The US Lay Salvatorians met via Zoom with members of the International Community of the Divine Savior (ICDS)

General Committee on January 30. Anne Cullender from Australia participated although it was very early the next day for her. Such dedication! Others participated from Austria, Belgium, Columbia, Italy, United States and Venezuela. Also members from other branches of the Salvatorian family participated. Lay Salvatorians from the US had submitted questions to the General Committee earlier and these were answered by different General Committee members. What an opportunity for us to be in dialogue with one another across time and oceans. The feedback was positive. The current members of the General Committee are committed to increasing communications with the units in different countries. So be on the lookout for a future international gathering.

The proposed ICDS statues were accepted by the Dicastery; the next step is to obtain 'nihil obstat' from the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. This attests there is nothing in the statues that are contrary to doctrine or morals. As a part of the approval process, the US Lay Salvatorians must implement the "Safeguarding Minors and Vulnerable Persons Policy. Currently the members of the LSNB are working on the process to implement the policy.

The 2021 National Convocation was postponed until 2022. The new dates are June 9-12, 2022 at the Divine Mercy Retreat Center in Auburn, CA. Mark your calendars now so that we can gather again. We will be celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Lay Salvatorians!!!

The Lay Salvatorians finances are stable, and we are able to meet our 'fair share' obligations. One concern is the low level of contributions. Not all members contribute on a regular basis. Claire Williams, Treasurer, sends out reminders to members. Remember, we have responsibilities as well as rights as members. Any amount that you can donate is welcome to assure that we continue to meet our obligations to the Joint Leadership Group and to the International Community of the Divine Savior and to support the ministries of Lay Salvatorians.

Lay Salvatorians continued to be involved in a variety of ministries during the pandemic and are now beginning to engage more in activities at their parishes. There is a sense of hope of returning to gathering in person across the sectors.

## Financial Updates ~by Claire Williams, SDS

#### Greetings:

Our treasurer, Claire Williams, informed the Lay Salvatorian National Board that we currently have 143 members. However, only 35 members contributed this year either regularly or one time. As committed members, we have privileges and along with those privileges, there are responsibili-

ties. One of our responsibilities is to contribute to the financial stability of the Organization. As the growing branch of the family (around 50%), we have increasing responsibilities related to fair share for the Joint Leadership Group. For many years, JLG supported the Lay Salvatorians, now it is our turn to support them. Also, as a member of the International Community of the Divine Savior, we are asked to contribute a fair share to supporting the organization. This is important because several of the member countries are very poor and struggle to contribute their fair share.

Currently, we are asked to contribute \$25/ month. However, I understand this may be difficult for some members. Thus, prayerfully consider what amount you could donate. Any and all contributions are appreciated. In addition, these are a donation and so are taxdeductible.

If we want to continue to support Salvatorian ministries and activities, we need the funds to do that. As National Director, I am personally

As you know, the International Community of the Divine Savior (ICDS) has been working on getting approval from the Vatican as an "Association of the Faithful". The formal process started in 2006. The ICDS Statutes were sent to the "Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life" and were returned for required changes. We (General Committee of the ICDS) had a few face-to-



face meetings with the Dicastery and the document went back and forth a number of times as we attempted to satisfy their requirements. Recently we received word that our Statutes were accepted by the Dicastery. However, now they must be approved by the Congregation of the Faith: "The next step in order to proceed, is to obtain the 'nihil obstat' of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith: it must attest that there is nothing in the statutes that is

contrary to doctrine or morals." We are waiting for that currently. This formal recognition is very necessary for the Lay Salvatorians because many units of the Salvatorian Family around the world do not fully recognize the ICDS/Lay Salvatorians until we are "approved" by the Vatican. We are very fortunate to have the recognition that the Society and the Congregation give the Lay Salvatorians here in the USA! I am a firm believer that this was/is the plan of our founders...to include lay people. We all have the calling and mission to teach the goodness and kindness of The Savior in our daily lives.

We were also required to submit a plan for "Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adults".

We have done that and have asked the units to start implementing that plan. We had hoped to be "approved" before the beatification, but now we have no idea how long this next step will take. If I understand correctly, it took Fr. Jordan thirty years to be accepted by the Vatican, so maybe I need more patience! As always, I welcome any feedback to the ICDS. ~ Ken Drake ICDS General Committee
