# How Did My Westie Passion Begin?

Given the following circumstances, it strikes me that owning a Westie would be inevitable. Some background is needed to understand my first awareness of a Westie. In 1975, I was married to a British RAF officer, Geoff, whom I met in Goose Bay, Labrador. We met when I was teaching science to students of USAF families who were stationed in Goose Bay. At the end of my first year of teaching in about 1974, Geoff and I flew to England to visit his sister in Sussex. I saw my first Westie there and she was named Penny. I loved Penny immediately—as you can appreciate, how could I resist the perky ears, wagging tail, the Westie enthusiasm, and sense of humor? I fell under the spell...

After duty in Goose Bay, we flew back to Seattle to settle in Bellevue and begin anew. I soon began my search for our first Westie, which of course involved scanning the newspaper want ads. There I found my Westie (later called my “newspaper Westie”). As I learned later, it was not the best place to begin. Her name was “Tuppence,” like “two pence”—in recognition of the first Penny I had met!

For keeping my pup clean, the breeder suggested I use chalk powder—I did...and I later learned that it was not the best way to accomplish the task. But of course, I was so proud of her and decided to enter her in a local dog show at Marymoor Park in Redmond. It happened that Tuppence was the ONLY Westie who had entered, so I happily received the Best of Breed award—a handsome, but small, silver cup atop a small wooden base. Clearly, I was on my way to having to build a special shelf for all her trophies!

Since I had absolutely no idea about grooming, I just sprinkled cornstarch or chalk powder in her coat to whiten it, brushed it out, then patted clouds of white stuff from her coat. Results in future shows were not so encouraging. Finally, after her performance in a Vancouver, BC, show, the judge gently told me that I probably would not win a lot of trophies in the breed ring but suggested I consider obedience competition. Immediately, I found a good obedience class instructor and Tuppence was on her way. After that, Tuppy and I won several ribbons in the obedience ring!

Fortunately, while at the Vancouver show, I met Tom and Thelma Adams (Roseneath Kennel in Penticton), who explained how to REALLY select a show-worthy Westie...I was hooked! Tom and Thelma became wonderful friends, always willing to provide advice about breeding and raising Westies who would be good breed representatives. They were so helpful!

Meanwhile, back in Bellevue, we had met other local Westie enthusiasts at various shows and decided to form a Westie Club. After a few years and lots of Westie events, our club became a sanctioned breed club as you have it now. We put in many hours of writing, advertising, sponsoring events, selling Westy t-shirts, building a financial base, then staging “sanctioned events,” before we were considered an “official” club, which you have now!

A few of the original founders have passed away...those of us remaining are so happy you are taking good care of it! Thank you!

I have told this story about my Westie Molly many times since I retired from teaching. But I was asked to write this article so now all of you can hear our story.

I adopted Molly from Seattle Purebred Dog Rescue when she was 6 months old. At the time, I was teaching in a special program for 18–21-year-old students with learning disabilities. I told my fellow teachers and teaching assistants that I would like to bring her to school as she was still being trained. I brought her crate with us, so she had a place to sleep or feel safe. I kept the crate in my office.

The first day she came to school she was a little excited and a little cautious as it was a new place. There was a big field outside our portable classroom, so she had a place to get potty trained and learn commands like Come, Stay, Sit etc. She was a fast learner and enjoyed her time outside.

But what she really enjoyed was her time inside with the students. We had two groups of students every day. When they came in, she greeted them all. And it turned out that she seemed to know which student needed her attention. One student that had Aspergers syndrome was always quiet. Molly went to him each day and laid by him. She greeted the other students also, individually. She had turned into a therapy dog! She was always calm but greeted everyone with a big smile and wagging tail.

In my last year before retirement a student came to us who was in a wheelchair. Molly had never seen a wheelchair; she took one look and then jumped up on the student's lap! It shocked me but brought a huge smile to the student's face! She made him feel welcome to our class.

Molly was a very special Westie, and I miss her every day. Our dogs and other pets are members of our family and it is hard when they cross that Rainbow Bridge. Thank goodness for all the memories they leave with us.




## Spring Terrier Dog Show in the Works
