

January 2, 1973 was a glorious day for me. I delivered my second son into the world and I was overwhelmingly happy. My husband and I had two beautiful boys and our family was complete.

Shortly after the birth of my son I found myself pregnant again, which would have meant having three children under the age of 5 needing daycare. After discussing the situation with my husband, and our mothers, we decided that financially it was impossible for me to be a stay-at-home mom. We needed both of our incomes to survive. Since abortion was now an option, covered by our insurance, we chose to go that route without even considering the life of our unborn child who had no voice in the matter at all.

Fast forward 19 years to Christmas eve, 1992. My oldest son left a party where he had been drinking and was killed in a car accident at 12:15 a.m. on Christmas morning. He was 23 years old and had just returned from Iraq three months before.

My family was no longer complete and I immediately thought back to the time in 1973 when I so thoughtlessly gave up another child. Now, my remaining son didn't have a sibling, but he could have had either a sister or brother to share this tragedy with. My guilt was overwhelming at that moment. The guilt and shame did not come immediately after my abortion, but it hit hard when it came. I thought then that my son's death was my punishment for acting so carelessly with another human life nearly 20 years before.

I have now gone through the *She's Restored* program offered by Pathways Pregnancy Clinic. *She's Restored* has allowed me to forgive myself and the others who were involved in my abortion in 1973. It is a powerful program, but it is also a program that would be best if no one ever had need of.

This is my story. I will always regret my decision to have an abortion, even though I was eventually healed. I have faith that my child is in Heaven in the loving hands of God. However, I would rather have had that baby to hold, to watch grow up, and been able to share in their life today.

## Do You Know Their Names?

### A message from our Director

Do you know the name of a poor person? When you consider this question, is a gap exposed between the Christian you are and the Christian you are called to be? When I asked this question of myself, I was careful to acknowledge the difference between caring for the poor, and knowing the poor. Do you know a poor person? Do you know... Do you know her name? Do you know her story?

She's not the person we've passed while running down the street for coffee. She's not the homeless beggar we may have handed a dollar to on the street corner. She's not the anonymous fire or earthquake victim we contributed online donations to so she and her family could rebuild their home. Do you know her name?

If God's heart is for anything, it is for least of these: the suffering, the sick, the needy, the uneducated, the foreigner, the lost, the lonely: this much is clear. For Jesus has told us: "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me..."

We care about these people. We pray for them, and we even try to contribute worldly things to meet their needs, but how many of them call us friends? Do we know their names? Pathways Pregnancy Clinic is a place where we meet the broken, the hurting and sometimes the destitute. Pathways offers the opportunity to commune with the poor and brokenhearted. The heart of our charge is centered in listening to, encouraging and educating broken, hurting and scared young women.

God has called us to use the talents and gifts He's embedded within us: to pour them back out on one another, ultimately glorifying Him. The prophet Nehemiah said, "I told no one of what my God had put in my heart to do..."

If you have a heart for women, babies, parenting, and pregnancy, and have a longing to serve our community, would you pray alongside me and ask God if this might be the ministry in which you could serve? It may be your time to learn a name you have been destined to know.
