Remembering

September 11, 2001

Observed the first Monday in September, Labor Day is an annual celebration of the social and economic achievements of American workers. The holiday is rooted in the late nineteenth century, when labor activists pushed for a federal holiday to recognize the many contributions workers have made to America's strength, prosperity, and well-being.

Before it was a federal holiday, Labor Day was recognized by labor activists and individual states. After municipal ordinances were passed in 1885 and 1886, a movement developed to secure state legislation. New York was the first state to introduce a bill, but Oregon was the first to pass a law recognizing Labor Day, on February 21, 1887. By 1894, 23 more states had adopted the holiday, and on June 28, 1894, Congress passed an act making the first Monday in September of each year a legal holiday.

Who first proposed the holiday for workers? It's not entirely clear, but two workers can make a solid claim to the Founder of Labor Day title. Some records show that in 1882, Peter J. McGuire, general secretary of the Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners and a co-founder of the American Federation of Labor, suggested setting aside a day for a "general holiday for the laboring classes" to honor those "who from rude nature have delved and carved all the grandeur we behold."

Many Americans celebrate Labor Day with parades, picnics and parties – festivities very similar to those outlined by the first proposal for a holiday, which suggested that the day should be observed with – a street parade to exhibit "the strength and esprit de corps of the trade and labor organizations" of the community, followed by a festival for the recreation and amusement of the workers and their families. This became the pattern for the celebrations of Labor Day.

Re: Carrying Charge Increase effective October 1, 2024

Dear Members:

We have had some significant increases in operating and replacement costs over the past year which is requiring us to **increase our carrying charges by \$20 per unit per month** effective October 1 2024. *This effective date may differ for our members currently participating in the voucher housing assistance program. Notification requirements differ between 60 to 90 days. Please contact your housing authority to determine your effective date.

The most notable increases in operating expenses for 2024 include the following:

Increase in building liability insurance, an additional \$6,918

Increase in water and sewage rates \$20,000

Increase in replacement reserve funding for air conditioning, concrete, and other capital items 444,000

Unfortunately, we cannot find additional measures to offset these rising costs, and we must implement this increase.

The **new carrying charges** for each unit *effective October 1, 2024 are shown below:

September's name comes from the latin word septem, meaning "seven". This month had originally been the seventh month of the early Roman calendar.

- Make an effort to ensure that your screen doors are completely closed after entering/ exiting to avoid expensive repairs or replacements. We suggest locking the back storm door as it is used less frequently.
- Be reminded that the trees located on the Cooperative grounds are the property of Branford and damages resulting from climbing or other improper activities are prohibited and will be the responsibility of the member of record.
- Be sure to shut off the water supply to outdoor faucets using the shut offs located in the basement to avoid pipes bursting.
- No Heat in cold months is considered an emergency work order.
- Except for barbeque grills and patio furniture all other summer equipment such as bikes, toys, etc. must be removed from the patio or yard by November 15th of each year. Pull weeds and bring your lawn areas in compliance with policy as to make things easier for you next spring.
- Vehicles without current license plates, inoperable, improperly parked or stored on property will be sought out and ticketed.
 Fines may be issued or vehicles towed at the vehicle owner's expense that are found to be in violation.
- It is the members responsibility to change their furnace filter. We suggest checking it on a monthly basis and changing it when necessary to avoid damage to the furnace and unnecessary repairs. Filters are available in the office at no charge, so please pick one up next time you are in the office or when paying your carrying charge.

Important Reminders

Trash: Be reminded all trash MUST be placed in securely tied bags and placed inside dumpsters. Failure to comply may result in fines. Large items such as furniture/boxes **must be placed in the buik dumpster on Baker St.** Do not place furniture next to the bulk dumpster as this will result in a fine as well. Throw your bag to the back of an empty dumpster to allow those that come later room to place their garbage.

Emergency Work Orders: Members should call 313-292-4624 for emergency work orders after 5pm. An emergency is a condition that endangers human life or poses a serious danger to the property. This includes smoke detectors beeping (even for battery replacement) Please refer to your rules and regulations for more specific information.

Please be reminded that the speed limit within the Cooperative is 15 mph, Please be mindful and obey the posted speed limit. The Taylor Police Department has been given permission to issue tickets on the property. **Members found to be violating the speed limit will be fined \$100.**

PROHIBITION TO THE USE AND CULTIVATION OF MARIJUANA OR MEDI-CAL MARIJUANA

"Members, family members, and/or guests are prohibited from smoking marijuana or medical marijuana in or around the premises of their townhome. Members are also prohibited from the cultivation of marijuana. Such violations are considered a material violation of the Occupancy Agreement. This provision is pursuant to Michigan Statute MCL 333.26427 (C) (3)."

This policy can be found in both the Rules and Regulations and the Occupancy Agreement. We understand that members' may have a need and qualification for medical marijuana. However, the Cooperative is within its' right and within the law to prohibit **smoking** marijuana in units, outside of units or anywhere on Cooperative property. Forms of medical marijuana, that do NOT interfere with your neighbors right to enjoy their home, are permitted so long as a member of your household (as certified with the office) has a valid medical marijuana card. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation.
