Rabbi's Corner:

Our prophet Isaiah spoke frequently about protecting the widow, the orphan and the stranger. He also reminded us, that ritual observance without ethical behavior was not pleasing in God's sight. We endeavor to embody these practices in small ways daily and create opportunities for their practice on a wider scale when the opportunity arises.



With the desire to aid war torn Ukraine and the refugees created by their horrible situation, we banded together to donate clothes and first aid supplies that were sent overseas. We also helped people in our community who struggle with food insecurity by using boxes of pasta or mac n cheese for groggers on Purim and then donating them to food pantries. As always, I urge you to continue bringing non-perishable food for donation each time you come to Temple or even driving by to fill our outdoor receptacle when you are in the neighborhood.

On May 15th, there will be two opportunities to perform such acts of lovingkindness. Mitzvah Day will take place at Temple in the morning from 10am- Noon. You can spend those two hours raising funds for Ukraine while planting a sunflower, making sandwiches for the unhoused, packaging toiletries and feminine care products for guests of the Mary Brennan INN or delivering breakfast to local families in need. That afternoon, you can learn about ways in which those of many faiths and nationalities can live together in greater harmony by attending the global premiere of the film *All of Us* at Gold Coast Cinema at LIU. Torah Notes:May 7, 2022 Kedoshim - Leviticus 19:1-20:27

Kedoshim contains a survey and summary of the foundations of Judaism. Israel must consider life as sacred. "You shall be holy for I your God am holy". Everything we do is to be considered in terms of how it fits into God's plan for us.

May 14, 2022 Emor - Leviticus 21:1-24:23

A presentation of the Law of the Priests: for mourning, marriage, factors that disqualify a priest, laws of the Sabbath and Holidays, duties of the priests, keeping the sanctuary lamp burning, freshly baked challot on the table each Sabbath, other laws dealing with blasphemy, murder, assault, and punishment for crimes. Equality of treatment for all is mandated.

May 21, 2022 Behar - Leviticus 25:1-26:2

Behar defines the relationship between man and the Earth – the balance to be achieved based upon the acceptance that the Earth is the Lord's. Man is only given the privilege of using it to sustain himself, never to abuse the land. Establishment of the Sabbatical every seventh year as a rest for the soil is introduced.

May 28, 2022 Behukotai - Leviticus 26:3-27:34

Behukotai is the last chapter of the Book of Leviticus and describes Israel's voluntary contributions to the upkeep of the Sanctuary – a tradition of generosity towards the support and preservation of our houses of worship. Moses challenges Israel to choose the way of Torah as its basis for a way of life.
