# **DISTRICT**

District Manager Matt McMahon reported on the following:

The MASCD Winter Meeting was held February 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> in Annapolis. Greg, Janet, Jamie, and Kim attended the

meeting on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, where Governor Moore's proposed budget was discussed at length. There was particular concern over no funds being included for the MACS program.

The office has gotten over 70 applications for the PT secretary position. Matt already rejected 22 who were clearly not qualified, and 13 have been put on the 'short list'. Applications will be accepted until February 18<sup>th</sup>, after which the list will be paired down for interviews.

The dates for the 2025 Carroll Envirothon are March 11 for Instruction Day, and April 15 for Competition Day. All station reps have reported back that they will be participating. Advisors from all the high schools have responded except for FSK High.

The University of Maryland Soil Judging Team won the regional competition and is seeking donations to offset the cost of traveling to the National Contest. Board Supervisor Greg Dell made a motion to donate \$500. Board Supervisor Janet O'Meara seconded, and the motion passed.

# <u>MDA</u>

District Manager Matt McMahon reported that Addis Tekle has been offered and accepted the vacant MDA technician position in Carroll County and will be starting February 19<sup>th</sup>.

# **NRCS**

District Conservationist Sam Cox gave the following update:

# **State Office Updates**

- Initial financial assistance allocation was about \$31 million. IRA funding is paused until April 20, 2025.
- Farm Bill funding allocations about \$15-20 million we're able to obligate (CSP, EQIP, RCPP)
- Ranking deadline of February 14<sup>th</sup> for first round applications and preapprovals by February 28th
- IRA contracts already obligated are on pause to issue payments or do modifications. 35 contracts in Carroll. Participants contacted via phone call by the office.
- Continuing Resolution ends March 14, 2025

# **Technical Assistance**

- CREP 2025 and 2026 re-enrollment work being done with MD DNR and the staff
- Quality Assurance Review was completed in Baltimore County and I will share action items, corrections and commendable with staff in Carroll to help improve our efficiency and continuity of technical and financial assistance between the two offices.

## **Financial Assistance Programs**

- NWQI- applications preapproved in Little Pipe Creek. Awaiting Preapprovals for Prettyboy
- Payment rates for practices were raised with the locality pay. As a result, we are seeing contracts meet the \$450,000 program caps
- Contract Annual Reminder Letters- sent reminding participants their requirements to complete practices per their contracts.

# Office Administration

- Telework for NRCS employees will be revoked starting 2/18 as a result of executive orders.
- We have received numerous requests for remote workers to report to our field office but nobody has been placed. These requests have been elevated through FSA and NRCS state offices

- Lease for the building was renewed. Partnership is asking for total repainting and total carpet replacement since it's the original carpet.
- Upcoming Meetings and Trainings
  - o Frederick Soil Health Day February 26<sup>th</sup> at New Midway Firehall
- Special Projects- cancelled Carroll Soil Health Day training that was scheduled for February 20<sup>th</sup> as a result of pause on IRA funding. Will reschedule for January 2025.
