

# Agriculture: Backbone of Louisiana's Economy

This publication tabulates the value of Louisiana agriculture in 2022. Agents and specialists of the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service, as well as other agencies – both private and public – compiled the data. Their analysis focuses on the animal, forestry, fisheries, plant and wildlife commodities that comprise our vital agricultural industry. Agricultural and natural resource industries contribute significantly to our state's economy with the potential for increased economic benefits and job creation through value-added processing in urban and rural communities throughout Louisiana.

The two biggest factors that influenced the 2022 production year for the Louisiana agricultural and forestry sectors were historic input prices and production costs along with excessive rainfall during critical harvest periods. Increased demand for inputs coupled with issues with transportation logistics and inflationary pressures helped push prices for most agricultural inputs sharply higher in 2022. While most input prices saw some level of increase in 2022, fuel and fertilizer prices likely had the biggest impact on overall profitability. Average prices for different fertilizers in 2022 increased from 33% to as high as 75% from the previous year. Likewise, diesel prices were sharply higher averaging more than 60% higher in 2022 versus 2021. With projections for historic input prices and production costs, much of the outlook for profitability for the agricultural sector was dependent on strong production levels in 2022. Coming off an unusually dry fall in 2021, early rains in 2022 helped to replenish soil moisture and created favorable conditions for planting and early crop development. However, for many areas of the state, a prolonged dry period from late spring into early summer created crop stresses and increased the need and demands for irrigation. Additional irrigation demand only helped to increase production costs that were already extremely high due to increased input costs. While the dry conditions that persisted did damper the productive outlook for many commodities, there was still some optimism for average yields. And for those commodities that were harvested earlier in the summer, yields were generally average to slightly below average. However, persistent and excessive rainfall began to hit most areas of the state in late July and early August and persisted through September, a critical harvest period for many of the state's agricultural commodities. More than 18 inches of rainfall fell within a seven-to-10-day period in some areas of the state creating significant harvest delays and harvest inefficiencies. Even in those areas in which rainfall totals were much more manageable, the persistent rainfall and the number of consecutive rainy days were enough to complicate and delay harvest and create significant quality issues.

Given the weather-related challenges faced in 2022, yields for most of the major row crop commodities in the state were down as compared to the previous year. Drought conditions in late spring and early summer created stresses for many commodities resulting in lower yield potential. And while rain came later in the summer, they were too late to help improve the yield prospects for most commodities. For commodities like corn and grain sorghum, the rains were too late to help their yields, but, fortunately, came after much of their harvest had been completed. So, while they did not have the full impact of the harvest delays and harvest inefficiencies, they did have the impacts of the drought and saw yields that were 8% and 5% below the previous year, respectively. For hay production, drought conditions early limited hay production as did excessive rainfall during July and August. And while drying conditions at the end of September and for the remainder of the fall allowed producers to make additional cuttings, it still did not prevent lower production in 2022 with yields estimated to be down about 11% from the previous year. For other commodities like cotton, soybeans and sweet potatoes, the rains did little to improve yield prospects and, in fact, created significant harvest delays and issues. Cotton lint yields were down more than 13% in 2022 as heavy rainfall impacted cotton boll set and development. Sweet potato yields were estimated to be down about 7% with harvest delays and quality impacts caused by the excessive rainfall. However, that reduction only tells a portion of the story for sweet potatoes. The number of acres that were abandoned due to quality impacts were over two times higher in 2022 than in 2021. Also, lower pack out percentages were reported for sweet potatoes marketed in the fresh market as quality impacts reduced marketability. Soybeans had a similar story to sweet potatoes. Soybean yields were estimated to be down 9% from the previous year. However, abandoned acres were more than double in 2022 than the level in 2021 and significant quality impacts resulted in producers receiving heavy prices discounts when marketing what soybeans they were able to harvest. The only major row crop commodity that experienced increased yields in 2022 was sugarcane. The rains in July, August and September were believed to help boost sugarcane tonnage prospects from those that existed based on the previous drought conditions. And while that rainfall created some challenges for sugarcane planting, once they stopped in late September, dry conditions persisted for the remainder of the sugarcane harvest helping to boost harvest efficiencies and sugar recovery. A hard freeze in December 2022 did result in reduced sugar production for later harvested sugarcane, but the tremendous production prior

to that helped offset any reduction caused by the freeze. The end result was sugar yields that were estimated at 8% higher than the previous year.

While the production year was a difficult one for many agricultural commodities, improving demand, tight supplies and inflationary pressures all helped to push prices sharply higher for most commodities. Demand prospects began to improve in 2022 as markets continued to rebound from the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. The stronger demand coupled with tight domestic and international supply conditions for many commodities helped to support higher prices. Finally, inflationary pressures began to push prices for all products higher. Prices for major row crop plant enterprises increased on average 26% in 2022 from 2021, ranging from a low of 12% (grain sorghum) to a high of 52% (hay). Prices for fruit enterprises were, on average, roughly 8% higher while prices for vegetable enterprise were about 7% higher, on average. Pecan prices were also higher in 2022 based on lower supplies and inflationary issues. It should be noted, however, that while prices were sharply higher for many commodities, these price improvements, in most cases, did not offset higher input prices and production costs. As such, while the total revenue generated by the agricultural industry was higher in 2022, it does not imply higher profitability.

Like plant enterprises, prices for much of the livestock sector were higher in 2022. Several enterprises saw significant year-over-year improvements in prices as strong demand coupled with tight supplies helped to support prices. The beef cattle sector was one that saw sharply higher prices. Prices in 2022 averaged roughly 14% higher across all classes of cattle marketed. The price improvement seen in 2022 was a continuation of improvements in prices as cattle inventory levels fell across the U.S. for a third consecutive year. Milk prices were also markedly higher in 2022, up by nearly 40% from the previous year. The poultry industry also saw sharply higher prices with broiler prices up by roughly 38% and edible egg prices up a whopping 200%. Supply issues with edible eggs created shortages throughout the country which resulted in historically high prices. Other poultry sectors (cull hens and breeder flocks) also experienced price increases in excess of 20%. Prices for swine were also higher in 2022, although at much lower levels. Prices were, on average, roughly 6% higher across all classes of swine marketed. For other livestock enterprises like horses and goats, along with some of the smaller enterprises (rabbits, quail, exotic animals), prices were generally flat in 2022. Sheep prices were the only livestock enterprise that experienced slightly lower prices in 2022 averaging about 10% lower across all classes of sheep.

Unlike the trend set by plant and livestock enterprises, prices for the fisheries and wildlife enterprises were much more mixed. Prices for most freshwater and marine fishery enterprises were higher in 2022 while many of the aquaculture enterprises were lower. Freshwater finfish, shrimp and crabs were all higher in 2022, all up more than 14% from the previous year. Oysters and soft-shelled crabs were also higher in 2022, up 5% and 17%, respectively. Other aquaculture enterprises were not as fortunate and saw lower prices. Crawfish prices were down roughly 7% in 2022 while catfish prices were down about 18%. In both instances, larger supplies are believed to have put some downward pressure on prices. Similarly, wild caught crawfish prices were also lower in 2022, down about 5% from the previous year. It should be remembered that the data for freshwater and marine fisheries represent the 2021 calendar. Given the data collection process used by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, the data always has a one-year lag. As such, the price increases shown in this report reflect the rebound in prices from the 2020 pandemic year to 2021. Finally, prices were stronger in 2022 for fur animals and wild caught alligators. Pelts were reported to be, on average, roughly 48% higher in 2022 than the previous year while wild caught alligator prices were up roughly 13%.

With the vast majority of the agricultural commodities in the state experiencing year-over-year increases in prices, the overall farm gate value of the state's food and fiber sector increased by 19% over the previous year and is one of the highest levels ever recorded. For each of the three broad categories of enterprises (plant, livestock, and fisheries and wildlife), gross farm values increased in 2021. The total gross farm value for all plant enterprises was up over 17% from 2021 and was one of the largest on record. Despite yield reductions for most of the major row crop commodities, price improvements more than offset the declines and resulted in higher revenue levels. Total gross farm value for livestock enterprises was up roughly 27% from the previous year, almost entirely due to sharply higher prices. And while prices for fisheries and wildlife enterprises were much more mixed than the other categories, sharp increases for freshwater and marine fisheries prices, coupled with a rebound in catch levels, helped to push the cumulative gross farm value for this category up roughly 9% from the previous year.

When the commodities produced by agricultural producers are cleaned, processed and packaged at the next stages of the marketing channel, these value-added activities create additional economic activity over and above that defined by the gross farm value. In 2022, these value-added activities were estimated to have an additional economic impact of \$6.2 billion. Taken together, the gross farm value and value-added activities were estimated to have a total economic impact of nearly \$13.9 billion. This represents nearly a 21% increase from 2021 and is one of the highest levels ever recorded. Given the level of economic activity that the state's agriculture, forestry, and fishery industries continue to generate each year, it is undeniable that they continue to be major contributors to the overall state's economy. Cutting-edge research

programs and extension education and outreach efforts of the LSU AgCenter remain critical to sustaining these economic benefits.

Many Louisiana communities depend on agriculture, forestry, fisheries and wildlife for local jobs and their economic well-being. However, for those who work in it day in and day out, agriculture, forestry and fisheries are far more than a business, a major job contributor and an economic engine. It truly is a way of life. Families have lived on many of these farms, forest lands or fishing villages for generations following a preferred way of life even though it means hard work, many hours, high risks and sometimes low incomes.

Each new production season has risks associated with commodity prices, trade agreements and higher input costs as well as uncertainty related to the weather. These conditions make the discovery and adoption of new agricultural technology developed by the LSU AgCenter more important than ever to our state's producers. Agriculture is a highly sophisticated segment of the national and world economy, becoming increasingly so every year. That is the reason we at the LSU AgCenter continue to support agriculture and consumers with factual information provided by a well-trained faculty of extension agents, specialists and research scientists.

Those of us in the LSU AgCenter, with its major branches of the Louisiana Cooperative Extension Service and the Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station, are proud to be part of Louisiana's agricultural industry, and we are committed to serving that industry and the citizens across the state of Louisiana in the years ahead.

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# Louisiana Summary

# Agricultural and Natural Resources 2022

The statistical information in this summary was compiled from estimates made by extension agents of the LSU AgCenter after consulting with agricultural agency representatives, agricultural and agribusiness leaders, and others and after study of various reports and resource materials. State specialists with the LSU AgCenter checked parish-level data for specific commodities to ensure accuracy and consistency of all production information. Final review of data was conducted by LSU AgCenter agricultural economist and project director Dr. Kurt Guidry in consultation with external sources, including state and federal statistical agencies. Any inquiries about the data in this publication should be directed to Dr. Kurt Guidry in the LSU AgCenter's Department of Agricultural Economics who oversees the process of gathering all information for the Louisiana Summary.

Although this material is reasonably accurate and can be used for planning and other general informational purposes, this is not the official document of agricultural data for the state. Official statistical data are gathered, summarized and published by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service, Delta Regional Field Office, 10800 Financial Centre Parkway, Suite 110, Little Rock, Arkansas, 72211. Reproduction or publication of information in this summary should acknowledge the Louisiana Summary as the source but indicate the unofficial nature of the statistics.

Gross farm value was calculated for each commodity, which in some cases included a value from natural resources and consequently may not represent income to farmers. Gross farm values were calculated using calendar-year, market-weighted, state-level average prices, when available. When state-level price information was unavailable, price information was used from adjacent states (Texas, Arkansas or Mississippi) or the nation. Primary sources for prices were USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA Agricultural Marketing Service, and USDA Economic Research Service. The gross farm value is an indicator of the commodity's contribution to economic activity in the state but is not an indicator of farm profits. Production costs greatly affect profit (or loss) for all commodities. Even when gross income increases over previous years, corresponding increases in production costs may decrease farm profits.

In the state summaries, the value added in cleaning, processing, packaging, marketing, and transporting commodities is an estimate of the total contribution of agriculture and natural resources to the state's economy. The state summary may not be an exact summation of all parish reports as adjustments may occur due to changes in average prices received or to accommodate information from other sources. In each parish table only commodities that were of commercial economic value in that parish this year were listed. In some instances, the number of producers or the number of acres in a parish were not available. An asterisk was used to avoid releasing confidential information when too few producers were present for that commodity. Within some commodity groups, such as grains, fruits and commercial vegetables, the total number of producers has been omitted because some producers grow several different crops within the group. Adding together the producers of individual crops would not give a true total for the group.

Gross farm income for all animal enterprises was over \$2.1 billion for 2022, up 26.7% from \$1.66 billion in 2021. Value-added was over \$1.37 billion for 2022, up from \$999.7 million in 2021. Total value of all animal enterprises in the Louisiana economy was \$3.48 billion, up 30.6% from \$2.66 billion in 2021.

## **Beef Cattle**

Despite historical cyclical trends seen in U.S. beef cattle inventories, the Louisiana beef cattle industry continued to maintain steady in beef cow numbers in 2022. Beef cow inventory numbers totaled an estimated 583,421 head, compared with 563,544 in 2021, illustrating that some producers were able to have a second year of slow regrowth. Looking at the previous two years, consistent with the normal 10-year beef cattle cycle, the 2020 production year saw modest liquidation in beef cattle numbers were reflected throughout the country. Subsequently, the 2021 production year brought an increase in market prices and herd size held steady within the state. 2022 then saw a slight rebuilding of herd size following stabilization in 2021. Furthermore, market prices continued to increase in 2022.

Louisiana remains a cow-calf state, with most of the cattle marketed during the year being calves weighing less than 700 pounds. This is evidenced by 72.5% of the 551,515 head of beef cattle marketed weighing less than 700 pounds. Increased market prices resulted in gross farm value increases across nearly all classes of beef cattle. Gross farm value of 214,014 steer calves sold in 2022 was an estimated \$167.6 million, an increase of approximately 1,502 head and \$19.6 million from the \$148.0 million reported in 2021. The estimated gross farm value of 185,613 heifers sold in 2022 was an estimated \$123.9 million, an increase of approximately 8,441 head and of \$19.1 million from the \$104.8 million reported in 2021.

For 2022, 58,241 yearling cattle weighing 600 to 800 pounds per head sold for an estimated \$54.2 million. This was an increase of 4,708 head and \$10.2 million from the previous year. Increases were also seen in the number of cow-calf pairs marketed. In 2022, 37,458 pairs sold for a gross value of \$40.9 million for an increase of 2,501 head and \$4.6 million from the previous year. In contrast, a very slight decrease was seen in the number of cull cows sold in 2022. This is consistent with producers working to build herd inventory back over 2021 and 2022. In 2022, 49,493 head of cull cows sold for a gross value of \$38.9 million. That is a decrease of 1,034 head but a gross value increase of \$15.7 million. Cull bulls were the only class of cattle showing a decrease in gross value for 2022 compared to 2021. In 2022, a total of 6,696 head of cull bulls sold for a gross value of \$6.4 million compared to 6,724 head selling for \$8.3 million in 2021.

Collectively, all classes of beef cattle marketed for a total gross farm value of \$432 million in 2022. This was a staggering increase of \$67.3 million compared to 2021. Such a large increase is primarily due to favorable market prices across all classes of cattle for the 2022 year, as well as increased cattle marketings due to larger herd size.

## **Dairy**

Milk production was reported by eight parishes in 2022. Three parishes in the southeastern part of the state and one parish in the northwestern part accounted for over 93% of the herds, cows and milk produced. The number of dairy farms increased from 65 in 2021 to 66 in 2022. The number of milking cows decreased from 8,317 head in 2021 to 7,670 head in 2022. Total milk production decreased from 123.3 million pounds in 2021 to 110.3 million pounds in 2022. Even though there was a 12.9-million-pound reduction in milk production in 2022, the gross farm value for milk increased by \$5.8 million primarily due to a 39.81% increase in milk prices.

The value of cull cows, bred heifers, mature cows, breeding age bulls and calves was about \$2,8 million. The total value of milk and animal sales to Louisiana dairy producers was \$30.8 million. Value added contributed nearly \$45 million more. The total economic contribution from dairying in Louisiana, including milk sales, animal sales and additional processing was almost \$75.8 million, an increase of \$15.0 million compared to the previous year.

Another component to the state's dairy industry has been the production of goat's milk. While small compared to the dairy cattle industry, dairy goat production has continued to be a viable industry in the state. In 2022 dairy goats were raised by 66 producers. A total of 641 does were reported to have been milked during 2022 producing slightly over 524,000 pounds of goat milk. Many of these producers are using goat milk to make soap, cheeses, lotion, cheesecakes, and pies. These products vary in price depending on the producer and the geographical location that they market their products. The gross farm income of the dairy goat industry was estimated at \$0.31 million in 2022, up from the \$0.24 million generated in 2021.

When combined, milk production from cattle, milk production from goats, and the sale of dairy cattle animals generated a gross farm value of \$31.1 million in 2022, up from the \$25.1 million generated in 2021. Value-added activities associated with the dairy industry contributed another \$50.1 million in economic activity to the state in 2022. Total economic activity (gross farm value plus value-added) of the Louisiana dairy (dairy cattle and goats) industry was estimated at \$81.2 million in 2022, up from \$65.4 million in 2021.

## **Horses**

The horse industry continues to be a significant component of the agricultural economy in Louisiana. The horse industry has traditionally been able to be categorized into three sectors: racing, show or competition, and recreational. In terms of number of horse owners, the breakdown of the industry in 2022 into these three sectors was 9% racing, 14% show or competition, and 77% recreational. In 2022, the breakdown of the horse industry by percentage of total gross farm value generated by each sector was 44% racing, 31.5% show or competition, and 24.5% recreational.

The state's racehorse industry in 2022 involved 1,578 breeders who owned 8,181 mares that produced 6,369 foals that sold for \$38.2 million. Breeders also owned 991 stallions that were bred to 8,764 mares, generating income from stud fees of \$21.9 million. The total gross farm value generated from racehorse production was \$60.2 million. An additional 2,006 racehorse owners had 10,578 racehorses in training or on the track in Louisiana, with a gross farm value of \$105.7 million. The gross farm value of the entire race sector (owners' and breeders' activities) of the horse industry in 2022 was \$165.9 million, not including receipts or fees from racing events or gaming.

The show and competition horse industry (horse shows, barrel racing, cutting, roping, team penning and others) includes 1,577 breeders who own 4,773 mares that produced 3,790 foals that sold for \$15.2 million during 2022. These breeders owned 616 stallions that bred with 2,678 mares, generating \$4 million in income from stud fees. The total income generated from show and competition horse production was \$19.2 million. Another 3,808 owners competed on their 13,361 horses, which had a gross farm value of \$100 million. The total gross farm value of the show and competition sector of the horse industry was \$119.4 million in 2022, not including the income generated from showing and associated activities.

A large portion of the horse industry, both in terms of owners and horses, is recreational. Horses have been used for comfort, exercise and enjoyment for quite some time. Approximately 9,679 recreational horse owners in Louisiana bred 22,272 mares and sold 16,903 foals during 2022 for \$18.5 million. These horse enthusiasts owned 2,470 stallions that were bred to 5,553 mares, generating income from stud fees of \$2.8 million. The total income from production in the recreational horse industry was \$21.4 million during 2022. Another 21,409 recreational horse owners have 47,544 horses valued at \$71.3 million – making the total economic contribution of the recreational horse industry \$92.7 million in 2022.

There was a total of 154,843 horses in Louisiana, owned by 40,057 people, with a gross farm value of \$378 million in 2022. Value-added activities contributed an additional \$41.6 million in 2022. Combining farm-gate value and value-added results in at total value for the horse sector of \$419.6 million in 2022.

In addition to the estimates of gross farm value and value-added activities, there are other potential impacts of the horse industry to the state's economy. First, the average horse owner has been reported to spend about \$4,000 to \$6,000 annually on items such as feed, tack, equipment, veterinary supplies and medicines. Second, the four racetracks in the state employ a large number of people and have been reported to generate expenditures of over \$1 billion annually. Finally, the show and competition industry conducts numerous events and activities each year and is estimated to generate \$200 million annually in expenditures. The American Horse Council suggests that the total economic impact of

horse production and these related activities like horse racing and competitions is in excess of \$3 billion annually for the state of Louisiana.

## **Poultry**

#### **Broilers and Eggs**

Poultry production continues to be the largest animal agricultural industry in Louisiana and is second only to forestry in total economic value for all agricultural commodities. In 2022, 650 Louisiana growers (small producers and commercial operations) produced 782.5 million pounds of broiler meat with a gross farm value of \$1.1 billion. While production in 2022 was down from 2021, a large increase in broiler prices resulted in gross farm value increasing by over \$264 million in 2022. Commercial broilers are produced in 11 parishes: Bienville, Claiborne, Jackson, Lincoln, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Sabine, Union, Vernon, Webster and Winn.

While broiler production is far and away the largest component of the poultry industry in the state, there are several other components that positively contribute to the state's economy. A total of 169 breeder flock producers in 2022 produced 14.9 million dozen hatching eggs with a gross farm value of \$52.2 million. A total of 81 pullet producers produced over 2.6 million pullets with a gross farm value of \$43.2 million. Finally, a total of 922 egg producers (small producers and commercial operations) had a total table egg production value of over 20.3 million dozen eggs valued at \$57.3 million.

When all the facets of the poultry industry are combined, the total gross farm value was estimated at \$1.26 billion 2022, up roughly \$362 million from 2020. The increase in 2022 was due to both large increases in production and prices. Large increases in production were seen in all sectors except for broilers. And while broiler production was marginally lower in 2022, large increases in prices for all sectors of the poultry industry led to large gross farm value. Value-added activities associated with poultry production added an additional \$1.22 billion in economic activity in the state, bringing the total economic impact of the poultry industry to \$2.48 billion in 2021.

#### Quail

Quail production in the state generally consists of smaller operations reaching niche markets. In 2022, a total of 17,570 quail were estimated to be produced and sold by 20 producers resulting in a gross farm value of \$70,280. Value-added activities associated with quail production provided an additional \$7,731 bringing the total economic contribution of the quail industry to \$78,011 in 2022.

## **Rabbits**

The production of rabbits for meat and exhibition involved 494 Louisiana producers during 2022. The rabbit industry produced a total estimated 51,332 pounds for sale in 2022, generating a total of \$161,384 in gross farm income. Of those totals, 29,296 pounds of production were from fryers and the remaining 22.036 pounds were from does. When the value-added activities of \$16,945 are combined with farm level income, the total economic impact of the industry in 2022 is estimated at \$178,329. This was a decrease of roughly \$15,000 from 2021.

# **Sheep and Goats**

Sheep and lambs and wool were produced by 420 producers in 30 Louisiana parishes during 2022, compared to 296 in 2021. This increase in the number of producers is credited to interest in raising hair sheep. The total number of lambs that were marketed (slaughter, feeder and club/ show lambs) was estimated to be 4,101 in 2022, down from 5,479 marketed in 2021. Producers also marketed 579 and 700 cull sheep in 2022 as compared to 410 stocker sheep and 677 cull sheep in 2021. Wool production from 2,091 sheep produced 9,604 pounds of wool which was up from 1,892 sheep and 9,226 pounds of wool in 2021. The total gross farm value of the sheep industry was estimated at \$1.3 million which is a decrease of approximately \$488,000 from 2021.

The Louisiana goat industry during 2022 consisted of an estimated 994 producers in 50 parishes, down from 1,034 producers in 2021. Total inventory of breeding-aged does was estimated at 11,546 does in 2022, down approximately 1200 head from 2021. Goat producers marketed a total of 7,242 slaughter goats valued at \$1.4 million in 2022. Stocker goats sold in 2022 numbered 3,971 with a value of \$1.1 million, a significant increase from 2021. There were 1,469 cull goats marketed in 2022 at a value of \$290,142. Goats sold as club or show goats numbered 1,225 head, valued at \$490,000. Gross farm value of goats sold in Louisiana during 2022 was \$3.3 million, up slightly from the \$3.2 million estimate in 2021.

## **Swine**

The Louisiana swine industry is primarily comprised of relatively small producers. In 2022, a total of 340 producers were estimated to have a total inventory of 2,314 sows with an average sow inventory per producer of roughly seven sows. Other than servicing a local or niche market, most of the swine production in the state is targeted to the show/club pig market. In 2022 a total of 2,018 show pigs were estimated to be sold with a gross farm value of \$807,200, representing roughly 50% of the total gross farm value generated by the swine industry. Sales of feeder pigs, slaughter hogs and culls represent the remaining 50% of the total gross farm value generated by the industry. In 2022, 4,604 feeder pigs were sold for an estimated value of \$179,059. Sales of 2,793 slaughter hogs generated a gross farm value of \$558,723 while the sale of 683 cull animals (sows and boars) generated a gross farm value of \$122,885.

When added together, the gross farm value of all classes of swine is estimated at \$1.67 million for 2022, down from \$1.79 million in 2021. Value-added activities associated with the swine industry are estimated at \$208,483, bringing the total economic impact of the industry to the state economy to \$1.88 million, down from \$1.96 million during the previous year.

## **Exotic Animals**

The exotic animal enterprises are a relatively small component of the total agricultural industry. The number of producers statewide was estimated at 47 in 2022, up from 44 in 2021. The total number of animals marketed increased from 573 in 2021 to 1,662 in 2022. Given higher marketings, total gross farm value was estimated at \$830,000 in 2022, up sharply from \$285,600 in 2020. When value-added activities added to gross farm value, the total economic impact was estimated at \$917,150, up from \$315,588 in 2021.

# Fisheries and Wildlife Enterprises

Total farm value of all fisheries and wildlife enterprises during 2022 was \$889.9 million, up over 8% from the \$817.8 million in 2021. Value-added in 2022 was \$616.4 million, up from \$554.3 million in the previous year. Total value of all fisheries and wildlife enterprises to the Louisiana economy for 2022 was \$1.51 billion, up roughly 10.6% from the \$1.36 billion in 2021.

# Aquaculture

Louisiana has long been recognized for supporting one of the most diverse aquaculture industries in the United States. Species and products such as crawfish, catfish, alligators, oysters, tilapia, baitfish, soft-shelled crawfish and crabs, ornamental fish, baby turtles, a variety of freshwater game fish and other minor species all have been commercialized successfully. Louisiana's producers continue to be among the leaders in the nation in crawfish, oyster, pet turtle and alligator sales.

Farm-raised crawfish continued to be the state's most valuable aquaculture sector in 2022, representing roughly 69% of the total gross farm value generated across all commercial aquaculture enterprises. Growth in demand, both within the state and regionally, has continued to foster expansion of acreage and production, and crawfish production has increasingly been incorporated in other farming operations in recent years as producers look to offset adverse conditions in rice markets. Estimates from the field in 2022 indicated farm-raised crawfish production occupied over 328,000 acres, up 10% from the previous year. Total production was 197.2 million pounds, an increase of 12%, despite the market chain

difficulties associated with the pandemic. Gross farm value increased to \$305.7 million in 2022, up significantly from \$292 million the previous year.

A total of 309,984 farmed alligators were harvested in 2022. Farm-raised alligators were once again the second-largest segment of Louisiana's aquaculture industry, with an estimated gross farm value of \$59.7 million. However, this reflected a continuing trend of lower production levels. Supply and demand imbalances in domestic and world markets, coupled with pandemic impacts, encouraged producers to take a cautious approach going forward.

Oyster production typically represents the third largest segment of Louisiana's aquaculture industry. The oyster production information reported in this summary represents a one-year lag. Information on Louisiana oyster harvests and sales is compiled by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries and provided to the National Marine Fisheries Service, but the final compilation of the data is not available until the middle of the following year. As such, data reported is for the 2021 calendar year. Oyster sales in 2021 bounced back to 1,035,270 sacks valued at \$52.9 million, both up almost 10% from the previous year.

While the remaining segments of Louisiana's aquaculture industry continue to provide positive economic impacts to the state, they are significantly smaller than crawfish, alligators, and oyster production. Pet turtle hatchling production of red-ear sliders continued to decline in 2022, but sales of more valuable species to foreign collectors and enthusiasts helped bolster total farm gate value. Many licensed turtle operations continue to be inactive at this time. Fish bait production continues to evolve to meet the demands of recreational fishers, with most production held in recirculating or flow-through systems prior to sale. In 2022, the estimated gross farm value of the fish bait industry was \$10.9 million, down slightly from the prior year. The minnow farming sector was virtually unchanged in both production and gross farm value. Recent increases in farmed catfish production and revenue continued in 2022, with 9.3 million pounds of production valued at \$12.1 million. Other aquaculture species include products such as game fish fingerlings, ornamental fish, soft-shell crabs and crawfish, and other minor species. Each of these commodities has a very limited number of producers.

Examining the economic impact across all commercial enterprises indicates that the total gross farm value of Louisiana aquaculture in 2022 was \$443.3 million, which was 12.2% higher than the previous year's total. Value-added multipliers associated with aquaculture product value chains (processing, boiling, shucking, packaging, etc.) contributed an additional \$299.6 million to the state's economy, bringing the total impact of Louisiana's commercial aquaculture to \$742.6 million in 2022. Additionally, over 137,000 private ponds are found throughout Louisiana, totaling almost 46,000 acres. Although these private ponds are not included in the 2022 state total for aquaculture, they do have positive economic impacts for recreation and enhancement of property values. These impacts have been calculated to exceed \$70 million for 2022.

## **Fisheries**

The harvest of freshwater and marine finfish and shellfish in Louisiana largely contributes to the state's agricultural economy. Fishery landings are recorded by two government agencies, both state and federal. The Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries receives monthly reports from the initial buyers (processors, dealers, etc.) who are required to record every transaction via trip tickets. Species weights and dockside sales values of the landings are reported for all commercially harvested species. The National Marine Fisheries Service is also responsible for estimating fisheries landings, using both regional National Marine Fisheries Service data collectors and Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries reports. The information reported here is from those two cooperating sources. All this data is provisional and subject to change.

The freshwater and marine fisheries data presented in the report this year (2022) reflect the calendar year 2021. The one-year lag is necessary to ensure data accuracy. Real-time reports on fisheries landings are not available until four months after the fact, and final data often runs six to 12 months behind. Estimating landings for the second half of the year based on landings reports from the first half is inaccurate. This method of reporting fisheries landings data has been in place since the 2004 Louisiana Summary; data prior to that volume may not be directly comparable to the data reported since 2004 because of using the different estimation methods. To compare state-level landings for years prior to 2004, on a calendar-year basis, please consult the US-NOAA-NMFS website.

One final caveat is that parish totals for fisheries landings will not equal the state total because of legal confidentiality requirements. When there are fewer than three sources in a parish that report landings of a fisheries commodity, the

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number of landings cannot be publicly released by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries without breaking confidentiality requirements. There may also be parishes reported in this volume for which no landings or values were provided by either of those agencies but for which there was catch. Furthermore, fisheries landings are reported for the parish in which the fish are offloaded – not the parish in which the boat and its crew may be domiciled or the parish where the catches were made. However, producer estimates are based on commercial licenses which are based on the fishermen's domicile.

#### 2021 Impacts

The COVID-19 pandemic still influenced all of the commercial fisheries as most traditional markets closed with the shutdown of restaurants, some retail, and other points of sale. Additionally, processing was shut down or limited for parts of the year, and the fisheries like shrimp and crab that rely on H2B visa workers for processing could not operate. Due to the pandemic, there was a decline in landings for every fishery. Following an incredibly active tropical storm season in 2020 (three major hurricanes hit Louisiana with Hurricanes Laura (end of August), Delta (mid-October) and Zeta (end of October) in addition to smaller tropical storms), Hurricane Ida hit the middle of the coast as the fourth major hurricane in 366 days. Ida hit the region of the state with the highest density of commercial fishing infrastructure. In addition to the destruction of sunken vessels, destroyed docks and processing, and local infrastructure for residents, each storm required days off the water as well as hurdles to going back out fishing with the amount of debris in the water. Cold storage also became a significant burden on the industry with large processors and dealers moving product to other states like Arkansas and Mississippi to find cold storage. This greatly limited buying.

#### Freshwater Fisheries

The freshwater finfish (in order of weight landed) are blue catfish, buffalo, gizzard shad, alligator gar, and channel catfish. As a whole, freshwater finfish hold a lower commercial value than marine finfish. Total freshwater finfish value has increased slightly from 2020 to 2021. Landing values in 2020 were \$4.5 million for 12.3 million pounds whereas landing values in 2021 were \$5.3 million for 12.5 million pounds. Landings marginally increased in 2021 by 200,000 pounds. However, the price per pound also increased from \$0.37 to \$0.42, resulting in increased fishery landings value. The total number of freshwater finfish producers increased by nine in 2021 from 1,911 to 1,920. In most cases, freshwater fish are less valuable than marine fish (excluding menhaden), and the freshwater finfish fishery (\$5.3 million in 2021 landings) is significantly less than the marine finfish fishery (\$68.9 million in 2021 landings).

Most of the parishes with wild crawfish landings are within the Atchafalaya Basin, aside from St. Tammany, where inflows from both the Mississippi and Red Rivers are controlled by the U.S Army Corp of Engineers. Wild crawfish compete with the farm raised crawfish in the markets and wild volumes are largely constrained by the floodwater events in the Atchafalaya basin. The difference is minimal; however, wild crawfish tend to be bigger in size and have a slightly different flavor due to their diet. In 2021, wild crawfish landings were up 31% from 2020 at 10.9 million pounds compared to 8.3 million pounds. Value was also up significantly at \$14.3 million from \$11.5 million, an increase of 25%. Crawfish average price per pound was \$1.31 over the season. The number of wild caught crawfish producers increased in 2021 relative to 2020 by 78.

Overall, landings from the freshwater fisheries sector had a gross value of \$19.6 million in 2021.

#### Marine Fisheries

Marine finfish landings for food are varied and complex, with about 50 different species being landed for a total of 568 million pounds in 2021. This was an 8% decrease from 2020, when 628 million pounds of marine finfish were landed in Louisiana. Beginning in 2020, menhaden were included in marine fisheries statistics when historically they have been kept separate. The volume of menhaden catch can represent up to 99% of the marine fish landings category but only 90% of the value. The 2021 value of marine finfish landings in Louisiana was \$68.9 million, which was a decrease from 2020 when landings were valued at \$80.7 million. With the exclusion of menhaden, the top five landed species were red snapper, non-menhaden herrings, black drum, sheepshead and king mackerel. By value, (also, excluding menhaden), the top five species were red snapper, black drum, yellowfin tuna, king mackerel, and swordfish. The aggregate price per pound for marine fish was \$0.12 which largely represents the price per pound for menhaden. This was largely unchanged from 2020 where the aggregate price per pound was \$0.13. The low price per pound reflects the value of menhaden as a non-food fish. While this fish is too small and oily to eat, it is used in a variety of different ways including fertilizers, animal feeds, omega-3 dietary supplements, cosmetics, as well as bait. The prices of these products are a function of the world supply of oils and meals.

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In 2021, 6.7 million pounds of oysters were harvested by 642 fishermen, or about 1 million sacks. This is an 88% increase from a historically low year in landings for 2020, where only 3.5 million pounds were landed, however it is still significantly lower than the normal landings of 13 to 14 million pounds. The poor oyster harvest can largely be attributed to the opening of the Bonnet Carré spillway twice in 2019 for over 100 days, and again in 2020 for 29 days resulting in widespread mortality on public and private leases in addition to the pandemic and the hurricanes. The Bonnet Carré spillway has only opened 15 times since 1937, and five of those openings occurred since 2016. In 2021, the price per pound for oysters was \$7.90 (\$51.08 per sack), an increase from \$7.52 in 2020 (\$48.65 per sack). To calculate prices per sack, an assumption of 6.47 pounds of shucked oyster meat per sack was used. The gross value of oysters harvested in 2021 was \$52.9 million, an increase of 97% from \$26.8 million in 2020.

Louisiana hard crab landings usually range from 40 to 50 million pounds annually made up of almost 100% blue crab with less than 0.1% of stone crab claws. Blue crab landings were just under 50 million pounds, fished by 2,389 license holders and valued at \$93.4 million in 2021. This was a 24% increase in landings from 39.8 million pounds and a 47% increase in value from \$63.4 million in 2020.

Peeler or buster crabs are blue crabs that are close to molting their shell. These crabs are sold to soft shell facilities to produce soft shell crab. For many years now, the soft-shell industry has been in decline. In 2020, 4,012 pounds of soft shell were produced. In 2021, 3,492 pounds were produced valued at \$28,190.

Louisiana shrimp landings in 2021 consisted of three species: white shrimp, brown shrimp and Atlantic seabob shrimp. Historically, Louisiana shrimp harvest landings and values have been split between white shrimp and brown shrimp (~50%) with a small fraction of landings represented by pink shrimp and seabobs (<1%). In 2021, the aggregate shrimp landings were 74 million pounds valued at \$130.6 million. This was an increase in landings from 2020 by 6% from 70 million pounds, but a large (32%) increase in the value from \$98.9 million. This increase in value was largely due to the 2020 pandemic reducing market price for shrimp. The price per pound was 19% higher in 2021 (\$1.76 per pound) relative to \$1.41 per pound in 2020.

In 2021, marine fisheries landings in Louisiana were valued at \$292.9 million, an increase from \$243.1 million in 2020.

## Fur

As reported by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, the total value of the 2021-2022 furbearer harvest was estimated at \$42,662, up from the estimated total value of \$26,410 reported in 2020-2021. This value represents total pelts across all species shipped out of state by fur dealers and individuals but does not include income associated with meat production from harvested furbearers.

The total number of trapping licenses sold increased from 3,127 reported in 2020-2021 to 3,180 reported in 2021-2022. The total number of pelts sold in 2021-2022 was 4,241, up from 3,899 pelts sold in 2020-2021. Over 95% of pelts were harvested from beaver (1,577), raccoons (937), otter (856), mink (511), and bobcat (208). The average price paid per pelt in 2020-2021 was \$8.41 (10-year average = \$11.09). In 2021-2022, the price paid per pelt across species (excluding skunks; zero reported) ranged from \$1.74 for opossum (five reported) to \$33.10 for bobcat.

The total number of nutria harvested during the 2021-2022 season was 203,824, which was down from 312,118 reported in 2020-2021. The total value of nutria harvested during 2021-2022 was estimated at \$1,222,944, down from \$1,872,708 estimated last year.

# **Hunting Lease Enterprises**

The value of recreational hunting in Louisiana is estimated by the income derived from hunting lease enterprises. The number of producers who leased land in the state during the 2021-2022 hunting season was estimated at 4,634, down from 4,963 reported during the 2020-2021 hunting season. The 2021-2022 figure consists of 3,296 individuals who leased their land for upland game hunting (primarily white-tailed deer and wild turkey) and 1,338 individuals who leased their land for waterfowl hunting.

In 2021-2022, approximately 4.7 million acres were leased for upland game hunting and approximately 1.5 million acres were leased for waterfowl hunting. Both estimates are down from the previous year when approximately 5.1 million

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acres were leased for upland game hunting and approximately 1.7 million acres were leased for waterfowl hunting. In 2021-2022, the estimated value for upland game hunting leases was approximately \$82.9 million and \$41.4 million for waterfowl, both down from the previous year. The estimated price per acre of leased land for hunting purposes remained unchanged in 2021-2022 at \$17.50 per acre for upland game and \$28.40 per acre for waterfowl.

## Honey

Beekeepers reported robust cash flow due to the desire for local honey. As citizens become aware of the importance of pollinators in agriculture, some seek to become hobby beekeepers. AgCenter agents refer aspiring apiarists to local bee clubs for classes. The anti-allergenic property of local honey is another reason many consumers state that they purchased local honey.

Small hive beetles and Varroa mites continue to be pests for commercial beekeepers. In general, beekeepers report lower numbers of small hive beetles (SHB) in their hives. Some apiarists are successfully treating with oxalic acid vapor. Sporadic infestations of wax moths occurred. Beekeepers are using IPM to manage bee pests. The USDA Agricultural Research Service's Bee Breeding and Physiology Laboratory is continuing to research bee pests with an emphasis on integrated pest management. Volunteer beekeepers are providing training in beekeeping through a basic program presented to bee clubs.

In 2022, the total number of hives were estimated at 32,590, down from 40,678 in 2021. The large reductions in hives over the last three years are believed to be primarily a result of the damage caused by the hurricanes that impacted the state over the last few years. Given the lower hive numbers, total honey production also declined in 2022 at 2.16 million pounds as compared to 2.63 million pounds in 2021. Despite the lower production levels, sharply higher prices on continued strong demand helped to push total gross farm value up in 2022 at \$5.27 million from the \$4.85 million value in 2021.

# **Plant Enterprises**

The gross farm value of all plant enterprises was roughly \$4.74 billion in 2022, an increase of 17.9% from the \$4.03 billion in 2021. Value added was \$4.21 billion for all plant commodities during 2022, up from \$3.50 billion in 2021. Total value of all plant crop enterprises to the Louisiana economy was \$8.95 billion in 2022, up from \$7.52 billion in 2021.

## Cotton

In 2022, 183,536 acres of cotton was harvested in the state of Louisiana which compares to 102,787 in 2021 and 163,029 acres in 2020. Approximately 56% of the acres in 2022 were irrigated. Yields across irrigated and dryland acres averaged 946 pounds of lint per acre which compares to 1,090 and 1,074 pounds of lint per acre in 2021 and 2020, respectively.

Gross farm value of cotton lint sales was \$156.3 million in 2022, with \$89.6 million from lint harvested on irrigated land and \$66.7 million from sales of lint harvested from non-irrigated land. Sales of cotton seed contributed an additional \$52.8 million. Gross farm value of all cotton sales was \$209.1 million, with value added contributing \$52.3 million, so the total value of cotton production in 2022 was \$261.4 million.

## **Feed Grains**

In 2022, there were 466,067 acres of feed grains harvested in the state, down roughly 130,000 acres from the 596,219 harvested in 2021. Both corn and grain sorghum acres were down in 2022 while oat acres were up marginally. Harvested acres of corn decreased from 542,373 in 2021 to 434,445 in 2022. Grain sorghum also experienced a decrease going from large increase going from 50,098 harvested acres in 2021 to roughly 26,780 acres in 2022. While representing much smaller acreages, oats did experience an increase during the year moving from roughly 748 acres in

2021 to over 1,000 acres (1,032) in 2022. Sharply higher fuel and fertilizer in 2022 was believed for shifting feed grain acres to alternative crops, primarily soybeans.

Higher commodity prices helped to offset the lower feed grain acres and the lower yields caused by excessive rainfall during the summer and early fall in 2022. Total gross farm value for feed grains was \$549.8 million in 2022. While this was down nearly \$60 million from the previous year, it remained significant despite the overall lower production levels. Value-added for feed grains was estimated to be \$96.2 million in 2022. When combined with the gross farm value, the total value of feed grain production in Louisiana was estimated to be \$646.0 million in 2021, down from the \$714.5 million level in 2021.

#### Corn

There were 443,445 acres of corn harvested in 2022 which compares to 545,373 in 2021, and 482,638 in 2020. Corn yields in 2022 averaged 174.9 bushels per acre which is below the 2021 crop that averaged roughly 190 bushels per acre. Approximately 70% of the corn acres were produced on irrigated land in 2022. For the past five years, corn yields in Louisiana have averaged 178.6 bushels per acre.

Gross farm value of corn production in 2022 was \$535.6 million, down from the 2021 value of \$583.3 million. This decrease in value of corn production in the state was due to a combination of decreased harvested acres and lower grain yields, which negatively affected the gross value.

#### **Grain Sorghum**

In 2022, 26,780 acres of grain sorghum were harvested throughout the state. This compares to 50,097 acres harvested in 2021 and 7,834 acres harvested in 2020. Grain sorghum yields in 2022 averaged roughly 78 bushels per acre which compares to 82.4 and 86.0 bushels per acre in 2021 and 2020, respectively.

The gross farm value of grain sorghum production in 2022 was roughly \$14 million, down from \$24.6 million in 2021, mainly due to decreased harvested acres, which negatively affected the gross value.

#### Oats

In 2022, eight producers planted 1,473 acres of oats in the state, compared to 748 acres in 2020. Despite some abandonment and/or acreage used for purposes other than grain production, harvested acres in 2022 still resulted in an increase over the previous year. A total of 1,033 acres were harvested in 2022 as compared to 748 acres in 2021. Yields averaged 42.3 per acre in 2022, down from 54.4 per acre in 2021. Despite the lower yields, total production in 2022 was up from the previous year due to larger acreages. Total production was estimated at 43,699 bushels in 2022 as compared to 40,643 in 2021. Larger production and sharply higher commodity prices led to a large increase in gross farm value. The gross farm value for oats was estimated at \$237,284 in 2022, up from 152,819 in 2021.

## **Forestry**

The timber industry in Louisiana continued its recovery in 2022 after weathering a difficult period over the past few years. The influx of new investment in Louisiana's timber processing capacity that began in 2021 has now gradually come online, allowing Louisiana to increase its timber harvest in 2022 to 27 million tons compared to 23 million tons in 2021.

The year was marked by still-elevated inflation and high mortgage rate conditions that threaten to slow activity for key lumber and timber end-users. Therefore, timber market conditions in 2021 were largely sustained through the whole 2022. Pine sawtimber rose from \$25.94 per ton to \$26.41, while oak sawtimber climbed from \$43.20 to \$43.81. Mixed hardwood sawtimber posted a sizable jump versus the prior year, gaining from \$32.83 per ton in 2021 to \$33.85 per ton in 2022. Pine pulpwood experienced a small price decrease as higher logging activity resulted in more supply, declining from \$8.21 per ton to \$8.05. Meanwhile, hardwood pulpwood prices remained stable at \$8.80 per ton, maintaining consistency between 2021 and 2022.

A bright spot amid the uncertain economic climate facing Louisiana's forest industry has been a stabilization and rebound in the labor market. Although Forestry and Logging witnessed a decline, dropping by 6% and shedding 146 jobs, there were modest expansions in both wood product manufacturing and paper manufacturing. Specifically, wood product manufacturing saw an addition of 300 jobs, marking a 4% increase, while paper manufacturing added 58 jobs, reflecting a 1% increase in Louisiana.

Looking ahead, the outlook for Louisiana's timber industry in 2023 and beyond remains cautiously optimistic. The state has been steadily increasing its stake in the North American softwood lumber production market. With well-established and thriving markets, abundant timber resources, and notably competitive prices for pine sawtimber, Louisiana maintains its attractiveness as a prime destination for ongoing investment opportunities.

## **Fruit Crops**

Commercial fruit production usually occurs on a smaller scale in Louisiana but there are some emerging larger producers. Producers grow both temperature and semi-tropical crops. Some growers are planting a variety of fruiting plants to ensure multiple harvest times throughout the year and expanding agrotourism appeal. In 2022, commercial fruit crops were harvested on roughly 1,842 acres. Gross farm value for commercial fruit production, combining both small fruit and tree fruit crops, was \$33.6 million in 2022. The three crops that bring in the most revenue are citrus at a gross farm value of \$5.8 million, strawberries at a gross farm value of \$10.2 million and blueberries at a gross farm value of \$9.1 million.

Citrus production is concentrated in the lower portions of Louisiana, where freezing temperatures are uncommon. The citrus industry is highly impacted by both freezes and hurricanes. Citrus growers primarily produce satsumas, an easy to peel sweet fruit, followed by navels and then a wide variety of other citrus crops. There are several diseases that are extremely detrimental to the citrus industry, namely citrus greening and canker. Homeowner citrus in more northern parts of the growing range has been on the decline due to numerous hard freeze events. This has increased consumer demand for citrus fruit and trees in that range.

Strawberries are a high value fruit crop that are hand harvested and extremely perishable. Berries are field packed, cooled and then sent to the end user. Most growers are focusing on local markets selling to local restaurants, farm stands, farmers markets and independent grocery retailers. Strawberries remain a popular crop within Louisiana marketed heavily by individual growers. Strawberry production is primarily concentrated in Tangipahoa and Livingston parishes. Increasing disease pressure has caused some producers to reduce their scale or stop production completely.

Commercial blueberry production occurs in the northern part of the state, notably in Caddo, DeSoto and Moorehouse parishes. Blueberries are grown for both local retail sale and wholesale processing within Louisiana.

Two other notable fruit crops that are emerging in popularity and production in Louisiana are blackberries and mayhaws. Blackberries had a gross farm value of \$3.2 million, and mayhaws had a gross farm value of \$2.2 million in 2022.

The LSU AgCenter is committing itself to strengthen county agent knowledge of small fruit crops. The LSU AgCenter is part of the Southern Region Small Fruit Consortium efforts to train county agents in production practices of grapes, muscadines, blue and blackberries, strawberries, and raspberries (all categorized as small fruit crops).

# **Commercial Greenhouse Vegetables**

Greenhouse production of vegetable crops offers Louisiana growers almost yearlong environmental control to optimize vegetable production. The summer months July and August can be challenging to produce crops in greenhouses and typically result in high cooling bills. But the growth rate of lettuce, tomatoes and cucumbers per square foot is unbelievable. If you are willing to maintain the structure, you will be amazed at the amount of produce you can grow in a small area as compared to field crop production. If building a greenhouse is too expensive, Louisiana growers may consider constructing a high tunnel. A high tunnel is in essence a greenhouse where you plant in the ground rather than in bagged culture or hydroponic systems. The Natural Resources Conservation Service offers the Louisiana Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQUIP) to help cover partial costs of high tunnel construction for Louisiana vegetable

farmers. High tunnels provide growers with season extension. High tunnels allow producers to start warm season crops several months early and get to the market early, or to extend warm season crops into the winter because the high tunnel provides several degrees of protection from winter conditions.

There are not many greenhouse vegetable producers in Louisiana and the market is open for more. The three main crops grown in Louisiana greenhouses include tomatoes, cucumbers, and lettuce (categorized most often as other). Estimated Gross Farm Values of greenhouse production in Louisiana are \$4 million (tomatoes), \$36,000 (cucumbers), and \$82,000 (other- most notably lettuce).

## **Hay Sold**

Hay production for commercial sales is a limited part of the total hay production in Louisiana. Nevertheless, hay produced from 199 acres of alfalfa and 361,484 acres of grasslands was sold by 3,664 producers in 2022. Yields averaged 2.4 tons per acre from the grasslands harvested for sale and 5.5 tons per acre from the alfalfa harvested for sale. Production included 854,312 tons of grass hay and 1,090 tons of alfalfa hay. Compared to numbers reported in 2021, the acreage of grasslands used for commercial hay production decreased by 1.1%.

Weather conditions were conducive for optimum hay production during the early part of the growing season in 2022. However, drought conditions were present in the central and northern regions of the state in the late-summer and had a negative impact on hay production for the remainder of 2022. Gross farm value of all hay sales, including some minor alfalfa production, was \$134.6 million, which was an increase of 33% from the previous year. This increase in gross farm value for hay production was primarily due to a sharp increase in hay prices in 2022 in response to much higher production costs.

## **Home Vegetable Gardens**

In typical years the number of home gardens fluctuates greatly with people's interest and the economy. When economic conditions are weak there tends to be additional interest in producing their own food in the face of rising food costs. Also, with the conditions created by the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 and 2021, there was a renewed interest in home gardens. The National Gardening Association found that 19 million new gardeners were gained during the pandemic.

Vegetable gardening not only provides food but is also reported to reduce stress and provide a mental break from the day. Research conducted by the U.S. Department of Agriculture indicated approximately 1 in 3 households have some kind of garden, including backyard fruit trees, vegetable plots, berry patches, etc.

With this assumption of a garden for 1 in every 3 households, a methodology based on parish population data was developed to estimate the number of gardens in each parish of the state. Louisiana population in 2021 was estimated at 4.59 million people. Assuming 2.6 people in every household, the total number of households in the state is approximately 1.77 million. Further, assuming roughly 35% of the households have home gardens, translates in a total of roughly 618,000 home gardens in the state. Based on the USDA study, the average value of a home garden was roughly \$525 in 2008. Using annual price changes of a mix of vegetable and fruits that would be believed to be grown in the typical Louisiana home garden, that estimated value from 2008 is adjusted annually to estimate a current value of home gardens. For 2022, the estimated value of a home garden was calculated at \$611. Given these assumptions, the estimated gross farm value of home vegetable gardens was estimated at \$377.6 million.

# **Nursery Crops**

The commercial nursery industry in Louisiana is primarily focused on woody ornamentals (trees and shrubs), floriculture and bedding plants, foliage crops and some fruit and nut tree nursery stock production. In 2020, commercial nursery crop production in Louisiana had a record year in sales, with expansion of housing causing a demand for plants, plus a necessary replanting after catastrophic storms and floods. The pandemic contributed to estimates of well over 15 million new gardeners nationwide. Moreover, during stay-at-home orders of 2020, many Louisiana residents put time,

effort, and money into landscapes causing a major influx of customers and purchasing. With the nursery industry being declared "essential" the industry was able to take full advantage of the increase in spending. Heavy rains, hard freezes and hurricanes hit the ornamental production area in 2020.

These growth trends continued into 2021 and now into 2022. While 2022 did not have the extreme weather conditions of the previous two years, a continued strength in demand along with inflationary price impacts helped to move the total value of sales across the horticultural sector by an additional 2% over the previous year.

### **Peanuts**

In 2022, seven producers planted and harvested 1,939 acres of peanuts compared to four producers and 2,585 acres in 2021. Yields averaged 4,392 and 4,821 pounds per acre in 2022 and 2021, respectively. Excessive rainfall during much of the late summer and early fall impacted both the quality and quantity of many agricultural commodities. As a result, total production was down significantly in 2022 (8.5 million pounds) as compared to 2021 (12.5 million pounds). In addition to the adverse weather conditions, soilborne disease (stem rot) pressure continued to plague peanut fields and increased input cost associated with fungicide applications.

## **Pecans**

The 2022 harvest is estimated at 5.7 million pounds. This is down from the 6.2 million pounds estimated in 2021. Some of this reduction is from fewer native pecans being sold due to lower wholesale prices. The 2022 pecan production season was also the "off" phase of the alternate bearing cycle for much of the state. This meant that Elliot production was significantly less than in the previous season of 2021 where it was its "on" cycle. Pecans are starting to experience several "off" years in some pecan selections and portions of the state due to unfavorable production conditions. Dry weather conditions increased production of several cultivars, like Candy, that have recently been less productive because of pecan scab. The drier conditions significantly reduced disease pressure this year but may have a negative effect on yield next year.

The production of improved cultivars decreased in 2022, at about 3.2 million pounds, compared to 3.6 million pounds in 2021. Native trees continued to reduce their market share in 2022 with 2.5 million pounds being reported compared to 2.6 in 2021. Overall wholesale prices for pecans slightly increased in 2022. Wholesale prices in 2022 varied greatly between native (\$0.76 per pound) and improved pecans (\$1.42 per pound). The wholesale prices for improved pecans were often dependent on orchard management practices and cultivar selection. Wholesale prices for native pecans are often dependent on their commercial viability.

Commercial pecan production contributed to Louisiana with an estimated total gross farm value of \$6.5 million in 2022; an increase from an estimated \$5.8 million in 2021. This increase was due to the slight increase in wholesale prices since overall production was less than in 2021.

Improved orchards are predominately located in the central and northern parts of the state with native trees dominating production in southern Louisiana. Most modern plantings are of improved cultivars. As certain cultivars fall out of favor, they can occasionally fall within the native production category in management and commercial viability. Significant native production occurs in Texas, Oklahoma and Louisiana. Generally, over one-half of the improved variety acreage in Louisiana is managed to control diseases, insect pests and weeds. With low wholesale prices more producers are moving to low-input practices over high-input management. Most new plantings of improved pecan cultivars are focusing on lower input selections that can still be productive with less intensive management practices.

## Rice

Louisiana planted over 405,000 acres in 2022. The Rice Variety by Parish Survey conducted annually by extension agents indicated that Louisiana planted approximately 87% long grain, 12% medium grain and 1% special purpose rice varieties. Some of the top planted rice varieties and hybrids in 2022 were PVLO3 (19%), Cheniere (12%), CLL17 (10%), RT7321 (9%), Mermentau (8%), DG 263 L (6%), Jupiter (6%), Titan (5%), and RTv7231 MA (5%).

In 2022, the statewide rice average yield was estimated at 6,753 pounds per acre (41.7 barrels or 150.1 bushels per acre), down slightly from 6,944 pounds per acre in 2021. With yield being down roughly 2.7% and with acreage being relatively flat total production was down just over 2%. A total of 27.29 million hundredweights of rice was produced on 404,164 harvested acres in 2021. The gross farm value in 2021 for rice produced was \$436.2 million, up from \$383 million in 2021. When value-added activities of \$145.2 million are considered, the total economic impact of the rice industry was estimated at \$581.4 million, up from \$510.5 million in 2021.

## **Sod and Turfgrass Production**

During 2022, sod was produced by 14 Louisiana sod farmers on 2,385 acres of fine turfgrasses, compared with 12 sod producers farming 2,970 acres in 2021. Despite a slight increase in the number of producers, total production acreage continued a declining trend experienced over the last several years. This contraction in acreage may be linked to the lack of available labor and increased production cost. About 60% of the sod acreage in Louisiana is centipedegrass and about one-third is St. Augustinegrass. The remaining acreage is divided among hybrid bermudagrass and zoysia. Zoysia demand has increased over the last several years and remains as more trouble-free alternative to St. Augustinegrass and centipedegrass. Shipping costs are always a major component in the eventual price of sod. Out-of-state sod farms remained a major competitor for our Louisiana producers, especially in the southern Louisiana market.

The gross farm value of sod and turfgrass sales in 2022 was estimated to be \$16.9 million, down from \$22.1 million in 2021. This reduction in gross farm value is directly attributable to the contraction of the industry that occurred in 2022. Value-added activities for turfgrass production were estimated at \$12.7 million, so the total value of sod and turfgrass production in Louisiana during 2022 was \$29.7 million.

## **Soybeans**

In 2022, 1.25 million acres of soybean were planted by 1,827 producers. A total of 1.21 million acres were harvested with an average yield of 49.9 bushels per acre. The total production for soybeans in 2022 was 60.25 million bushels. In 2022, there was an increase of 1.78 million bushels of soybeans produced compared to the 2021 cropping season. At \$13.99 per bushel, the average unit price for soybeans in 2022 increased \$2.14 per bushel from 2021. There was a good start to the 2022 soybean production season with 59% of the crop planted by May 1. The crop condition was favorable on June 12 with 87% of the crop rated as good or excellent. Heat and drought stress caused the crop condition to decrease to 70% good to excellent by the beginning of August. The weather pattern shifted in August and September bringing continuous rainfall for many days which caused excessive damage to mature soybean seeds. By Sept. 25, only 20% of the crop was rated as good to excellent.

## Sugarcane

In 2022, sugarcane was grown on 512,050 acres in 24 Louisiana parishes. An estimated 476,207 acres were available for harvest for sugar. The 11 operating raw sugar factories in the state processed 17,094,218 tons of sugarcane. The average yield of cane produced from each harvested acre was 36.0 tons/acre. The average sugar recovery at the 11 raw sugar factories was 233 pounds of sugar (96° pol) per ton of cane. The yield of commercially recoverable sugar produced per harvested acre was approximately 8,337 pounds.

The 2022 sugarcane growing season had an early start with above average temperatures for February and March. Rainfall was near normal for the spring. Spring cultivation, herbicide applications, and fertilization were made in a timely fashion. Sugarcane brown rust levels were moderate, and the rust levels were higher in the southernmost growing regions. In the northern growing parishes, early summer rainfall was deficient, and those growers that could irrigate the cane crop did so. By early August, rainfall returned to all areas of the state. Populations of the Mexican rice borer (MRB) continued to increase and move eastward. MRB was the predominate stalk borer on the west side of the Atchafalaya basin.

Above normal rainfall in August delayed planting. Unlike 2020 and 2021, the Louisiana sugar industry was spared of any tropical storms. The crop remained erect for most of the planting and harvest season. There were reports of severe lodging with HoCP 14-885. More growers switched to billet planting in 2022.

Most of the 2022 harvest season was dry, which had a beneficial effect on sugar recovery. The dry weather also allowed for some post-harvest cultivation and plowing out of fields for replanting. Fallow fields were precision graded and rows pulled up.

A severe freeze occurred from Dec. 23-26, 2022, when the harvest was about 83% completed. Stalks were split and deterioration was evident throughout the remainder of the harvest. Sugar recovery decreased and molasses production increased. Alma and Sterling raw sugar factories processed cane until Jan. 21, 2023.

## **Sweet Potatoes**

Louisiana sweet potato planted acreage for 2022 was estimated at 7,024.4 acres. This was a slight decrease from the 2021 acreage of 7,118 acres. Weather conditions at harvest prohibited some acreage from being harvested. Estimated acreage unharvested was 731 acres for the 2022 season. Yields for total production were still strong with the statewide average at 472 bushels per acre. Sweet potatoes production has a significant positive impact on the Louisiana agricultural economy. In 2022, the farm gate value of sweet potatoes was estimated at \$52.4 million. Louisiana ranks fourth in production among the states. Major producing states in order of production are North Carolina, Mississippi, California, Louisiana and Arkansas. Most of the commercial production in Louisiana is in the northern parishes of West Carroll, Franklin, Morehouse and Richland. In the southern parishes production is in Acadia, Avoyelles, Evangeline and St Landry. Major varieties produced in the state are Beauregard, Orleans and Bayou Belle. The LSU AgCenter sweet potato breeding program continues to work on developing and releasing newer varieties that enhance yield, does will in storage, improved pest resistance, enhanced taste and texture and attractive to consumers.

Louisiana markets sweet potatoes either through fresh market or the processing market. There are no canning facilities in close enough proximity to purchase canner potatoes from Louisiana producers. The processing market utilizes about 50% of the state production to make sweet potato fries and the remaining 50% goes to fresh market outlets.

The bedding and planting season had mixed weather conditions. The temperature in late June was hotter than normal thus stressing plants and affecting survivability of later plantings. Conditions became dry during the growing season. Late season weather patterns moved into the state causing excessive rain and field flooding just as early harvest was beginning. This resulted in a significant portion of the acreage experiencing field rot. There was another dry period during the harvest season that caused concern with harvest conditions and impacted later potatoes on sizing up. Quality became a concern because of the weather conditions.

# Vegetables, Commercial

Louisiana vegetable producers are a diverse hard-working group of people. Farm size varies greatly throughout the state. Part-time and full-time growers earn livable wages on farms ranging from an acre to several hundred acres. Most Louisiana vegetable farms are 5-10 acres in size. Small farms are generally family run and operated while larger farms employ outside H2A labor. Because of Louisianas mild climate, growers can plant and harvest over 40 types of vegetable crops and within those crops, many cultivars of each type. You'll find Louisiana-grown vegetables for sale at roadside stands, farmers markets, Community Supported Agriculture subscriptions, direct from the farm, and at local grocery stores. Several Louisiana growers are also supplying fresh produce to food banks in New Orleans and Alexandria because of a robust grant program the food banks have received to purchase local produce.

2022 was relatively mild weather-wise. Louisiana vegetable growers had normal levels of rainfall and typical heat in the spring and summer months. The cool season is when the vegetable industry was challenged. The winter of 2022 came very quickly. Overnight temperatures dropped from the 80's to just above freezing in the southern portion of the state to below freezing in the northern portion. Many of our cool season crops were severely damaged. Usually cole crops such as cabbage, mustard, broccoli, cauliflower, kale and more can withstand a light frost. However, the 2022 rapid temperature fluctuations caused collapse of the inner cells and total devastation in crops like cabbage where we normally see little to no damage from winter temperatures. Louisiana vegetable producers kept on planting and made good yields despite this set back.

In 2022, the total gross farm value of all vegetable crops was estimated at \$58.8 million, up from 41.7 million in 2021. This significant increase was a function of both increased production as well as significantly stronger prices. The top five

vegetable crops in 2022 in terms of gross farm value were field tomatoes at \$15.9 million, pumpkins at \$9.4 million, watermelons at \$7.8 million, southern peas at \$3.3 million and okra at \$3.2 million.

## Wheat

There were 109 producers that planted 41,832 acres in 2022. This compares to 90 producers and 26,350 acres in 2021. Generally favorable weather conditions during the growing and harvest season resulted in a strong yield of 60.5 bushels per acre, up from 59.4 bushels in 2021. Gross farm value for wheat was estimated at \$23.4 million in 2022 as compared to \$10.1 million in 2021. Increased acreage and production along with higher wheat prices helped drive the gross farm value significantly higher in 2022.
