

## **Easter People**

For 40 years, the Jews wandered in the desert after their liberation from slavery in Egypt. We have now had over 400 days of lockdown. That is 10 Lents when you divide 400 days by 40 days! One a year is enough for me, but we have made it through a long desert experience!

At the end of their 40 year journey, the Jews had to struggle to come into the promised land. We are now looking at Easter –

the time of our "promised land." We are hoping for life as it used to be. Is that all resurrection is about? If we could have a re-do of our lives, do we really want only what it used to be? Or have we experienced some goodness during this lockdown time? Have we had the gift of time to do some of what we say we wanted to do? Or, in the end, did busyness fill our time? Is busyness a crutch or an excuse to sidetrack us from what is really important in our lives? Does "busy" give us a sense of needed purpose or importance?

We all have seen "busybodies" who expend energy that seems to go nowhere. None of us would want the label "busybody" attached to our names. So, as we prepare to re-enter a post lockdown time, some reflection on the word "busy" as it pertains to us may be insightful.

I have seen persons who came through treatment after a devastating case of cancer with a whole new sense of time. Their "resurrection" had them savor what they already had. They made different choices that focused on what really mattered. How do I really want to use my precious time? What will resurrection look like for me? How will I become one of the Easter people?

#### Creative possibilities

The sessions will be recorded, so the conferences can be played at a time suitable for you or your region. The conference schedule will be emailed to you later along with resources and the zoom link.

After a session, there will be an opportunity to be a part of a small group for reflection/ discussion. These will be randomly assigned so as to help us get to know each other better.

For people who prefer face-to-face interaction, any region may arrange to safely gather together at a designated location. If some tech expert links a computer to a large screen or TV, it would be another option for a group to watch and listen to the conferences together. Thus, you will have flexibility to shape the retreat/prayer time to meet your personal and local needs.

Father Bonacci provides extensive handouts, which will be emailed to you prior to the retreat.

He is happy for anyone to arrange to connect with him personally for spiritual direction/counseling.
