## University President Barbara Wilson spoke at the Oct Luncheon

President Barbara Wilson was the guest speaker at The University Club of Iowa City's October luncheon. 161 club members and guests heard President Wilson speak. She shared that the University of Iowa is ranked #1 for the Undergraduate Nursing program in a Public University and #1 for the Writing program, the only public university in the top 10 and tied with Yale. This year, the University of Iowa has 30,042 enrolled students, from 94 of the 100 Counties in Iowa, 45 states and 94 countries. The 5-year strategic plan is to increase student enrollment to 33,000. The University of Iowa is rated #4 Nationally for women in leadership roles, 50% of the cabinet is female and 8 out of 12 Deans are female. 50% of Iowa students graduate with \$0 debt and the average Iowa student debt is \$28,841.

It was a great opportunity for us to meet President Wilson and for her to learn about our club and it's connection to the university.
