with being President. More than that, she pitched in and helped out the Temple wherever she could, whether it was using her microbiology background to serve on our Safety Task Force, pinch-hitting for the Cantor when he was on vacation or just being the sounding board of whom I could bounce off certain thoughts and ideas.

My term as President may be ending, but I am ready to start a new chapter in my Temple life. I will assist our incoming President, Mark Natelson, in any way I can to ensure a smooth transition. I have the utmost confidence that Mark will do a terrific job and allow the progress we have made, to continue. If we stick together and respect each other, our ceiling is unlimited.

Rabbi's Corner:

Summer: A Time to Relax but Also Reflect



As summer approaches, vacation season is upon us. Having celebrated Shavuot, this year's cycle of Festivals is now complete. Even as we look forward to some rest and relaxation, please know that Judaism and therefore the Temple runs year-round, including the summer. While I'll take a month away from Temple in August, I use this time to reflect and add to my knowledge and understanding. My goals are to return refreshed and with new ideas and goals to pursue in the coming year.

Like all of you, I am particularly distraught about the increased violence facing our society. Delving into the notions of gun ownership and use of force in Jewish law provide a tempered perspective. We are commanded to pursue our own self-defense when threatened with death, but the Talmud also teaches that saving a life saves the entire world and destroying a life, destroys the entire world. I feel saddened by the daily destruction, despite not having a personal connection to any victims of gun violence. We must do better as a society to prevent situations where we are confronted with these challenges. Judaism wants us to live. Our lives are gifts from God with opportunities to glorify God's name daily.

I fear for our religious freedom as Jews in American society. While New York took steps to codify abortion rights into NYS law, and I am proud of the work I did to shepherd that legislation through the halls of the legislature, many other citizens will lose those rights if the Supreme Court rules as we expect they will. Judaism's view on the beginning of life differs from the Christian interpretations that prevail among many lawmakers and lobbyists.

Jews believe the actual life of a woman takes precedence over the potential life of a zygote, embryo or fetus. This puts Jewish practice at odds with many state laws and bodes poorly, not only for women's health, but for the ability to keep our sacred and unique philosophy that has been the source of Jews' success and comfort in the United States. I will continue to learn about these topics and more during the summer months, as I reflect on this year.

At this time of year, I like to thank my colleagues who help me do my work as well as I can. I appreciate their daily presence and devotion to being the best at everything they do. It is a joy to ascend the bima knowing that I am joined in sacred partnership with Cantor David Katz. His knowledge and talent continually impress me at services, concerts and in meetings. Our director of education, Deborah Tract, is a dedicated professional beloved as much by the adults she works with as by the children she devotes her time educating. Her generosity of spirit is boundless.

Likewise, I wish to thank everyone who keeps our Temple running. Goldie Brandl and Robin Rabinowitz keep our office and thereby the entire Temple running smoothly.

This year, more than the past couple of Covid years, we saw the fruits of our teachers' endeavors in person. Laurel Fried, Cila Klingher, Joan Lieberman and Fortuna Southworth are masterful, and we saw each student shine this year, particularly at services for Young Families or the grade level services the students led. Special thanks to our custodial staff of Cliff Carroll, Rich Kleemann and Greg Powell for having everything at Temple ready to go and looking great so all our programs and services start out successfully.

Our lay leadership, especially our Board of Trustees, Executive Board and Committee Chairs, is terrific and I appreciate everything you do. Thanks to our outgoing president, Neil Miller and to Esther Reich, who has been the Shofar editor for years and is stepping down. You each epitomize the volunteer spirit which has made us successful. Kudos this year also go to our newly formed Security Committee under the chairmanship of Ira Warshawsky. They are a hard-working group of volunteers ensuring that coming to Temple is always safe as well as pleasant.

Have a wonderful summer but again remember that life at TOEACRC is on a 12-month plan. Someone is available throughout the summer. Thanks again for making this year a resounding success.

They were confident, excited, and so eager to share their accomplishments with our congregation. Our Religious School is warm and welcoming, a sacred place of learning that motivates children to want to learn about Judaism and Jewish identity.
