Opening Story

Have you ever been picked last?

I remember those days in school when two captains stood in front of a group, taking turns choosing teammates. As each name was called, there were always a few of us standing there, hoping we wouldn't be the last ones left. Even as adults, we experience similar moments. We wonder if we're qualified enough for the promotion, talented enough for the opportunity, or capable enough to make a difference.

The truth is, many people spend their lives trying to earn acceptance. They believe if they work harder, accomplish more, or become more successful, they'll finally feel like they belong.

But God's kingdom doesn't operate that way.

Long before you achieved anything, God chose you.

Before you held a title, earned a degree, built a career, or even understood His grace, God had already set His love upon you. He didn't choose you because you were perfect. He chose you because He is gracious.

That truth changes everything.

When you understand that you are chosen by God, you stop living to impress people and start living to fulfill His purpose.

The Lesson

One of the greatest lies we believe is that our life is random.

The Bible tells a different story.

God is intentional.

He created you with gifts, experiences, opportunities, and even challenges that He can use for His glory.

Notice what Peter says. We are chosen so that we may proclaim His praises. God's choosing is always connected to His purpose. He doesn't simply rescue us from sin; He calls us into a life of influence, service, and faithful obedience.

Sometimes we think purpose means standing on a stage, writing a book, or leading a large organization.

Sometimes it does.

But more often, purpose looks much simpler.

Purpose is being a godly husband.

Purpose is raising children who know Christ.

Purpose is encouraging a coworker.

Purpose is serving faithfully in your local church.

Purpose is showing integrity when no one is watching.

Purpose is loving your neighbor.

The size of your platform does not determine the significance of your purpose.

Faithfulness does.

I've learned that God often prepares us through ordinary seasons before entrusting us with greater responsibilities. During my years in the Air Force, I couldn't see how every assignment, every challenge, and every lesson would one day shape my ministry. Looking back now, I can see God's hand weaving together experiences I never would have connected on my own.

The same is true for you.

The disappointments you've endured.

The victories you've celebrated.

The lessons you've learned.

None of them are wasted when they are surrendered to God.

He is preparing you to serve others in ways only you can.

Stop asking, "Why am I here?"

Instead ask, "Lord, how do You want to use me today?"

Purpose isn't something you eventually discover after years of searching.

It's something you begin living one act of obedience at a time.

Reflection Questions

- 1. Have you ever struggled to believe that God has a purpose for your life?**
- 2. What gifts, experiences, or opportunities has God already placed in your hands?**
- 3. Where might God be calling you to serve faithfully right now?**
- 4. How can you shift your focus from seeking recognition to seeking obedience?**

Take ten minutes today and write down five ways God has uniquely equipped you through your life experiences, abilities, or spiritual gifts.

Then ask Him to show you one practical way to use those gifts to serve someone this week.

Remember, purpose grows through obedience.

Use my life to point others to You, and help me live each day with the confidence that I am chosen for Your purposes.
