








The University Club hosted the Big 10 Conference June 6-8, 2025, at the Hilton Garden Inn, downtown Iowa City. Twenty-eight university club members attended from various universities including, Penn State, Michigan State, Minnesota, Michigan, Illinois, Northwestern, The Ohio State, Purdue, Nebraska and Iowa.

Saturday began with a motivating one woman show, "The Yellow Rose of Suffrage" performed by Ms. Jane Cox, professor from ISU. Her performance was a powerful portrayal of women's fight for voting rights. Her passionate delivery left the audience inspired and motivated.

After a short break, there were round table discussions where we shared best practices and answered questions on the topics of Volunteerism, Interest Groups, Scholarships and Communication.



A tour of Hancher thoroughly wowed our guests, with one attendee announcing her plans to return for a future performance. Post-tour lunch was served at the Strauss theatre, with a video showcasing campus landmarks and notable University of Iowa sports figures.

The Cambus then took everyone on a short tour of the campus, which included a loop through the downtown area, up the hill to Carver Hawkeye Arena, Kinnick Stadium, Stead Family Children's Hospital and University of Iowa Health Center (UIHC). Tour guides highlighted the proximity of Kinnick Stadium to UIHC and reminded guests of the heartwarming "WAVE" tradition when fans wave to the children in Stead Family Hospital at the end of the 1st quarter.

Dr. Azeem Ahmed was the keynote speaker Saturday night. He captivated the audience with anecdotes and experiences as the Medical Director for Kinnick Stadium and Carver Hawkeye Arena, offering valuable insights into sports medicine.

One memorable story involved a football fan struck by a heart attack as they entered Kinnick Stadium. Within minutes, Emergency medical staff were attending to the fan and transferring him across the street to the University of Iowa Health Center (UIHC).

When Dr. Ahmed checked on him after the game in the Cardiac Unit, the fan was watching the post-game interviews on the TV. If his heart attack had occurred anywhere else, this fan may not have survived.

The meeting wrapped up Sunday with a presentation by Penn State- they will be hosting the Big10 Conference 2027.

Consider the lives of the workers who harvested mussels, labored in the factories and organized unions to fight for better working conditions. The museum is a study of mussels, the amazing creatures which made it all possible. Check out the button craft creations.

Built in 1908, the Laura Musser Mansion, part of the Muscatine Art Center, provides an elegant setting for the display of fine and decorative arts. The hallways display a collection of works by Renoir, Degas, Chagall and Pissarro. Period rooms blend family furnishings with paintings that depict the Mississippi River. On the grounds, in spring and summer, is a historic Japanese Garden installed in 1929. The museum was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2017. It is 1 of 775 museums nationwide accredited by American Alliance of Museums.




