Our Challenge as Salvatorians:

The Encounter consists of a four-week informal tour of Salvatorian life in the Dioceses of Dar es Salaam, Tunduro-Masasi and Morogoro. Participants will learn about the language, customs, culture, and the Church in Tanzania with readings, discussion, speakers and day trips.





The approximate cost is \$4,500.00, which covers airfare from Chicago, government visas, all land travel in Tanzania, workshops, Salvatorian guides, meals and lodgings.

More than a tour: Most Americans find it hard to imagine what daily life is like for people in developing countries. The Encounter will show you first-hand how ordinary people live, their struggles and triumphs, their joys, sorrows, and ordinary faith.

Participants must be 18 years of age or older and possess a current US Passport with at least six months of validity left on the passport from the last day of the experience. Medical vaccinations may be required.

Participants must be in good health, be able to walk on unsteady ground, climb into jeeps and carry their own suitcases. More information on health demands will be provided once interest in the Encounter is expressed.
