Please read all regulations and entry information carefully. All participants and exhibitors are expected to comply.

Returned Check Fee: \$50 (A \$50 service charge will be applied on top of the bank fee for all returned checks NO EXCEPTIONS.)

Stabling: \$155 Per Stall

Stabling: \$35 Per Day/Per Stall Early - Must Get Permission From Show Manager

Box stalls and tack stalls are \$155 each for the weekend. Gates open Wednesday 10am. No stalls will be reserved without full payment. Stalls are on a first come, first serve basis. No stabling overnight in trailers. The Stabling Committee shall assign stabling and will consider the following factors, not necessarily in this order: Length of time the exhibitor has supported the Show and/or NEFHC. Degree of support of the Show, and/or NEFHC by the exhibitor, give due

regard to support by means of personal time & efforts, support by contribution of money and exhibition of horses. Stabling manager is John Lampropoulos. He can be reached at 603-770-1884 Initial bedding will not be supplied. Shavings may be purchased on your entry form.

Post Entry fee is \$25 per horse. Entries close June 10th, 2025

- Move Out: Move out must be completed by Sunday 6:00pm
- **No Smoking in the barn area.**
- Dogs must be kept on leash or tied and away from the show ring. Nuisance dogs or dogs with excessive barking will be asked to leave. Please clean up after your dog.
- All fire and emergency lanes must be kept open at all times.
- Six ribbons shall be awarded in all classes, unless otherwise noted.
- Refunds will only be made upon receipt of veterinarian's certificate (or Doctor's certificate). No refunds will be given on stalls, tack stalls or entry fees without a veterinarian's certificate. It must be received prior to the start of the show.
- Management reserves the right to refuse any entry or request the removal of any entry or person on the grounds without being liable.
- Management reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the Show.
- While the show is in progress, only authorized persons are permitted in the ring. Exhibitors who wish to approach the judge may do so when they have finished showing and only after obtaining permission from the show manager.
- HEALTH PAPERS: A copy of negative Coggins test for each horse or pony is required; 12 months for in-state equines and 6 months for out-of-state equines. Shot records for the current year are required to show proof of rabies and encephalitis. Office personnel will be checking all health papers. ** While it will not be mandatory, please refer to state guidelines for the requirement of health certificates for traveling across state lines. **
- A copy of your REGISTRATION PAPERS will be checked upon sign in. Please be sure to bring it with you.
- CAMPER space is offered on a first come, first serve basis. RV rate is \$225 weekend. NEFHC Members are eligible to receive \$10 off with proof of membership. Must be sent with entry and postmarked by June 12th, 2025 to receive a discount.
- Food will be available on the grounds.
- Removal of a bridle before unhitching a driving horse will be grounds for immediate elimination.
- ALL classes should be entered the session prior to scheduled class. (Ex: if you show in afternoon session, you must be signed up during in the morning session. If you sign up during the session of your class there will be a \$5 fee assessed per incidence.)
- If you need to scratch a class, it must be done prior to the start of the session the class is in.
- **There will be a \$15 Bandit Fee for showing in any class that the exhibitor/horse has not pre-entered. This fee is a PER instance.**

- To enter into Championship and stake classes exhibitor must have entered into appropriate qualifying class indicated in parentheses (#)
- Payouts on all \$100 added classes will be paid on vouchers that will be automatically redeemed on the show bill. Payouts will be as follows: 1st place \$30, 2nd place \$25, 3rd place \$20, 4th place \$15, 5th place \$10
- Payouts On \$1500 classes are as follows: 1st: \$750 2nd \$350 3rd \$200 4th \$100 5th \$50 6th \$50. Vouchers will be given out with ribbons to be redeemed on your show bill.
- Only licensed drivers may operate any motorized vehicles on grounds.
- All vehicles must be parked in areas designated by management. Parking will not be permitted in front of barns or in fire lanes. All horse trailers and vans must be parked in designated areas. Failure to comply will result in towing at the owner's expense.
- There will be no lunging or long lining in the show arena. All lunging and long lining must be done outside of the ring.
- The Show Committee and/or Management reserves the right to split any classes it deems necessary. It also reserves the right to cancel classes that do not meet a preset minimum number to qualify for further finals competition later in the season.
- Stallions are barred in classes restricted to Ladies and Junior Exhibitors, unless specifically allowed in that breed's regulations.
- Holds will not be permitted unless due to extenuating circumstances and must be cleared by the manager prior to the session start.

All Friesian classes will accept only purebred KFPS, FPZV, FHH, FBH, FSH Friesians or certified/registered Friesians. Each animal must show proof of registry. Friesian owners should refer to and follow Friesian rules posted on www.usef.org.

Class Specifications: To enter any championship class, you must have entered, shown, and been judged in the qualifying class noted in parenthesis (X).

FRIESIAN DIVISION

NEHC AA Rated

All Friesian classes will accept only purebred KFPS, FPZV, FHH, FBH, FSH Friesians or certified/registered Friesians. Each animal must show proof of registry. Friesian owners should refer to and follow Friesian rules posted on www.usef.org. Division NEHC and NHH&TA are rated AA except where noted ** indicates not NEHC rated. + indicated not NHH&TA rated.

To be shown by an amateur according to NEHC/USEF rules - No stallions will be allowed to enter

Horse classes will be judged at 60% on movement and 40% on conformation Classes will be judged 40% on movement and 40% on conformation and sport FR - 15 horse type, 10% on expression, manners, and willingness, and 10% on quality, balance, and harmony. No more than two handlers per horse shall be allowed in the ring. One whip per handler is allowed. **Per KFPS Horses are requested to not shave nose whiskers and ears and won't be penalized.*

FRIESIAN UNDER SADDLE CLASSES

71. \$100 Friesian Costume

To be shown at a walk and trot. Excessive speed is to be penalized. Exhibitors may be asked to halt & stand quietly on the rail. Light hand contact must be maintained. Exhibitors may show individually or in groups up to 5. Must be shown in a bridle or bosal. All saddles, side saddles, girths are permissible. Entry should display the horse & rider in any creative costume of choice. Exhibitors should dress in a manner consistent with their turnout. It will be at the Judge's discretion to decide if a Costume is unsafe & cause for elimination. No walkers are allowed. To be judged on creativity, suitability of costume to horse and rider and manner.

80. Friesian English Pleasure Saddleseat

244. \$100 Friesian English Pleasure Saddleseat Championship (80)

To be shown at a walk, animated trot, strong trot and canter. To be judged on movement natural to the horse, performance, presence, quality, type, manners and conformation.

259. Friesian Park Horse Under Saddle

All gaits must be performed with willingness and obvious ease, cadence, balance and smoothness. Park horses should be very animated with bold and expressive movement at all gaits. Artificial movement is to be severely penalized. Horse to show at an Animated Walk, Animated Trot & Canter. May be asked to back. {No Championship} **Country Horses may not cross enter into Park Horse.**

225 Friesian Pleasure Open Championship (165)

To be shown at a walk, trot, extended trot and canter. To be judged on movement natural to the horse, performance, presence, quality, type, manners and conformation.

73. Friesian English/Western Pleasure ATR (Open to all seats) ** +

257. Friesian English/Western ATR Championship ** + (73)

May be shown in English or Western. Open to amateur riders of any age. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on, manners, presence, performance and quality. (Open to Saddleseat, Hunt Seat, Western & Country)

83. Friesian Country Pleasure US

253. Friesian Country Pleasure US Championship (253)

To be shown at a walk, trot, strong trot and canter & hand gallop both ways of the ring. To be judged on, manners, presence, performance and quality. Entries in Friesian Country English Pleasure-Saddle Seat or Country Pleasure Driving are prohibited from competing in the following sections Friesian English Pleasure Saddle Seat, Park, Fine Harness and Show Pleasure Driving at the same competition; cross entries are permitted, however, between Friesian English Pleasure Saddle Seat, Park, Fine Harness and Show Pleasure Driving

154. Friesian Green Horse Pleasure WTC** +

248. Friesian Green Horse Pleasure WTC Championship ** +(198)

Open to horses in there first or or second year of showing. May be shown Hunt seat, Saddleseat or Western. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog, (No extended trot may be called for) canter or lope. To be judged on movement natural to the horse, performance, presence, quality, type, conformation, and manners. A Green Horse walk-trot-canter may enter the Green Horse classes and any other walk-trot-canter class. Green Riders are not allowed in a Green Horse Class.

70. Friesian Walk Trot ATR ** +

239. Friesian Walk Trot ATR Championship (70)

May be shown in English or Western. Open to amateur riders of any age. Horse and rider combinations may not show in any WTC class at the same show. To be shown at a walk and trot or jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on, manners, presence, performance and quality.

130. Friesian Jr Exhibitor WT Pleasure

153. Friesian Jr Exhibitor WT Pleasure Championship (130)

May be shown in English or Western. Open to Junior Exhibitor Riders. Horse and rider combinations may not show in any WTC class at the same show. to be shown at a walk and trot or jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on, manners, presence, performance and quality.

105. Friesian Junior Exhibitor Pleasure (All Seats) + **

192. Friesian Junior Exhibitor Pleasure Championship (All Seats) (105) + **

May be shown English or Western. Open to Junior riders 18 & under. To be shown at a walk and trot or jog, Canter or Lope, both ways of the ring. To be judged on, manners, presence, performance and quality.

160. Friesian English Pleasure Hunt Seat

223. \$100 Friesian English Pleasure Hunt Seat Championship (160)

To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop. Horses may be asked to extend any gait at the judge's discretion. To be judged on performance, manners, type, quality, and conformation. Proper Tack according to USEF Rules permitted. **No Bling Browband, proper hunter tack required.*

190. Friesian Green Horse Walk Trot Pleasure ** +

250. Friesian Green Horse Walk Trot Pleasure Championship** + (190)

Open to horse and rider in their first or second year of showing. May be shown Saddle Seat, Hunt Seat or Western. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog. To be judged on movement natural to the horse, performance, presence, quality, type, conformation and Manners. Walk Trot Green Horses may cross enter into any other green horse Walk Trot classes. Green Riders are not allowed to show in Green Horse classes.

144. Friesian Walk Trot Pleasure**+

262. Friesian Walk Trot Pleasure Championship** + (144)

May be shown in English or Western. No horse and rider combination may have shown in a class requiring a canter at the same competition. To be shown at a walk, trot or jog both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance, manners, presence and quality. Walk Trot Horses MAY NOT cross enter into WTC classes at the same show.

FRIESIAN DRIVING

Single, pairs or four in hand may be shown

164. Friesian Show Pleasure Driving Open

219. \$100 Friesian Show Pleasure Driving Open Championship (164)

To be shown at a walk, normal trot and strong trot both ways of the ring. Horses are to stand quietly and back readily. Headers are required. Horses must be shown to a Traditional Meadowbrooks or a two wheeled vehicle suitable to the horse such as traditional American show carts or road carts. Antiques, or reproduction carriages are not allowed. The horse must be shown in a correctly sized and fitted harness, with breast collar and vehicle suitable to the size of the horse, which is of the utmost importance for the safety of horses and exhibitors alike. One or 2 people per vehicle, as appropriate, is allowed. A whip In-Hand suitable to the vehicle is required. A knowledgeable adult driver must accompany junior drivers under fourteen years of age. Driving Attire: Drivers should dress according to the style of the present day. Dress for the driver should conform to the type of turnout. Dutch attire is permissible if suitable to the vehicle. Informal Saddle Seat Suit with matching tie, gloves and derby is appropriate for men and women. A suit & tie, sport coat & slacks with tie are acceptable for men. Coordinating hat is required. A tailored suit, blouse and skirt, dress, or slack and pants suit is acceptable for women. Coordinating hat is required. Entries are to be shown at a walk, normal trot, and strong trot both ways of the ring. Horses are to stand quietly and back readily. Classes are to be judged on manners, performance, type, quality, and conformation.

140. Friesian Show Pleasure Driving ATD

160. Friesian Show Pleasure Driving ATD Championship (140) To be shown at a walk, normal trot and strong trot both ways of the ring. Horses are to stand quietly and back readily. Headers are required. Horses must be shown to a Traditional Meadowbrooks or a two wheeled vehicle suitable to the horse such as traditional American show carts or road carts. Antiques, or reproduction carriages are not allowed. The horse must be shown in a correctly sized and fitted harness, with breast collar and vehicle suitable to the size of the horse, which is of the utmost importance for the safety of horses and exhibitors alike. One or 2 people per vehicle, as appropriate, is allowed. A whip In-Hand suitable to the vehicle is required. A knowledgeable adult driver must accompany junior drivers under fourteen years of age. Driving Attire: Drivers should dress according to the style of the present day. Dress for the driver should conform to the type of turnout. Dutch attire is permissible if suitable to the vehicle. Informal Saddle Seat Suit with matching tie, gloves and derby is appropriate for men and women. A suit & tie, sport coat & slacks with tie are acceptable for men. Coordinating hat is required. A tailored suit, blouse and skirt, dress, or slack and pants suit is acceptable for women. Coordinating hat is required. Entries are to be shown at a walk, normal trot, and strong trot both ways of the ring. Horses are to stand quietly and back readily. Classes are to be judged on manners, performance, type, quality, and conformation.

277. Friesian Carriage Driving Open Singles/Pairs** +

218. Friesian Carriage Driving Open Singles/Pairs Championship ** +(277) Two & Four Wheeled Carts Allowed. To be shown at the walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot. Horses are to stand quietly and back readily. Junior drivers under 14 years of age must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult. When there are passengers the driver should sit to the right hand side of the carriage. An appropriate driving whip shall be carried at all times. Failure to carry a whip in hand incurs elimination. One groom is required for a pair or tandem to assist in the event of difficulty. Drivers should strive to present an appropriate turnout. Wooden wheeled vehicles are traditional. Drivers should be dressed conservatively and should conform to the type of turnout. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s); 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle; and 10% on neatness of attire *No headers allowed in the ring. ★ ★

AMERICAN SADDLEBRED DIVISION

NEHC Rated & NHH&TA Rated A

In order to compete, all horses must be registered with the American Saddle Horse Association or the Canadian American Saddlebred Horse Registry. They must be entered in their fully registered names with registration numbers and under the names of the owner(s) of record with the ASHA or the CASHR. A copy of the registration papers showing proof of ownership, or a copy of the registration papers with a Certificate of Eligibility to Show issued by the American Saddlebred Horse Association must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry or presented to competition office before competition number will be released; competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement. CHAMPIONSHIPS WILL NOT BE STRIPPED.

An entry may drive Hors de Concours (HC) in any competition at the discretion of the organizer/manager. Whichever method is to be used, it must be clearly explained in the Omnibus/Prize List. 1. The class may be judged: a. As a separate class b. In conjunction with a specific class or classes or pleasure drives as designated by the organizer. c. By overall impression throughout the competition 2. The entry fee for the class remains the option of the Organizer, however, if the class is judged on an overall impression throughout the competition, it is recommended that no entry

fee be charged and all participants be eligible. 3. The organizer may invite a local dignitary or celebrity to act as an honorary judge, and a licensed judge may also be in the ring. 4. The essence of the competition is the word "Elegance." The winner will be the turnout which, in the opinion of the judge, presents the most elegant effect. This will include vehicle, harness, appointments, horse(s), driver, passengers, grooms, etc., but above all, general impression is most important. Vehicle and harness may be inspected to ensure thoughtful restoration and careful maintenance. Attention will be paid to the personal appearance of the driver, grooms, and passengers as it contributes to the overall picture. Period costumes are definitely prohibited, unless otherwise stated in the Omnibus/Prize List. Performance will not be judged unless it detracts from the elegance of the turnout. Singles or Pairs & Two or Four Wheel Carts allowed.

Dutch Harness Show Association Rules & Regulations

Basic Rules:

- Side check is optional to use, but no over check or martingale is allowed.
- Horses must be driven with Liverpool or similar style bit
- Must be even weight shoes. A single pad and/or double shoe is allowed.
- Horses manes must be braided
- Buggy must be a 4 wheeled viceroy or similar vehicle.
- Drivers, handlers, and headers must be neatly dressed and it is recommended that drivers wear a hat.
- Horses come in the ring clockwise, one at a time, make one round and line up. Judge will do confirmation and tack inspection. Horses will then show at the trot, 2x to the right, reverse and go the left until the judge calls in to the lineup, in order of placement. A workout of the top horses may be requested by the judge to determine final placing.
- Judges can excuse any horse from the class if they do not abide by the rules. -Judges will be selected by the committee, from a group of qualified personnel. -Any official KWPN judge will be allowed to judge in this association
- Points will be awarded to each horse based on their placing. In future seasons we hope to show horses in classes based on points accumulated instead of gender and age.
- Points will be awarded on this basis: 1st=10 points 2nd=8 points 3rd=6 points 4th=4 points 5th=2 points. Points will be awarded and recorded by the association.
- The horses must be registered with KWPN or ADHHA
- If you wish to show a horse with different or unknown pedigree the horses can be presented to the judges. If they are accepted by the judges based on association standards they will be admitted into the association and therefore are eligible to participate.
- The horses will be judged by the following standards:
- Horses must be a minimum height of 15.2 hands
- Has a rectangular-shaped body that is long-lined and well-proportioned -Trots with suppleness, impulsion, balance and self-carriage
- Has great suspension and a hindleg that steps actively under the body
- An elevated forehead and good self-carriage
- Is light-footed and has articulation of the joints, allowing the hind legs to step under the body enabling the foreleg to extend far from the shoulder with great elevation of the knees -A cooperative, keen, and honest temperament, with an eagerness to perform

Classes:

- Junior mares: This class is for 3 and 4 year old mares.
- Open mares: This class is for mares of any age
- Junior stallions/geldings: This class is for 3 and 4 year old stallions and geldings. -Open stallions/geldings: This class is for stallions and geldings of any age. -Honor Class: This class is open to mares, stallions and geldings of any age. Licensed and approved stallions must show in this class.

Additional class options:

- In hand: Horse to be shown in white bridle or halter. Horses will enter one at a time. They will stand in front of the judges to be judged on conformation, then the horses will walk to the rail and back to the judges. Then

the horses will make two clockwise laps around the ring at the trot. After making two laps the horse will exit the ring. After the last horse is presented all the horses will enter the ring at the same time, they will walk clockwise and await placing. One whip person allowed per entry. No bag whips allowed. Horses will be judged according to the standards listed above.

- Pair class: In addition to standards listed above the entry will also be judged on ability of the driver and horses ability to work together. Horses to be show on safe and appropriate four wheeled carriage.
- Tandem class: In addition to standards listed above the entry will also be judged on ability of the driver and horses ability to work together. Horses to be shown on safe and appropriate four wheeled carriage or two wheeled gig.
- Young riders class: Horses to be judged by standards listed above. This class is for drivers under the age of 21. In this class an adult is allowed to ride with the driver but is not required to.

ACADEMY DIVISION RULES

Riders in this division are students who are currently taking riding lessons and are to be judged on their basic riding skills. The age of the rider must be listed on the entry blank. Headers for Lead Line riders must be at least 18 years of age. Horses that are used are to be LESSON HORSES. Horses are not to be judged (See Horse Eligibility). Class splits will be made at the manager's discretion. There will be minimum holds allowed, please be prepared to enter the ring when the class is called. There will be a 2 minute gate call per class.

Rider Eligibility: A rider MAY NOT enter in any other division at the show. A rider who has shown in a regular division class or in a full riding suit at any show is prohibited from participating further in the Division, with the exception of the Show Rider Classes. Once a rider has competed at ANY level wearing a full suit, they are ineligible to compete in classes at any point thereafter. The rider can however compete in Show Rider Classes in the season(s) following the season in which the rider showed wearing a full suit.

Horse Eligibility: mounts must be Lesson Horses. A Lesson Horse is a horse or pony that is REGULARLY used in a lesson program to teach a number of different riders in any given week. Braiding is optional. There are no shoeing restrictions. Protective boots are permissible. Horses may cross-enter from the regular horse show to classes, provided these horses are School Horses as defined above. Mounts may be shown in a snaffle bridle (martingales allowed), Pelham, or full bridle. This division is open to all breeds of horses and Ponies.

Rider Attire: Helmets approved for horseback riding (not bicycle helmets) are MANDATORY for all exhibitors. Riders must wear appropriate boots.

Saddle Seat: Kentucky Jodhpurs, boots, shirt, and tie. Vest and gloves are optional. NO riding coats or derbies are allowed.

Hunt Seat: Hunter style jodhpurs, jodhpur boots or paddock boots, shirt and tie or choker, and helmets. Adults may wear breeches and boots. NO riding coats or derbies are allowed.

Western Seat: Western jeans or slim-fitting pants, long-sleeve shirt. Ties and chaps are optional. NO western hats are allowed.

Dressage schooling shows are conducted according to the USEF Rules for Dressage Competitions, with exceptions as noted here. A current copy of the USEF Rulebook where the most recent rule changes are highlighted in red is available on the [USEF website](http://www.usef.org):

Some of the most common questions pertaining to rules are explained briefly here:

- A simple snaffle, regular cavesson, flash, figure-eight or drop noseband are required. A noseband is required for dressage competitions unless prior approval to ride without one has been obtained. Twisted wire bits are not permitted. Refer to USEF Rules for Dressage #DR121: Saddlery and Equipment for a complete explanation of permitted saddlery and equipment as well as pictures of all permitted bits.
- Bandages, boots, blinders, martingales, draw reins, side reins, running reins or artificial devices are not permitted. Lunging with side reins and riding or lunging with boots, bandages, ear muffs or a running martingale is permitted only in the warm-up arena.
- Whips may be carried during a test, but may not exceed 47.2" (120 cm). Only one whip may be used during warm-up and must not exceed 47.2" (120 cm). Whips are not permitted in any championship classes.
- Riders may have a reader (except in final and championship classes); however, it is the rider's responsibility to know the test. Movements may be read only once. All FEI tests, including FEI Jr. tests, must be ridden from memory. Reference USEF Rule DR#122.
- Use of voice while riding your test is not permitted.

- Committing three course errors, leaving the arena during the test or marked lameness results in elimination.
- Riders may not show under a judge from whom they have received private or semi-private instruction within 30 days of the show. The conducting of clinics or assistance in group activities, such as Pony Clubs, unless individual instruction is given, will not be considered as instruction, coaching or tutoring. Should a rider choose to show, s/he will then be riding "Hors de Concours" (HC). His/her score will not count toward awards.
- Horses may not be entered in classes differing by more than one level at any one show. The number of classes entered must comply with the USEF rule limiting the total number of classes in which a horse may be ridden per day. Currently horses competing at 4th level and below may enter a maximum of 3 classes per day. Horses competing at the FEI level can enter a maximum of 2 classes per day. DSE, Quadrille and PDD classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day.
- A rider must enter the arena within 45 seconds of the judge's signal (usually a bell or a whistle).
- If jackets are excused, a shirt of conservative color, with sleeves, must be worn. Stock ties are to be removed and the shirt should be left open at the neck.
- The current USEF rule on Protective Headgear will be enforced at all shows.
- Smooth leather or leather like half-chaps may be worn if combined with matching colored paddock boots at all levels at schooling shows.


