

## **Product Reviews**

#### Zesty Paws Allergy & Immune Bites - Karin Parish



My dog has had crusty bumps on her skin for the past several years. The bumps are similar to scabs, but they don't seem to go away. A groomer friend of mine said her mini schnauzers have something similar.

So, I went to Chewy.com and decided to order some Zesty Paws Allergy & Immune Bites, lamb flavor, one treat for a 25 pound dog. I just started using it four days ago and already the bumps are disappearing! If your dog is itchy and it's not fleas, I suggest you might try it. I have no idea why I chose this brand other than it had the most "stars" on the review. \$32/90 chews.

#### Itchy Paws and How We Solved It - Melinda Heller

My westie, two year old Hilda, developed itchy paws and chewed off her fur. She also had pink patches on her belly. I planned a four point regimen to try and resolve this myself before allergy testing. And it worked! For now, two months in, we are itch-free.

- #1) Restricted diet. Salmon and fish based kibble. No chicken per my vet.
- #2) Dr. Google advised Omega 3 vitamins and supplements.

#3) Therapeutic weekly baths with chlorhexidine shampoo. (By the way, that is what we RNs use in the hospital to wash our hands.)

#4) If that didn't work I was prepared to do the RAST allergy testing at online sites, and there are many. <u>Five Strands</u> is one of them. Some sites want hair samples, some want saliva. This route is a much less expensive option than visiting the dermatologist vet.

Hilda's fur and skin are fully recovered. I did not need to proceed to step #4. Here are the products I used: <u>Ketowell Vetwell Shampoo</u>, and <u>TrizCHLOR4 Shampoo</u>. TrizCHLOR4 has twice as much chlorhexidine as Vetwell and costs twice as much. We use both. The supplements we use are <u>Soothe Skin and Coat</u> chews. All of these products are available at Chewy.com.

I hope this article relieves westie distress.


