




Cantor's Notes

ach year it seems so much has happened and so much has changed. Now that we have had a chance to recover from the Jewish Holidays, we get to gear up again this month for the "American" holidays. This month, of course, we celebrate Thanksgiving. Each year I remind myself and often write in my Shofar articles about Thanksgiving and being grateful. This message and action can never get old. They say that the more you focus on what you have, rather than what you do not have, the better you will feel. It is worth a try, and you have nothing to lose!

In Judaism, being grateful is nothing new. Most all of our prayers and requests center around

expression of unending thanks for all in this world that we have and what the world provides for us. If you take a look even at the simple prayer from our daily service called "Modim", you will see one of the quintessential prayers for gratitude that has been around long before Thanksgiving was ever even an idea. The first three words of the prayer, "Modim anachnu lach", literally mean "we gratefully acknowledge".

It starts from the very beginning with a statement of gratitude and continues from there. The prayer continues with the words: "We shall thank You for our lives, for our souls, for miracles that are with us every day and for wondrous deeds and favors at all times, evening, morning and noon."

Just imagine how you would feel if you said this, or a version of this prayer every day, when you woke up and then again when you went to sleep. It would only help you to feel more grateful and appreciate what you have each

Torah Notes



November 5, Lech Lecha, Genesis 12:17 – 17:27

The life and experiences of Abraham, Judaism's remarkable pioneer, are told here. The establishment of the faith in One God and God's covenant with Abraham that the land of Canaan shall be the land of the Hebrews. Unable to have children with his wife Sarah, Abraham takes Hagar to himself as wife and has a son, Ishmael.

Nov. 12, Vayeira, Genesis 18:1-22:24

Abraham welcomes three visitors into his tent. They announce that Sarah will soon have a son, at the age of 90. Abraham argues with God about the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah, though ultimately the cities are destroyed. Isaac is born, circumcised, and weaned. Sarah sends away Hagar and her son Ishmael, and an angel saves them. God tests Abraham by asking him to sacrifice Isaac on Mount Moriah.

November 19 Chayei Sarah (Genesis 23:1-25:18)

Although this Torah portion means "the life of Sarah," it begins with her death. Abraham purchases the cave of Machpelah in which to bury her. Abraham sends a servant to find a wife for Isaac. He finds Rebecca, who shows the servant great kindness in offering to draw water for his camels at the well. Isaac and Rebecca get married. Abraham remarries. At the age of 175, he dies, and is buried alongside Sarah, by Isaac and Ishmael.

November 26, Toldot (Genesis 25:19-28:9)

Rebecca has twins named Esau and Jacob. Being the elder son, Esau is to receive the birthright and blessing of the firstborn from his father. Esau gives Jacob his birthright in exchange for some stew. When Isaac is on his deathbed, Rebecca and Jacob deceive Isaac so that Jacob will receive the blessing of the firstborn. Esau threatens to kill Jacob, and Jacob flees to Haran.




