Illinois Issues Blockchain Report

A technology often associated with the cybersecurity of virtual currencies, blockchain's potential to spur economic development is becoming better understood. The Illinois Blockchain Initiative released a report January 31 stating "that blockchain technology and its built-in encryption can facilitate highly-secure methods of interacting with government and keeping paperless records, increasing data accuracy and providing better cybersecurity projections for Illinois residents."

Blockchain Basics: Software that stores and transfers value or data across the Internet. Washington Focused on Infrastructure At the U.S. Conference of Mayors meeting in late January, mayors voiced hope that federal infrastructure dollars would bypass states and flow directly to cities. Under the Administration's proposed plan, federal infrastructure funding will require local funds as well. In a tight labor market, a slow hiring process can mean loss of quality candidates. But it doesn't have to be that way. Publication of Guidance Released for \$5.024 Billion in Harvey Recovery Funds

HUD guidance released, paving the way for GLO administration of long-term recovery funds.

Dear Community Leaders,

Today Texas Land Commissioner George P. Bush announced the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has issued its guidance

for the administration of the recent award of \$5.024 billion to the state of Texas to help with the long-term recovery following Hurricane Harvey. The disaster recovery funds will be administered by the Texas General Land Office's (GLO) Community Development & Revitalization (CDR) program and can be used for a wide variety of activities including housing redevelopment, infrastructure repair and long-term planning.

"Hurricane Harvey has disrupted the lives and livelihoods of so many Texans and these funding guidelines provide the next crucial step in the long-term rebuilding process," said Commissioner George P. Bush. "The GLO stands ready to help our state maximize the use of this disaster recovery funding to build back stronger and more resilient communities."

This CDBG-DR allocation for Hurricane Harvey is the single largest CDBG-DR allocation for any event. On September 8th, President Donald J. Trump signed the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2018 and the Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Requirements Act of 2017, which included \$15.25 billion to support response and recovery from disasters across the nation.

The GLO is committed to completing an amendment to the current Action Plan for the initial \$57.8 million outlining the method of distribution for these funds as quickly as possible, utilizing the strong partnership it has with the Texas Association of Regional Councils and the impacted Councils of Governments to help administer these funds. To expedite the recovery process with these funds, the GLO will administer a number of programs including a multi-family affordable rental program, a homeowner reimbursement program and other tenant and homeowner programs.

The GLO continues to encourage all impacted homeowners to keep their receipts for any repairs made on their home to provide with applications for

further assistance.

To date, the GLO estimates over \$60 billion in unmet need in the state as a direct result of Hurricane Harvey and fully supports our federal delegation as it continues to work for additional recovery funding.

Federal Tax Law Creates Burdens for Local Government

As the dust settles after the signing of the federal Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, its impact to local governments has become clear: there are barriers to maintaining revenue levels, along with higher costs. This new operating environment will affect service levels in cities, towns, and counties across the U.S.

Below is a quick rundown of key changes and their impact.

SALT deduction: The \$10,000 cap on the state and local tax (SALT) deduction could mean lower home values and property tax assessments, which accounts for about half of a city's revenue.

Mortgage interest deduction: New homeowners can deduct no more than \$750,000, further eliminating the incentive for home ownership and tax payments.

Advanced Refunding Bonds: No longer a tool for refinancing outstanding debt at lower interest rates, the lack of these bonds will increase the cost of borrowing for local governments.

Qualified Tax Credit Bonds: These instruments include Qualified Zone Academy bonds, Qualified School Construction Bonds, Clean Renewable Energy Bonds and Qualified Forestry Conservation bonds.

FEMA's National Integration Center is seeking public feedback for an update of the state, local, tribal, and territorial (SLTT) National Incident Management System (NIMS) Implementation Objectives for SLTT organizations and jurisdictions. This National Engagement Period will conclude at 5:00 pm EDT on February 5, 2018. National Engagement provides an opportunity for interested parties to comment on the draft implementation objectives, to ensure they are relevant for all implementing partners.

NIMS is a key component of U.S. incident management efforts and enables organizations from across the country to work together during incidents of all kinds and sizes. Implementing NIMS across the Nation is a fundamental part of building our national preparedness. The SLTT NIMS Implementation Objectives identify the specific activities that are involved in NIMS implementation for SLTT organizations and jurisdictions.

FEMA most recently revised the NIMS Implementation Objectives in 2009 and is now updating them to ensure they are consistent with the 2017 NIMS, to incorporate stakeholder input, and to make them a more clear and more useful tool for organizations as they implement NIMS.

FEMA has developed implementation indicators for each Implementation Objective. These indicators serve as actionable activities that jurisdictions can use to demonstrate NIMS implementation. The indicators are not requirements and are not intended as a checklist, but rather as a means of clarifying the types of activities that organizations and jurisdictions may undertake when implementing NIMS.

FEMA will host a series of webinars to discuss the proposed SLTT NIMS Implementation Objectives and answer related questions. Partial Repair and Essential Power for Sheltering (PREPS) Program: In addition to the Direct Housing Programs, the GLO has added the Partial Repair and Essential Power for Sheltering (PREPS) program which is designed to supplement emergency sheltering when communities are faced with sheltering needs that significantly exceed existing capacity. This program performs emergency work and power restoration in disaster-damaged single-family owner-occupied residences. PREPS provides temporary repairs and allows homeowners to remain in their homes and their communities as they complete permanent repairs to their homes. Eligible emergency work includes providing elements necessary for survivors to shelter at home. Some examples may include:

- * Utilities essential for potable water, hot water, HVAC, and minimal food preparation
- * Functional kitchen, bathroom, and sleeping accommodations
- * Securing and/or essential weatherproofing to include roof, walls, doors, and windows

Applicants may be eligible for PREPS if they are pre-disaster home owners whose primary residence has already undergone a FEMA-issued inspection with a FEMA verified loss of less than \$17,000 and less than 18 inches of water in the home. FEMA determines if applicants are eligible. Not everyone will be eligible but FEMA along with the State will provide support to those who qualify. PREPS Homes Under Construction: 3,294 (as of 1/18/18) PREPS Homes Completed: 501 (as of 1/18/18) In just over a month, the GLO has called more than 75,000 applicants potentially eligible for help recovering from Hurricane Harvey through our PREPS program. The GLO has posted the Action Plan for the first \$57.8 million in CDBG-DR funds for 14-day public comment period.

January 18, 2018

Dear Community Leader,

On December 27, 2017, the Federal Register published notice

for the first allocation of \$57.8 million in Community Development Block Grant - Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds for the State of Texas in response to Hurricane Harvey. This funding is a direct result of Commissioner Bush's request on August 28th to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) immediately following Hurricane Harvey in addition to a request for billions in new Congressional appropriations.

Today, the GLO posted the Action Plan for the use of these funds on the website

for a public comment period of 14-days before submission to HUD for approval.

As required by HUD, 80% of the \$57.8 million allocation will be used to support projects in Harris County. The remaining funds will be used to support projects in Aransas, Nueces, and Refugio Counties. The GLO will work with these local communities to begin long-term recovery as outlined in the Action Plan.

Once the Federal Register publishes notice for the additional \$5.024 billion allocation from HUD, the GLO will conduct a similar process in the form of an Action Plan Amendment to this current plan. The amendment will outline further distribution of CDBG-DR funds to be administered by the GLO.

DACA: An Economic Imperative The clock is ticking on a two-million-job issue: finding a permanent solution to replace Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA). The DACA program allows individuals who entered the United States as children to remain here for school or work. Nearly 800,000 persons across the country are enrolled in the program, and approximately 124,300 of these individuals live in Texas. If no action is taken, these young people will be subject

deportation when work visas in place on March 5, 2018 expire (some are already expiring). The issue has become highly politicized, thus at times masking the critical underlying socioeconomic issues. Given underlying changes in the US workforce, immigrants, both documented and undocumented, will become a more crucial source of labor over time. Even if all currently unemployed persons in Texas filled jobs now held by undocumented workers (which is impossible for myriad reasons), the state would be left with a glaring gap of hundreds of thousands of workers if the undocumented workforce were no longer available. Certain industries are particularly in need of workers and rely on undocumented individuals, and events such as Hurricane Harvey exacerbate the shortage. As fears of deportation rise, it becomes increasingly difficult to access this critical resource. Many of the DACA recipients are highly educated and possess skills that are in high demand. Apart from the obvious social and human issues associated with removing the DACA recipients, there are very real economic losses that would occur if DACA is allowed to expire. The Perryman Group recently quantified the direct economic benefits of these young people, often called "Dreamers" in reference to proposed legislation, known as the "DREAM Act (Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors Act)", which has yet to be enacted; the firm's impact assessment system was then used to estimate the total gains in business activity including multiplier effects. For the United States, direct benefits of Dreamers each year include an estimated \$84.3 billion in output (gross product), \$52.8 billion in personal income and almost 685,200 jobs. When multiplier effects are considered, the total benefits rise to \$188.6 billion in output and \$117.3 billion in income per year as well as nearly 2.1 million jobs. For Texas, the direct gains in business activity associated with the Dreamers include an estimated \$11.5 billion in output (gross product) and \$7.2 billion in income each year in addition to more than 108,100 jobs. When multiplier effects are included, the total rises to \$25.8 billion in annual output, \$16.0 billion in income per year, and 324,000 jobs. Although the issues related to immigration are complex, economic benefits of this magnitude should not be ignored in the conversation regarding immigration reform. AMBER ALERT Awareness Day, 13 January 2018

Governor Greg Abbott has proclaimed January 13, 2018, as AMBER Alert Awareness Day in Texas.

Twenty-two years ago, in Arlington, Texas young Amber Hagerman lost her life when she was heartbreakingly abducted and murdered near her home. Her tragic death resulted in the creation of the first AMBER Alert Program in Texas. In 2002, then Governor Rick Perry created the state's AMBER Alert network per Executive Order RP-16, which was later codified through legislation in 2003. The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) was given legislative authority to coordinate the state's AMBER Alert network. Today, Texas has 18 independent regional AMBER Alert networks working alongside the state's network. The State Operations Center (SOC) works closely with law enforcement agencies across Texas to confirm requests for activation of the state network and to communicate critical, life-saving information to state and federal law enforcement, public, media, social media platforms and partner agencies that immediately disseminate an alert. Since the state program's inception and through the end of 2017, 179 children have been safely recovered.

In an effort to significantly increase the likelihood of finding abducted children, the SOC also shares statewide AMBER Alert activations and information via Twitter. Please follow @TX_Alerts to receive AMBER Alert activations and critical information that will help safely recover children in danger. If you witness an abduction or if you locate the child, suspect, or possible vehicle fitting the description described in the alert, immediately call 911. Every passing moment is essential in the safe return of a child.

EPA to hold Superfund Site public meeting on January 30th in Galveston

Dear San Jacinto River/Houston Ship Channel/Galveston Bay Community Members and Stakeholders-

The San Jacinto Waste Pits in Channelview in Harris County is a source of toxic dioxin to the Galveston Bay system, one of the pollutants resulting in seafood consumption advisories in the San Jacinto River, Houston Ship Channel and Galveston Bay.

The waste pits were designated as a Superfund site in 2008. EPA released the final plan to clean up the site, aka the Record of Decision, on October 11, 2017.

In it, they call for isolation of the site from the river with cofferdams and then excavation of the wastes. Galveston Bay Foundation fully supports the EPA remedy.

Come see why. Please mark your calendars for EPA's January 30th public meeting in Galveston on the San Jacinto River Waste Pits Superfund Site (SJRWPS) selected clean up remedy, history of the armored cap, and future activities, as follows:

For more information on the technical aspects of the cleanup, please take a look at Galveston Bay Foundation's SJRWPS Technical Assistance webpage. We also created a Remove San Jacinto River Toxic Waste webpage that lays out

the reasons why removal is the appropriate remedy. We hope you find these pages helpful!

If you would like to be added to GBF's SJRWP mailing list, please let me know. Note: the cleanup will begin in approximately 2 years and will take approximately 2 years to complete once initiated. We will keep members of the mailing list apprised of the activities.

This program performs emergency work and power restoration in disaster-damaged single-family owner-occupied residences. PREPS provides temporary repairs and allows homeowners to remain in their homes and their communities as they complete permanent repairs to their homes. Eligible emergency work includes providing elements necessary for survivor to shelter at home. Some examples may include: Utilities essential for potable water, hot water, HVAC, and minimal food preparation. Functional kitchen, bathroom, and sleeping accommodations. Securing and/or essential weatherproofing to include roof, walls, doors, and windows. Applicants may be eligible for PREPS if they are pre-disaster home owners whose primary residence has already undergone a FEMA-issued inspection with a FEMA verified loss of less than \$17,000 and less than 18 inches of water in the home. FEMA determines if applicants are eligible. Not everyone will be eligible but FEMA along with the State will provide support to those who qualify. Dear Community Leaders:

It has come to our attention that HGAC may be considering changing the criteria regarding the upcoming "Call for Projects" so they will not be considering "collector" roads. This move can and most probably will greatly impact our communities. All of the small cities in HGAC most likely have experienced extraordinary growth and are way behind on mobility needs. Oak Ridge North has suffered greatly as a "pass-through" community where some 16,000 cars a day travel down a road designed for 2,000. Your stories are probably no different.

Unlike the large cities, small cities do not have the resources to fund roads and depend on H-GAC programs and processes to move forward.

If HGAC puts all their emphasis on the main highways and arteries and leave out our local "collector" roads, we will be even further behind and faced with still more gridlock in our communities. It makes no sense to put emphasis on highways while the growth continues outside those highways. People will continue to travel to the highways via collector roads - which will become even more congested.

Please contact Alan Clark at H-GAC and let them know that the small communities need the collector roads kept in all of the plans and Calls for Projects. Please also contact your State Representative and Senator asking them for their involvement.

GLO Offers Additional Temporary

Housing Program for Harvey Survivors:

Partial Repair and Essential Power for Sheltering (PREPS)

The PREPS program is designed to supplement emergency sheltering when communities are faced with sheltering needs that significantly exceed existing capacity.

PREPS performs emergency work and power restoration in disaster-damaged single-family owner-occupied residences. PREPS provides temporary repairs and allows homeowners to remain in their homes and their communities as they complete permanent repairs.

Eligibility:

An applicant may qualify for PREPS even if they were previously denied or did not accept temporary housing from FEMA. Applicants receiving transitional sheltering assistance (TSA) may be eligible for PREPS.

Applicants may participate in PREPS if they are a pre-disaster homeowner whose primary residence has already undergone a FEMA-issued inspection with a FEMA verified loss of less than \$17,000. FEMA determines if applicants are eligible.

Repairs must be reasonable, necessary, and low-cost to make the home safe for sheltering within the capped repair amount of \$20,000 per housing unit.

There is an additional 25% allowance for Access and Functional Needs.

Eligible emergency work includes providing elements necessary for survivors

to shelter at home.

Some examples may include:

- * Utilities essential for potable water, hot water, HVAC, and minimal food preparation
- * Functional kitchen, bathroom, and sleeping accommodations

Commercial / Office / Industrial Development

Memorial Hermann Southeast Hospital announced the launch of its advanced cardiac surgery program. A close collaboration between UTHealth affiliated physicians and Memorial Hermann Physician Network and UT Physicians, the program launch will bring a number of advanced cardiac treatment options, including Coronary Artery Bypass Graft (CABG) surgery and heart valve surgery, to Memorial Hermann Southeast. The hospital, located at 11800 Astoria Blvd. in Houston, is also planning to add additional operating rooms, ICU beds, equipment and instrumentation to support the program.

Update from Wycoff Development - Gulfpoint, the new 43-acre business park at Scarsdale and the Gulf Freeway, is getting closer to a construction start. Currently, civil plans are in the works. In Pasadena at Port Place, 218 Preston Rd., another industrial building is ready to start construction -- 20,000 SF, 20-ton crane ready and 27' clear height. Infrastructure News and Everything Else!

City News

Clear Lake Shores - The Economic Development Corporation has engaged The Goodman Corporation to review potential mobility projects in the city to determine potential funding availability for the prioritized projects. These projects include roads and pedestrian options that will make the city safer and improve connectivity to commercial areas. Galveston County's recent bond election included funding to extend Hanson Road in the city's ETJ improving access to the Target and Home Depot located in the city.

League City Earlier this year, the city was named as one of the fastest growing cities in America, ranking 8th among small cities, in a study conducted by Wallaethub.com. On average, 1,100 new home permits have been issued yearly for the last three years. City officials sent this additional information--

o Total number of jobs in League City according to the Texas Workforce Commission, 33,119

o Number of businesses (based on commercial water meters), 1,265

o New businesses added since May 2016, 206

Nassau Bay Esplanade Lighting Program. The lights should be functional starting December 23rd. The lighting has the ability to change colors based on the season or holiday color scheme selected by the NASA Area Management District. The base lighting will orchestrate color change in each 28 day period of lunar cycle.

Roadways Construction.

* TxDOT reports the letting date for the SH 146 expansion project is May 2018, and actual construction should begin in June. The sequence of the construction phases will begin on the east side for utility relocations, and Phase I will also include existing and new bridge segments. Phase I is anticipated to take 12 - 15 months. For more information about the SH 146 expansion, go here:

* TxDOT anticipates letting the FM 270 and FM 528 Shared Use Path Projects in January 2018. The FM 270 is a 10-foot wide shared use path on the east side of FM 270 from NASA Parkway south to Henderson Avenue. This will complete the FM 270 path from FM 518 to NASA Parkway.

The FM 528/NASA Parkway project is a gap-filler project to construct a 10-foot wide shared use path on the north and south sides of FM 528 from W. NASA Boulevard to Kobayashi Road. With the completion of this project, the entire FM 528/NASA Parkway corridor, from SH 35 to SH 146 (approximately 17 miles) will be fully connected and more user-friendly to pedestrians and bicyclists.

* Work will be complete by March for the Five Corners projects in League City.

Maintenance Issues On MHU/RV?

Direct Housing service and repair requests should be made to the maintenance number listed on the home's refrigerator magnet placed in their unit when they moved in. Survivors experiencing service issues or needing repairs in their manufactured home or travel trailer should call this number.

Federal Housing Administration Offers Mortgage Assistance

Federal Housing Administration (FHA) offers mortgage relief options to Hurricane Harvey survivors. FHA insures over 25 percent of home loans in Texas, and offers a range of payment and relief options. These include a moratorium on foreclosures for borrowers living in counties designated for

assistance. If a survivor has a FHA loan and is struggling to make payments, are in danger of foreclosure or have questions about their loan, they should contact the FHA Resource Center at 800-225-5342.

Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA) Deadline Still In Place

The TSA program provides short-term hotel stays to survivors who were displaced from their homes and need shelter while they look for longer-term housing. The TSA deadline is extended to January 16, 2018.

Survivors With Extenuating Circumstances May Still Apply for Disaster Assistance

Late applications will be reviewed for possible approval, but applicants will have to submit a letter explaining why they were not able to apply before the deadline. After registering late, a notification will be sent to the applicant:

- * After receiving the notification, the applicant must submit a letter to FEMA that includes an explanation for the late application, with supporting documentation.
- * Extenuating circumstances may include: hospitalization, death of an immediate family member, or personal or business travel.
- * Explanation letters must be submitted (postmarked if sent via mail) within 60 days of the notification letter from FEMA.
- * FEMA will review for approval or denial.

ISO has 8 product lines; they are an octopus. PPC is 1 of the product lines and that is what we are going to improve - the ISO PPC, i.e., PPC is ISO. The PPC goes by many names such as: Insurance number, ISO class, class, ISO rating, etc. PPC is an acronym for Public Protection Classification. All the insurance companies except State Farm uses the PPC designation. State Farm call the PPC rating a "Subzone Rating". State Farm pays by far the largest assessment to ISO of any insurance company in America and uses these ratings to set the residential and commercial premiums. I have all the proof. Many State Farm employees say they do not use ISO which is a lie. All insurance companies in Texas use ISO. I have all the proof - some of it is attached - specifically note Fort Worth where the Assistant City Manager over Fire and Police had the attached summary of the 7 largest insurance companies doing business in Fort Worth (note the largest savings going from a 3 to a 2 was State Farm). Recently (less than a year ago) I did the City of Burnet and their Mayor is a State Farm Agent and told the audience at their council meeting how important this number is to the residential property owners. Same with Brian Sexton (an ESD Commissioner in Parker County ESD #1) - he is also a State Farm agent.

Note the information from the TDI (Texas Department of Insurance). Residentially a 4 to a 2 will saving the homeowners around 10% annually. So a homeowner paying \$2,000 per year will save approximately \$200 assuming all endorsements and perils remain constant. The commercial property owners for class rated properties will save around 12% per year.

No this study only addresses El Lago. The proposal would stay the same unless you want to pay for a report for Seabrook; which would more than double the price - I seriously doubt you want to do that. Remember these studies are 10% fire service communications, 50% fire department, 40% water, and an extra 5.50% based on Fire Marshal codes and enforcement. Studying the effect of closing fire stations involves a complete study based on all areas an ISO study encompasses. I am sure Seabrook was last rated under the outdated ISO rating document. Any ISO information they may have is most likely useless.

Seabrook will not be injured. When we do El Lago all that will be said is Pasadena now provides the fire protection via a contract. I do not try to damage anyone or fish for more work; I am endorsed by the Texas Fire Chiefs Association and would never try to compromise a Fire Chiefs or city's position with ISO.

This will in no way affect Seabrook.

Dear Community Leaders,

The GLO continues working diligently in anticipation of the release of the Federal Register, which will outline the rules and regulations for CDBG-DR funding in response to Hurricane Harvey. The GLO has already begun working on the Action Plan in addition to a Method of Distribution for funds to be distributed through the Councils of Governments (COGs).

Commissioner Bush and the GLO believe that recovery happens best when it's performed locally, and we encourage you to be involved in this process as we move forward as quickly as possible to get these funds to the local level. The programs to be administered directly by the GLO will allow the state to begin in this recovery while the COGs develop their own Methods of Distribution to enable local governments to spend CDBG-DR funds on eligible housing and infrastructure activities that work best for their communities.

The GLO is committed to allowing as much flexibility as possible in the use of these funds. CDBG-DR funds are intended for long-term recovery to build back your communities stronger and more resilient for the future. Some communities have experience with these funds through Hurricane Ike and recent flood recovery, but if you are unfamiliar with this program, we invite you to visit our website at <http://www.glo.texas.gov/recovery/assistance/local-governments/index.html>

Once the State Action Plan is finalized it will be posted on our website for public comment before being submitted to HUD for approval. The overall timeline for approval is estimated between two to three months, and during that time, the GLO will begin working with the COGs to develop their Methods of Distribution and their programs to administer these funds.

Survivors with extenuating circumstances may still apply for disaster assistance after the Nov. 30 registration deadline.

Late applications will be reviewed for possible approval, but applicants will have to submit a letter explaining why they were not able to apply before the deadline. After registering late, a notification will be sent to the applicant:

- * After receiving the notification, the applicant must submit a letter to FEMA that includes an explanation for the late application, with supporting documentation.
- * Extenuating circumstances may include: hospitalization, death of an immediate family member, or personal or business travel.
- * Explanation letters must be submitted (postmarked if sent via mail) within 60 days of the notification letter from FEMA.
- * FEMA will review for approval or denial.

Survivors with extenuating circumstances may still apply for disaster assistance after the Nov. 30 registration deadline. Late applications will be reviewed for possible approval, but applicants will have to submit a letter explaining why they were not able to apply before the deadline. After registering late, a notification will be sent to the applicant:

- * After receiving the notification, the applicant must submit a letter to FEMA that includes an explanation for the late application, with supporting documentation.
- * Extenuating circumstances may include: hospitalization, death of an immediate family member, or personal or business travel.
- * Explanation letters must be submitted (postmarked if sent via mail) within 60 days of the notification letter from FEMA.
- * FEMA will review for approval or denial.

Background:

• Benefit-Cost Analysis (BCA) is the method by which the future benefits of a hazard mitigation project are determined and compared to its costs. The end result is a Benefit-Cost Ratio (BCR), which is calculated by a project's total benefits divided by its total costs. The BCR is a numerical expression of the "cost-effectiveness" of a project. A project is considered to be cost effective when the BCR is 1.0 or greater, indicating the benefits of a prospective hazard mitigation project are sufficient to justify the costs. FEMA requires a BCA to validate cost effectiveness of proposed hazard mitigation projects prior to funding. There are two drivers behind this requirement: (1) the Office of Management and Budget's (OMB) Circular A-94 Revised, "Guidelines and Discount Rates for Benefit-Cost Analysis of Federal Programs" and (2) the

Stafford Act.

- A BCA is required for bigger projects such as home buyouts,

engineering repair/replace, etc., but is being requested more and more for smaller projects.

- Requirement for many FEMA grants.

Mayor, as we discussed, I have the following questions:

1 – In Section 1, "Definitions," the definition of "Hazardous Materials Response" refers to being "... limited to the "Operations Level" as defined in NFPA 472." What is this limitation? Is it consistent with the City's present service?

2 – The provisions of Section 2 provide that either party may terminate the Agreement on 6 months written notice prior to an anniversary date. But there is then a separate paragraph that permits Pasadena (but not El Lago) to terminate on 6 months notice (not written) "without cause" and "... notwithstanding any provision contained herein to the contrary ...". Why does Pasadena maintain termination rights superior to El Lago?

3 – Section 3 requires El Lago to pay – in addition to any payments under the Agreement – "... any fees incurred over and above standard operational costs ..." and "... inclusive of remediation of hazardous materials spills and releases." Under what circumstances does this come into effect and what is the fee schedule?

4 – The second paragraph of Section 3 specifies certain services that are specifically excluded from the Agreement, including first responder EMS service and fire safety inspections. Is this agreeable to the City and if those services are being provided by the City's present provider, how does the City plan to provide those services if this Agreement goes into effect?

5 – The third paragraph of Section 3 also excludes firefighting and fire prevention services for any buildings 3 stories tall or 30 feet in height. Please confirm that this does not apply to any buildings in the City and if it does, the City's plan to provide those services to those buildings.

6 – Section 4 requires the City to pay the entire annual fee on the execution of the Agreement. Since Pasadena can terminate on 6 months notice, this needs to be changed to monthly payments as is the case for the City now or some mechanism needs to be included to require Pasadena to remit a pro rata amount of fees in the event of a termination within a contract year.

7 – Section 5 pertains to "... civil liability related to the furnishing of fire protection services ..." and proposes to place that liability on El Lago for events in El Lago, notwithstanding the Agreement. Is this agreeable to the City? If so, I think that for clarity purposes, the phrase should be "... third party civil liability ..." for the reasons described in the next item.

8 – As I advised you, Section 6 raises several questions. The City is negotiating an Agreement with the City of Pasadena to provide firefighting and fire prevention services but this Section advises that those services are NOT being provided by Pasadena but, instead, by a volunteer fire department with its own governing board. If that is the case, shouldn't the Agreement be with the VFD or, at least, shouldn't the VFD be a signatory to the Agreement? I note that the City's present agreement is not with the City of Seabrook but, instead, with the Seabrook VFD.

Additionally, the Section advises that in the event the VFD fails or refuses to respond to a service call, Pasadena is not liable for a breach of the Agreement unless it actually directs such. Thus, as written, El Lago has no recourse if such happens. This needs to be addressed.

I look forward to hearing back on these issues and am available to discuss with you or Pasadena's attorney at any time.

GLO Weekly Newsletter: Harvey Housing Update

REMINDER: ONE DAY LEFT!

Texans affected by Hurricane Harvey have until November 30, 2017, to register for federal assistance.

To be considered for eligibility for FEMA short-term housing programs, homeowners and renters must first register through one of the choices listed below:

* Online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov

* FEMA mobile app, available at fema.gov/mobile-app

* Phone (800) 621-3362 (711 or Video Relay Service) 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Central daily, TTY (800) 462-7585.

* At a Disaster Recovery Center (DRC). Find your nearest DRC at fema.gov/drc

Several temporary housing solutions are in place for eligible Texans. Solutions include:

Manufactured Housing Options: This solution consists of Manufactured Housing Units (MHUs), Travel Trailers and non-motorized Recreational Vehicles (RVs). Manufactured housing options are placed on private land or commercial pads. Local permitting regulation or ordinances apply, as well as ordinances concerning manufactured housing and flood plain requirements. Sites will be inspected for feasibility before units are hauled and installed by the local entities involved.

Direct Assistance for Limited Home Repair (DALHR): The program provides repairs so you can live in your home again. Applicants may be eligible for DALHR if they are pre-disaster home owners whose residence has undergone a FEMA-issued inspection with a FEMA verified loss of at least \$17,000. Specific considerations for DALHR include:

- * Repairs must be completed within 90 days from the start of the repair work.
- * Repairs are less than fifty percent of the market value of the home and may not exceed \$60,000.
- * Repairs are not covered by insurance or an SBA loan.
- * Any home located within the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) shall not be

considered for DAHLR repairs unless in accordance with applicable federal and local laws, regulations and ordinances and can be repaired in the cost limits.

* Per the Stafford Act § 312, 42 U.S.C. § 5155, any duplication of benefits is prohibited. Applicants eligible for DAHLR assistance may choose to either provide documentation and receipts for used FEMA financial repair assistance and return all unused assistance received for home repair to FEMA, or decline DAHLR assistance and keep any financial assistance received.

Multi-Family Lease and Repair (MLR): The program allows local government entities to enter into agreements with owners of multi-family rental properties to repair or improve existing properties, such as apartments, for use by disaster survivors.

Direct Lease (DL): Enables the government to lease a property that would not generally be available to the public, such as corporate lodging, to house survivors. Properties must at a minimum provide complete and independent living facilities for one or more persons, including for living, sleeping, cooking and sanitation.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS - SHORT TERM HOUSING

1. FEMA said I was approved for a travel trailer—that was weeks ago and I haven't heard anything since. Do you have any information on the delivery schedule?

The GLO is currently only handling logistics relating to the acquisition and placement of MHUs (mobile homes). FEMA alone is handling the acquisition and placement of travel trailers. Please continue to be patient as they work to locate and deliver your trailer and keep in mind that there is no guaranteed delivery timeline.

2. A FEMA representative told me that the GLO was handling the delivery of mobile homes. The site visit was weeks ago and I'm still waiting for delivery. What's the holdup?

Currently, both FEMA and the GLO are handling the acquisition and delivery of mobile homes. Please continue to be patient as both agencies work to locate and deliver units. There is no definitive timeline; conditions vary by unit availability and the unique delivery logistics of the applicant's location.

3. I recently heard about a DALHR (Direct Assistance for Limited Home Repair) program. FEMA never mentioned that program to me. Can I apply for this GLO program?

DALHR is a FEMA direct housing assistance program, one of several short-term housing assistance options. FEMA processes applications for assistance and makes determinations based on details unique to each applicant. As with other housing options, DALHR has restrictions, e.g., the level of damage to the home and the assessed dollar amount of deemed-essential repairs. The GLO is responsible for administering the DALHR program once FEMA directs the GLO to provide that assistance, but the GLO cannot overturn a FEMA determination.

4. Does the GLO offer any kind of short-term housing assistance in addition to what FEMA is able to offer?

No, the GLO is only engaged in short-term housing assistance as it relates to FEMA's programs for assistance. The GLO will be administering long-term housing assistance independent of FEMA through federally provided CDBG-DR funds, but these funds will come months and years later.

5. The TSA program expiration date is approaching. Can you grant another extension?

Yes, the TSA program has been granted an extension by FEMA. The TSA program provides short-term hotel stays to survivors who were displaced from their homes and need shelter while they look for longer-term housing. The TSA deadline has been extended to January 16, 2018.

On Thursday, November 16, in Rockport, TX, Commissioner George P. Bush and FEMA Deputy Federal Coordinating Officer John Long gave the key to a recipient of a manufactured housing unit (MHU) provided through the short-term direct housing assistance program. The MHU program is one of several FEMA-funded direct disaster housing programs being locally led and state managed by the Texas General Land Office (GLO). As of Friday, November 17, there are 1,605 home sites with inspection reviews in progress, there have been 371 "haul and install" work orders issued, and 176 MHU's have been "licensed in", which means the owners have been given the keys and taken possession statewide.

On Monday, November 13, Commissioner George P. Bush proudly announced that the Texas General Land Office (GLO) had completed repairs on the home of the first recipients of the Direct Assistance for Limited Home Repair (DALHR) program in Dickinson. DALHR is one of the programs being offered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for Texans needing housing assistance following Hurricane Harvey. The program provides repairs for homeowners with moderate damages who lack available housing resources. Currently there are 887 households eligible for the DALHR program statewide. "It is truly an honor to be a part of the first Direct Assistance for Limited Home Repair program in American history," said Commissioner Bush. "In partnership with FEMA, the county, and the city of Dickinson, we are proud to get started on helping a community rebuild." View a video of Commissioner George P. DO YOU KNOW OF SOMEONE WHOSE FEMA APPLICATION WAS DENIED?

Here are some of the common reasons applications might be denied:

- * Insufficient damage to your residence as determined by a FEMA-contracted inspector. In other words, your home is still safe, sanitary and functional.
- * You have an insurance policy that covered damage to your home.
- * You indicated on your application that you did not want to move while your damaged home was being repaired. This made you ineligible for FEMA temporary rental assistance.
- * You could not be contacted for a home inspection. The FEMA-contracted inspector may have tried to reach you numerous times, but has not been able to schedule an appointment.
- * FEMA could not verify your identity. The agency is unable to match your name and Social Security number.

Applicants can appeal this determination. All appeals must be made in the form of a signed letter within 60 days of the date on the determination letter. In the appeal, applicants should clearly explain why they disagree with the decision. The appeal should include any requested information and supporting documentation. If the person writing the appeal letter is not the applicant or a member of the applicant's household, a statement must be

included granting authorization to the writer to act on the applicant's behalf.

All appeals letters must include the following:

- * Applicant's full name, date of birth and current address
- * Applicant's signature and the date
- * Applicant's registration number (on every page)
- * FEMA disaster declaration number – DR-4332 (on every page)

Additionally, applicants must include a copy of a state-issued identification card with the letter. In the event that the applicant is unable to include proof of identification, the letter may be notarized or include the statement "I hereby declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct."

The Economic Impact of Hurricane Harvey

Hurricane Harvey, one of the worst natural disasters in American history, left a devastating human and economic impact when it struck the Greater Houston Area on August 25, 2017. After it ended five days later, it destroyed thousands of homes and businesses, displacing tens of thousands of people. Now, the people of Houston are rebuilding and moving forward, but where does that leave municipalities?

In the wake of Hurricane Harvey's destruction, Houston saw a severe decline in sales tax revenue, a typical result of natural disasters that cause businesses to temporarily close. However, as businesses reopened and the rebuilding process proceeded, municipal sales tax revenue reached \$2.46 billion in October 2017, which is 6.9 percent more than in October 2016, according to the Texas Comptroller's Office.

"Although Houston is facing a loss to municipal tax revenue, it will not last for long. Houston is resilient and that shows as it rebuilds," said Lisa Broussard, Senior Vice President for MuniServices Central Operations. "As the Comptroller's Office has indicated, Houston is quickly revitalizing itself while it moves further into the future and past Hurricane Harvey."

In addition, the Comptroller's Office offered relief to businesses by lifting its requirement to file an automatic 30-day tax extension. If the 30-day extension was not sufficient, business owners could request an additional extension.

"To say the hurricane has been devastating would be an understatement. Our clients, the cities and counties we serve, need us to be present and thoughtful in helping them rebuild," continued Broussard. "MuniServices will help them survive the storm after the storm."

Direct Assistance for Limited Home Repair (DALHR): Provides permanent repairs to homes with moderate damages ranging between \$17,000 to less than 50% of the home's value prior to the storm.

FEMA will determine eligibility for permanent housing construction DALHR on a case-by-case basis.

In addition to the programs being offered above, the Texas GLO is administering two FEMA funded programs that could be beneficial to multifamily property owners (e.g., apartment complexes). These housing options provide funds to make rental units safe and functional, while providing Hurricane Harvey survivors with adequate alternative housing options.

Multi-Family Lease and Repair (MFLR): This program allows for your property to be repaired or upgraded by GLO in return for housing eligible FEMA applicants.

Direct Lease (DL): This program enables local governments to lease housing properties that would not typically be available to the public for lease such as corporate apartments.

In addition to the programs being offered above, the Texas GLO is administering two FEMA funded programs that could be beneficial to multifamily property owners (e.g., apartment complexes). These housing options provide funds to make rental units safe and functional, while providing Hurricane Harvey survivors with adequate alternative housing options.

Multi-Family Lease and Repair (MFLR): This program allows for your property to be repaired or upgraded by GLO in return for housing eligible FEMA applicants.

Direct Lease (DL): This program enables local governments to lease housing properties that would not typically be available to the public for lease such as corporate apartments.

Texans affected by Hurricane Harvey now have until November 30, 2017, to register for federal assistance. The deadline was November 24, however, an additional six days now gives survivors more time through the Thanksgiving holiday.

To be considered eligible for FEMA short-term housing programs, homeowners and renters must first register by phone or online.

If denied, for disaster assistance after Hurricane Harvey you should read your FEMA determination letters carefully.

In some instances, you may only need to provide missing documentation to be eligible for assistance. For more information on eligibility and determination letters see

In response to requests for additional guidance on the procurement process, GLO-CDR has updated the below linked guidance/checklist to help make better use of your Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) resources, and to avoid common procurement pitfalls during the management of your grant.

GLO-CDR Procurement Checklist

Subrecipients must procure goods and services using the federal procurement and contract requirements outlined in 2 CFR 200.318

– 200.326 for 2015 and 2016 floods allocations. These procurement requirements must be followed for reimbursement from the 2015 (P.L. 114-113) and 2016 (P.L. 114-223 and 245) allocations of Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery funds provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

In the link below, HUD offers additional resources, including a toolkit that provides guidance to CDBG-DR grantees and subrecipients on how to comply with the latest procurement requirements as communities work quickly to recover from a disaster.

Constitutional Amendment Summary

During the 85th Legislative Session earlier this year, over 150 joint resolutions to amend our Texas Constitution were proposed. In order for any joint resolution to become an eligible proposition for the upcoming constitutional amendment election, the joint resolution must receive a super majority, or two-thirds of the vote in each chamber of the legislature.

That equates to 100 members in the Texas House and 21 members of the Texas Senate. In all, seven joint resolutions were ultimately passed and have become propositions for the voters of Texas to ratify on the upcoming November 7th ballot. To learn more click [here](#)

This effort will show once again that when Texans come together, nothing, not even the worst natural disaster in our state's history, can stop us." - George P. Bush, Commissioner

The General Land Office (GLO) in coordination with Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will manage all housing-related recovery efforts, from short-term housing assistance repairs to the long-term rebuilding to come. The GLO, in partnership with the Councils of Government (COGs), will work with eligible individuals from affected regions to identify which programs they are eligible for and help those select the program that best addresses their needs.

Hurricane Harvey survivors now have until Friday, November 24 to register for federal assistance.

To be considered for eligibility for FEMA short-term housing programs, homeowners and renters must first register through one of the choices listed below.

- * Online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov.
- * FEMA mobile app, available at

fema.gov/mobile-app

* Phone (800) 621-3362 (711 or Video Relay Service) 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. Central daily.

TTY (800) 462-7585.

* At a Disaster Recovery Center (DRC). Find your nearest DRC at fema.gov/drc.

Consideration for a short-term housing is given to those needing temporary housing for a period of up to 18 months from the start of the disaster to February 25, 2019.

Owners must receive a determination by FEMA that their permanent residence has at least \$17,000 of FEMA verified damage.

Renters must receive a determination by FEMA that their property has sustained major damage or has been destroyed.

Once FEMA provides eligible applicant information, and the programs they qualify for, to the GLO, the state will work with local governments leaders to contact applicants and identify the best program to meet each individual's needs to provide a short term housing solution.

FEMA's direct housing authority provides short term housing while individuals work to identify their permanent housing plan. GLO or COG re-evaluates applicant eligibility on a periodic basis, usually monthly, and the short-term housing assistance eligibility for the entire period is subject to continuing to meet requirements.

FEMA APPLICATION DENIED?

Have you been hearing from constituents saying their initial FEMA application was denied? There are several reasons why an application might be denied. Here are some of the common reasons applications might be denied:

- * Information is incorrect or application is incomplete
- * Damage is not to the primary residence
- * Another household claim is already in existence
- * Disaster-related losses cannot be verified
- * Losses have been covered by insurance

FAST FACTS:

* Wednesday, August 23, 2017

Texas Governor Greg Abbott issued a disaster declaration for an initial 30 counties in Hurricane Harvey's path.

* Friday, August 25, 2017

Harvey makes landfall as a Category 4 hurricane when the eye of the storm comes ashore between Port Aransas and Port O'Connor. Hurricane Harvey dumped more than 24.5 trillion gallons of water across the Houston region, which is home to about six million Texans.

* Thursday, September 14, 2017

Governor Greg Abbott announces that he is designating Commissioner George P. Bush and the Texas General Land Office to lead the state's short-term Hurricane Harvey housing recovery efforts. This marks the first time FEMA funded housing efforts have been led at a state level.

* Saturday, September 23, 2017

The GLO signs an agreement with FEMA outlining the programs that will be offered for the short-term housing assistance for the state's initial Hurricane Harvey recovery efforts. The GLO launched an informational website for individuals and local leaders:

* Friday, October 20, 2017

The Project Management, Administrative, and Implementation Plans are finalized and approved by FEMA. These plans were required by FEMA and outlined in the Intergovernmental Service Agreement (IGSA).

WHAT WE ARE DOING:

- * Daily calls are being made to those who have qualified for short-term FEMA housing
- * The GLO is contracting for several services including the manufacturing of short-term disaster assistance housing (manufactured homes and RVs), the haul, and install and maintenance of the units, and construction services to provide basic repairs for homes damaged by the hurricane, audit services and project management services.
- * Additional procurements may be released as needed. Contractors should reference the Electronic State Business Daily (ESBD) on the Texas Comptrollers website: <http://esbd.cpa.state.tx.us/>.

SHORT TERM FEMA HOUSING PROGRAMS:

Direct Leasing (DL):

- * Enables local governments to lease a property that typically would not be available to the public, such as corporate lodging.
- * Local government enters into the lease agreement on behalf of individuals or households. Various types of housing properties may be eligible.
- * 100% federally funded.

Multi-Family Lease and Repair (MFLR):

- * Direct assistance to repair or improve existing multi-family housing such as apartments in order to provide more housing for survivors.
- * Properties must be three or more units, with each unit providing complete living facilities for cooking, eating, and sanitation. Hotels, motels, and extended stay hotels are not eligible at this time.
- * 100% federally funded.

Manufactured Housing Units (MHU):

Mobile Homes and Recreational Vehicles:

Temporary manufactured housing on private land or commercial pads

- * Direct housing places manufactured units on private land or commercial pads.
- * Site must be suitable. Hauling and installation by local entities involved.
- * An inspection of the site to determine suitability will be scheduled.
- * 100% federally funded.

Direct Assistance for Limited Home Repair (DALHR):

- * DALHR provides permanent repairs to homes with damage ranging

between \$17,000 to less than 50% of the home's value prior to the storm.

Program can include permanent repairs to a survivor's home where alternative housing is not available or is not cost-effective.

* FEMA will determine eligibility for permanent housing construction DALHR on a case-by-case basis.

* Providing direct repairs will be substantially faster and more cost effective.

* 100% federally funded.

ABOUT THE GLO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND REVITALIZATION PROGRAM:

Since 2011, the CDR program of the Texas General Land Office has administered the U.S. Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funded Community Development Block Grants for Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) on behalf of the state of Texas. Total funding of approximately \$4 billion has been allocated for recovery through CDBG-DR following Hurricanes Rita, Dolly, and Ike; the 2011 wildfires, and the 2015 and 2016 floods. These grants can be used for a wide variety of recovery efforts including housing redevelopment, business assistance, and infrastructure repair. For more information, please visit TexasRebuilds.org.
