

Message from the Finance Chair:

Happy New Year! Here is one more thing to add to your New Year's resolutions: if you haven't already made your donation to the University Club Scholarship Fund, it's not too late! Just use the coupon on page 7 of this Clarion and mail it to Kathy Maxwell. Remember that donations \$200 and up will receive a free luncheon coupon that will not expire.

We are doing well so far in 2021-22. I have forwarded \$5,630 to the UI Center for Advancement which will be added to approximately \$180,000 we already have in our endowment fund. The proceeds from our fund have financed three \$2,500 scholarships this year. They always go to University of Iowa female students who are in their third year of study. These students have a proven need for assistance that will not be met in any other way. Most recipients report that they will be able to work less and study more with our help.

I was recently informed that our recipients this year are: Gabrielle Healey, an Environmental Policy and Planning major from Dubuque, IA; Emerie Bell, a Health and Human Physiology Major from North Liberty; and Hanna Chang, an Ethics and Public Policy major from Norwalk, IA. Emerie's note of appreciation is in this Clarion on page 8.

Our donations have come from about 70 members of the club (roughly 11.5% of our members), including those who overpaid on their memberships and luncheons and chose to donate the difference. The UC Writers' Interest Group has also donated the proceeds from their latest published book. The amount of \$5,630.00 donated at this point in time is comparable with previous years, and we have five more months to go in the 2021-2022 fiscal year. As I have said before, I would love to have a larger percentage of our members participate in this project. The amount of the donation is not as important as your participation.

About 30 of the donations are in memory of friends, family members and former members of the club. This is a wonderful way to remember these friends. Unfortunately, the University Club board has voted to no longer compile the names of our deceased members and list them in the Clarion and the Yearbook as has been our long-time custom. If it has been your routine to check this list, as I have done, to honor our friends after their deaths, please know that you will not have this resource in the future.

Our scholarship fund remains our single best method of demonstrating our interest in and support for the University of Iowa, which is consistent with our mission statement.

Donations for 2021-22 must be received by May 31, 2022. The Honor Roll of Contributors will appear in the Yearbook in the fall.

FINANCE NEWS SPRING 2022

Let's talk about our dues...

Dues are currently \$20 per year. The last time they were changed was before the 2012-2013 year, when they went from \$15 to \$20. Members are asked to pay an additional \$5 if they renew after October 1. What do I get for my \$20? Let's break it down. Based on the year before Covid altered everything, 2018-2019, this is how the actual expenses broke down for each of our 700 members.

Excess revenue over expenses at the end of the year was approx. \$3 per member. More than 700 members 3. and we have more in surplus. We have about 610 members now, we budgeted for 650 this year. If you check the line that says "Excess Revenue over Expenses" in every Yearbook since 2010-2011, when we spent \$59.24 more than

we took in, we have shown a surplus ranging from a minimum of \$1,700 to a maximum of \$3,500.

If these numbers haven't boggled your brain yet, let's look further into University

Club assets. These are reported every year in the Yearbook and at each of the two Business Meeting Luncheons (October and March). They are easy to overlook. The University Club (as of December 31, 2021) has a checking account balance of \$34,340.99 plus savings of \$1,982.44.

Good business practices suggest a surplus of twice your annual budget is adequate. Our budget is \$13,500 based on 650 members. One resource says

if you have more than 2 years' of operating funds on hand, you have too much.

Savings for hosting the 2025 Big 10 Conference is \$26,663.43. Our goal for hosting in 2021 was \$25,000. We will probably need a little more to allow for increased costs by 2025. We are budgeting to add more before then.

The savings account for technology and programming expenses is \$1,753.57. Here is where we may come up short. We have recently reformatted our website with minimal expense, thanks to Karen Seda's expertise. However, expenses for hosting the website through Go Daddy will increase each year. If we can't find a qualified editor for the Clarion, we may need to hire someone to type and lay it out. Technology is spreading and we will need to keep up.

What are the conclusions of this Finance Chair?

- Our board has done an excellent job of working within our budget, even while postage expenses and other things have gone up. Members can assist in cutting our costs further by receiving their Clarions by email.
- 2. There is no proven need to increase our dues at this time. The University Club is a bargain! We have 8 monthly events and 30+ interest groups for members to choose from. Invite a friend or two to join us to get our membership back up to 700!
- We understand that luncheon costs are rising every year. The Club does not believe it is fair to all members to subsidize the cost of the luncheons for a few.

Our program expenses cover Fall Fair and the Style Show, and a minimal amount for table decorations, a small candy dessert, and the speaker's honorarium at our six other luncheons.


