

Faithfulness in the Small Things

Theme: Building Godly Character

Key Scripture: *"He who is faithful in what is least is faithful also in much; and he who is unjust in what is least is unjust also in much."* — Luke 16:10 (NKJV)

Opening Story

During my military career, I learned that success in major assignments was often determined long before the mission ever began. It wasn't the big moments that made the difference—it was the countless small decisions that happened behind the scenes.

Equipment inspections, training exercises, paperwork, and routine responsibilities rarely attracted attention. No one celebrated the Airman who consistently showed up early or the leader who quietly ensured every detail was handled correctly. Yet when critical moments arrived, those same small acts of faithfulness determined whether the mission succeeded or failed.

Life with God works much the same way.

Many of us pray for greater opportunities, larger platforms, and bigger responsibilities, while overlooking the simple acts of obedience God has already placed in front of us. We want God to trust us with more, but we sometimes struggle to remain faithful with what we already have.

The truth is that God often prepares us for greater things through smaller things.

Never underestimate what God can do through a man who remains faithful in the little things.

The opportunities you pray for tomorrow may depend on your faithfulness today.
