A Reminder from CAMCO Regarding Detention Basins

The community of Walden is required by governmental regulation to control the flow of storm water through and from the land. Within the Walden planned community, storm water detention basins are located on the Common Land. Detention Basins are NOT to be used as a dumping ground. This goes for trash as well as branches, lawn clippings, etc. Such activity interferes with the proper functioning of the detention basins.



SILVER SPRING TOWNSHIP NEWS

Fall is here and there are some events in October and November to close out the year in the Township:

- Fall Fest (October 4th) 10am to 4pm at Stony Ridge Park
- Costume Crawl (October 27th) 6pm at Stony Ridge Park
- Winter's Night (December 10th) 6pm to 9pm at the New Kingstown Fire Co.

The fence around Paul Walters Park has been taken down except in those areas, such as the rock pile, which might be dangerous. Development at the park is still scheduled for up to a year from now as various amenities are added. The next phase of the park is slated to include construction of trails, landscaping, and installation of basketball and pickleball courts. However, as this work is based on, in part, grants from the State, it may take longer than expected as grant money from the State has slowed down.

A presentation was given by residents regarding proposed regulations that would integrate warehouses and related industrial areas into the residential areas of the township by increasing setback distances (the distance between buildings and adjacent land), regulating light & noise, and requiring barriers such as woodland to be included in new construction. The Board of Supervisors is considering these regulations for



A new feature covering the rules and regulations of the Walden

hundreds of feet of sidewalk and 2 entrances and exits, the Walden community presents many opportunities for accidents. The Safety Committee was created to review current conditions and make recommendations to the Walden Neighborhood Association (WNA) Board resident safety and accessibility. Recently, recommendation from the Safety Committee, the WNA Board adopted traffic regulations, which were sent by CAMCO to all homeowners and registered tenants in the community. The Board has adopted updates to the WNA parking and speed limit policy to address ongoing concerns and improve traffic flow. **New Speed Limit:** Effective immediately, the speed limit



throughout the neighborhood has been reduced from 25 mph to **20 mph**. This change is intended to improve safety for all residents, especially children and pedestrians. New speed limit signs have been installed throughout Walden. **Note that the speed limit in the alleys remains 15 mph.

Walden Neighborhood Appearance Control Board (NACB)

CAMCO Management reviews the submitted applications for architectural changes to ensure they are complete and then provides the completed submissions to the NACB to verify that the project is consistent with the standards and appearance of Walden set forth in the Walden Guidelines for Architecturally Controlled Improvements. The NACB conducts a thorough review of the project and application. NACB members are appointed to a one-year term. Review and approval of all Architecturally Controlled Improvements shall be vested solely in the NACB. The Board has 3 members. These members do not need to be Unit owners, tenants, or residents of the Walden Community. A member may also be a member of the Walden Neighborhood Executive Board. Each calendar year, the members of the NACB are appointed for a term of 1 year for the remainder of the then current calendar year by the members of the Walden Neighborhood Executive Board. The NACB members chosen in 2025 will remain in place throughout the remainder of the year. If you are interested in being considered for this position for 2026, please contact Simone at

Walden Neighborhood Association Executive Board is responsible for maintaining, replacing and repairing when required all of the Common Facilities and for maintaining the Controlled Facilities The WNA Executive Board is made up of 9 members representing 4 classifications of Units in Walden: (2) Detached Dwelling (Single Family),(3) Interior Space (residents above Crossroads), (2) Attached Dwelling (Townhomes) and (2) Tract Units (commercial spaces). Each term is 3 years and members are elected by the homeowners of Walden in accordance with the Bylaws of the Association. The Tract Units automatically renew with Charter. The Executive Board will be constituted and organized and will operate in accordance with the Bylaws of the Association.

WNA Executive Board Roles and Terms

President: Jeff McCombie (Term expires 2026)

Detached Dwelling Solely Residential Unit

Vice President: Will Dando (Term expires in 2028)
Interior Space Unit (Rep)
