The year 2025-2026 is in full swing!

Our Fall Fair Open House on September 9, drew a record 435 attendees - 100 more than last year- with 63 new members joining and 158 event tickets sold. We also distributed 378 yearbooks.

Our next big event was the Scholarship Appreciation held at the Levitt Center on October 8th. Since partnering with the University of Iowa Center for Advancement in 1982, University Club Members have donated \$204,872, and awarded \$104,939 in scholarships to 62 recipients.

Our October Luncheon was well attended by 150 members, to hear Dr. Jann Freed speak on "The Rest Of Life Is the Best of Life."

I had the opportunity to speak to the Connections Interest group and the Newcomers group about the University Club. Board members in attendance were introduced, and the agenda included an overview of successful events, plans for future events and finances. The QA period offered an opportunity to answer questions and a forum for lively discussion.

Scholarship Recipient Reception

University Club members gathered at the Levitt Center on Wednesday, October 8 to celebrate our scholarship recipients, several of whom were in attendance.

After a welcome by Rose Meyer, University Club President, Jan Tracy, Past President provided a short history of the club's scholarship program.

The first scholarship was given in 1972 for \$325, which paid for a full semester's tuition. University Club has provided continuous scholarships since 1982 and for the last 20 years has partnered with the University Center for Advancement to administer the scholarship program.

Since partnering with The University Center for Advancement: University Club Members have donated \$204,872. University Club Members participating: 2,492. \$104,939 has been awarded to 62 recipients.

Recipients Jade Knerr and Carsyn Zehr were introduced and given certificates and a pen made from a tree fallen in a storm on the Hancher property.

Dr. Katherine Briggie was also recognized and asked to speak about her educational journey. The University Club scholarship support allowed her to continue her studies, through Medical School in Des Moines and residencies and fellowship at University of Iowa, where she is now a physician on staff at UIHC Emergency Department.

Meet: 9:30 in front of the Englert Theater 221 E Washington St, Iowa City, Iowa.

Trip High lights:

Morning/Lunch We will start our day by meeting at the Englert theater at 9:30 AM. The Englert has been around since 1912 and has hosted vaudeville acts and even been a movie theater. In the 1990s a group of local citizens took the opportunity to purchase, renovate and restore the old theatre to its original purpose.

This group of inspired locals persuaded the city of Iowa City to purchase

it and hold it in trust until they could raise enough money to renovate the space. Over about 5 years the group worked diligently to rebuild the Englert as a premier art venue and a rising star in Iowa City's cultural

scene. Enjoy this delightful tour.



Lunch: Lunch will be at the Bistro Restaurant, part of Marriott Courtyard 901 Melrose Ave., a beautiful event center. ENJOY! They will provide us with a limited menu.

We have a fun filled afternoon planned. At 12:50 we will meet at the Johnson County Poor Farm, 4811 Melrose Ave, Iowa City. We will learn

about this 160-acre poor farm which was established in the middle 1800s to care for individuals with disabilities, people with low wealth, elderly folks who did not have relatives to care for them, immigrants, widows, and orphans. It closed in 1988, reopened in 2016 when the Johnson County Board of Supervisors hired HBK Engineering to preserve the historic farm.



The preservation results included renovating historic farm structure, and creating educational programs for beginning farmers, conservation, and recreation, making many improvements to the farm. If you are interested you can visit the Historic Poor Farm website to learn more about the farm's history, current programs, and how to get involved.

Our last stop will be the Johnson County Iowa City Landfill and Recycling Center at 3900 Hebel Ave SE. Iowa City, where we will learn about recycling and the landfill. Recycling is an essential practice that helps protect our environment and conserve valuable materials. It is highly recommended for this excursion you wear closed-toe shoes, safety glasses will be provided. The tour requires walking on pavement and sometimes uneven surfaces, exposure to dust and exposure to outdoor conditions so dress for the weather. We are looking forward to another exciting cultural event.




