

For those of you who start planning your Rosh Hashanah menus early, here is an easy and delicious apple cake recipe.

#### **APPLE CAKE**

2 cups flour

1 tsp baking soda

1 tsp baking powder

½ tsp cinnamon

½ tsp salt

1 cup sugar

3 eggs

½ cup vegetable oil

1 tsp vanilla extract

2 ½ cups apples, peeled and chopped (about 3 apples)

1/2 cup chopped walnuts (optional)

In large mixing bowl, combine flour, baking soda, baking powder, cinnamon and salt.

In separate bowl, use a mixer to combine sugar, eggs, vegetable oil and vanilla. Beat 2 minutes until smooth.

Slowly beat in dry ingredients until well blended.

Fold in apples and nuts. Pour batter into greased 10-inch tube pan or cake pan.

Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour 15 minutes.

#### We are introducing a new feature column of the Shofar:

#### **Shofar Spotlight Interview: Carol "Cary" Markman**

Carol and Bob Markman were familiar faces at CRT over the years. Both Markmans served as Presidents of CRT during different periods of the congregation's 61-year history. Carol, aka "Cary" was CRT's final President. Cary and Bob, both CPAs, are already established presences at the new Temple Or Elohim, A Community Reform Congregation.

Cary ran her own accounting firm until a few years ago when she sold it to a larger firm. She still serves a handful of clients and volunteers for several causes. Besides her efforts with Temple life, Cary has lent her time to Planned Parenthood where she served as Chairperson of its Nassau County affiliate in 2017 and 2018.

In the Shofar's first Q&A Spotlight, Cary was interviewed about her life as a reform Jew, her decades of work with CRT and how she feels about the new Temple Or Elohim, A Community Reform Congregation.

#### Before Bob and you joined Community Reform Temple, what other synagogues had you belonged to?

Actually, CRT was my first membership in a synagogue. I grew up in a conservative home and my father did not believe in belonging to a synagogue. We lived in The Bronx and you could go to Hebrew school without being a member of a temple. My father grew up orthodox. He laid tefillin and prayed every morning but didn't belong to a temple.

#### Did you go to Hebrew School?

I did go to Hebrew school and was confirmed when I was 16 years old. Bob's family also never belonged to a temple. We moved to Westbury when our daughter, June, was about four years old. She went to Old Westbury Hebrew Congregation for Sunday school with two friends when the girls were in kindergarten. One of the moms didn't like the program there. She had heard that CRT just moved to The Plain Road location. So, this family joined CRT and gave our name to Charlie Eisenberg who was very persistent in trying to persuade us to join. We came to Simchat Torah services at CRT with Rabbi Donald Gluckman leading services. During the service, the Rabbi's wife came over during a Hakafah and handed me the Torah and encouraged me to walk with it. Having grown up conservative I had never touched a Torah. After services, Judy Gluckman invited June to come to her next first grade Sunday school class. The rest is history.

## Having grown up in a conservative home, how did you feel about the Reform experience when you were exposed to it at CRT for the first time?

I really didn't have very much contact with the ritual aspects of life when I grew up. Bob didn't either. It was easy to adapt because everyone was warm and friendly.

#### How did your father and mother react to you joining CRT?

They embraced it. They came with us to High Holidays for many years. My father had his second Bar Mitzvah when he was 83 years old at CRT. Although my father had dementia, his Hebrew training was from the time he was a small boy. So, he actually had an Aliyah and read the Haftarah portion. I don't think he read from the Torah because he never learned to read Hebrew without vowels. We had a small reception at the Temple after services. He was so happy. It is my last good memory of my father.

#### Did he embrace the reform philosophy?

Yes, he did. It was a matter of wanting to be together with the family. This is where we were going. He came out to our home and we celebrated. We had dinner together and we went to temple together.

#### What are some other memories that you have of your years at CRT?

The formation of Havarah was extremely important. We formed friendships that have lasted through this day. My kids didn't have cousins when they were growing up. The other children in the Havarah were like cousins to them--we call it family by choice. In fact, June went to the senior prom with two of the boys because they didn't have dates. It created a Jewish life for us because we would celebrate holidays in each other's homes. We learned to make hamentashen and had matzah brie parties every year for Passover. It brought out the Jewishness of the temple home as we shared our Jewish lives as one big extended family.

## While you never expected to become president of CRT, no less, the last President, what convinced you that coming together with Temple Or Elohim was the best path forward?

Well, they reached out to us first and we had struggled with dwindling membership in recent years. When we looked into it deeper, I felt that there was a lot of commonality. The cores were common. Both congregations had a significant interest in doing it.

## In the less than two months since we've come together, what's your take on how both congregations have blended together so far?

I think extremely well. I have attended several meetings and I would like to get the members that have come over from CRT to join committees. It's a good way for them to get involved and get to know people here. We had our first Sisterhood meeting and there was a very strong attendance. Robin Grossman and Jeanie Corn are Co-Presidents of Sisterhood and Mark Heller and Ed Temple are Co-Presidents of the Men's Club.

#### What do you like most about our new home?

I like that there are many new and different activities that are certainly more than we were able to do. It's nice that we don't have to worry about making payroll anymore, as well as figure out how we were going to maintain our building. One of the things we had to do is get over the attachment to the building because ultimately a congregation is not the building. The congregation is the people.

Later this year, your granddaughter, Sydney, will have her Bat Mitzvah here at Temple Or Elohim, A Community Reform Congregation. Mazal Tov to Charles, his wife Kim and their older son Matthew, Bob and you. Of course, you're looking forward to that more than anything. Besides that, what else are you looking forward to here at Temple Or Elohim, A Community Reform Congregation?

Being part of a vibrant organization that has a future is very important to me. It's important to me that Reform Judaism continues to thrive because I believe Reform Judaism knows its place. Also, I like to meet new people and to have the opportunity to do new things. It makes life so much more interesting. That's important and a big piece of why the transition will go well. At the first Shabbat service at TOE, when they opened the ark doors and I saw the small Torah I carried over from CRT, it just made me feel at home and smile

#### It made you feel like you were at home?

Yes. Then, when the ark doors from CRT went up in the lobby here so quickly, it was just another sign of how welcoming everyone has been here. Even on our first day when we walked our flags and Torahs over, it was heartwarming that Temple Or Elohim members walked with us and more members were awaiting our arrival and prepared a very nice reception. I am very optimistic about the future for all of us.

#### Torak Notes:

September 7 - **Shoftim- Deut. 16:18-21:9** - This portion defines the legal system and the roles of the leaders; the judges, the king, the priests and the prophets - all of them officers of the Hebrew commonwealth. Provisions are to be made for an ordered civil government, justice must be free, accessible and absolutely impartial.

September 14 - **Ki-Tetze- Deut. 21:10-25:19** - The wide-ranging laws of domestic life and human kindness are the subjects of this portion of Moses' continuing discourse, dealing with matters such as marriage to a captive of war, the rights of the first-born, dealing with discourtesy and disobedience, returning lost property and appropriateness of apparel. The sanctity of marriage, adultery and family relations are among the many topics covered in this portion.

September 21 - **Ki Tavo, Deut. 26:1-29:8** - Moses begins his conclusion of the legal code with describing the rituals relating to the first fruits and tithes brought as offerings to the Sanctuary. Such events are to be viewed as occasions of thanksgiving to God, whose favor of the Israelites repeatedly rescued them from the hardships of their past and raised them up to become a great nation, dwelling in comfort in their rich and fertile homeland.

September 28 - <u>Nitzavim- Deut. 22:9-30:20</u> - Moses presents the different orders of people before him, all assembled to enter into a Covenant with God: heads of tribes, elders, officers, all the people of Israel, including children, the strangers in their midst and all the others that would take part in sacred rites and rituals. He warns them all not to harbor evil in their hearts and adds words of mercy and appealing to all to choose life and not death. (\*see opening statement of Deuteronomy)






