The University Club Iowa City luncheon on October 8th featured a panel of University of Iowa women coaches. Sloane Taylor moderated the panel with Lisa Cellucci, Field Hockey Head coach, Sasha Schmid, Tennis Head Coach, and Jen Llewellyn, Gymnastics Head Coach. Sasha Schmid provided a history of women's sports at Iowa, and the impact of Dr. Christine Grant, not only at Iowa but nationally as a pioneer in gender equity in athletics.

The Gymnastic team includes 3 Olympians and 2 All Americans. The Field Hockey team has been in the top 10 consistently for the last 6 years. Why does University of Iowa have a Field Hockey team when there are no field hockey teams in the state? Well, Dr. Christine Grant was a field hockey player and brought the sport with her when she came from Scotland to attend Iowa. She loved the sport and was the first coach.

In 1980, Dr. Grant convinced NBC sports to air AIAW games, essential to expanding women's sporting events to a larger audience. In addition to speaking about their sports, these coaches shared information on the HAWKEYE WOMEN RISE campaign to build top-notch facilities, and provide needed resources to student-athletes and coaches. Day Trip Culture Group


Wednesday December 4

Program: Spend the day in Washington, Iowa with historian Michael Zahs, a retired junior high school teacher from Washington who is known all over the state/country for his historic presentations. He so loves history that his voice cracks with emotion when he tells his stories. Our morning will be a bus tour of Washington county, where Mr. Zahs will delight us with tales of the underground railroad and walk us through the history of Washington county, entertaining us with his historical perspective. 

FAQs About Interest Groups and a BIG 10 Conference Update

INTEREST GROUP FAQs:

We are so happy that so many new members are joining and because we hear some questions many times, we decided some quick FAQs might be a good idea! Here goes:

Q. How do I find a list of all the Interest Groups?

A. Details for each group and a calendar are on the club website. They are also printed in the August Clarion and kept updated on the web throughout the year. For this issue, there's a Quick Reference Chart on page 18.

Q. How do I join an Interest Group?

A. The best time to join is at Fall Fair, but you can join throughout the year by contacting the group chair. When new groups are added that interest you, reach out to the chair or chairs to sign up. Everyone who participates in any group **MUST** be a paid member of the Club.

Q. What if I sign up and change my mind?

A. We know that everything seems possible at Fall Fair! But our calendars only hold so much! If you change your mind about a group, just let the chair know. If you're just worried about missing some of the meetings, don't worry! It happens to all of us. Unless an RSVP was requested, you don't have to do anything.

Q. Do I need to RSVP?

A. The group chairs usually send an email reminder and sometimes they request an RSVP. That is almost always because they need an accurate headcount for the space or activity. Be polite and respond. If no RSVP is requested, feel free to just attend.

Q. I can't find an Interest Group for my favorite activity? Who decides what groups exist?

A. This one's easy! You do! If you are interested in forming a new group there's a form to fill out with the details and then the Board votes to approve and add the group. You should be willing to organize the group and serve as Chair or find help to do that. New groups are added all the time!

Q. OK, I'm ready to find some fun! If I have more questions or want to work on starting a new group, who do I reach out to?

A. Susan Hartwell is the Chair for Interest Groups this year.



