MEET 'N TWEET: THE HOUSE FINCH

Today we shine a spotlight on one of the modest background characters at the bird feeder: the House Finch. They may not be the flashiest birds, but they are certainly the most abundant! In fact, they can be found all over the United States, from coast to coast.

House Finches initially lived only on the west coast until pet dealers brought them over in 1940, trying to sell them as "Hollywood Finches." They were released in Long Island and spread from there. Eastern House Finches have actually evolved differently from their western counterparts! Our finches have longer wings more suited to migration. They even have their own "accents" based on where they live!

Female House Finches are plain brown while males sport a red crown and chest. The redder the plumage, the more attractive they are to the opposite gender. The male will also feed the female seeds in order to win her heart (because the fastest way there is through the stomach).

Finches are strict vegetarians, which is why you will often spot them at



your feeders. They also drink up to 40% of their body weight in water on days. summer Consider putting out a birdbath to help your feathered buddies stay hydrated!

Sadly, House Finches have been dealing with an eye disease pandemic for many years. It is easily spread between birds at feeders and birdbaths. If you spot a finch with swollen eyes that sickly or appears please disinfect or put away your feeders for a while, to keep the rest of the flock safe.

SILVER SPRING TOWNSHIP NEWS

Spring is here, and township activity is blooming like the flowers we are starting to see! First up is **Paul Walters Park** which, as you probably noticed, is still fenced in. While most of the grading work is complete, there are still the next steps of putting in the amenities, which should be happening this year. The full park fencing is scheduled to come down as soon as the existing seed takes hold, (likely mid-spring, according to the parks director), allowing access to the playground and older parts of the park near Carlisle Pike. However, individual sections of the park will be fenced off to install individual amenities such as the sports courts and wild area. This work is enabled by a Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) grant; the total work will be around \$1.65 million dollars. Sadly, this funding may not be enough to

The township's Land Preservation Review (LPR) Board presented a report at the Board of Supervisor's meeting. The LPR Board is tasked with using the 0.1% income tax increase voted in several years ago, which is earmarked for preserving rural land throughout the Township, and is required to submit an annual report regarding progress. The LPR Board has been working to preserve land and has just surpassed 1,000 acres in land purchased for preservation.

fund the dog park amenity that was presented in a previous newsletter.

Across the township, there are several items that may concern Walden residents. The bridge on Hempt Road just south of the high school was completed at the end of the year and is now open to traffic. There are several new businesses opening soon, including Silver Scoop Ice Cream (they have set up the old diner on Carlisle Pike in New Kingston), J. Crew next to the LL Bean in Silver Spring Square, and the Costco under construction which is expected to open in the fall.

The daffodils are in full bloom at the entrances to Walden Way, Tavern House Hill Road, and at the entrance to Walden Hall! The wonderful Walden Downtown Beautification Committee with a volunteer force of approximately fifteen people planted eight hundred daffodil bulbs last Fall. This should provide

Walden with a forever wake up call to Spring and provide the residents with some beautiful flowers that make coming home a true pleasure. If you have other ideas to help freshen the entrances to Walden, please contact Stacey New and the Beautification Committee to volunteer or to share your ideas.

Beginning in 2025, homeowners will be responsible for reporting and managing their individual property landscaping issues via the CAMCO portal by preparing work requests. Ruppert Landscaping remains under contract as the landscaping contractor for the Walden Neighborhood. They do the landscaping for the townhomes, condos, common areas, and the grass and trees in the beauty-strips in front of the single-family homes. The Board is aware of several complaints about service last year, and Rupert has been made aware. If a problem exists, something does not get done quite right, or something gets missed completely, it will be the individual homeowner's responsibility to report that issue via the Walden Neighborhood website and the CAMCO homeowner portal. Once you are in the portal, click on "New Request," then "General Request," followed by "Work Order Request". You can then complete the required entries to include property address and a detailed description of the work order. This work request will be downloaded by CAMCO and passed over to Ruppert Landscaping for a quick resolution (hopefully within 1 to 2 weeks). Thus, every homeowner is encouraged to make sure they have access to the CAMCO portal and if not, contact CAMCO to get started.

When Silver Spring Township Authority issues its quarterly wastewater bills, the usual question from Walden residents is, "Didn't I just pay that

bill a few weeks ago?" This article will cover the types of bills sent by Silver Spring Township and Silver Spring Sewer Authority, the services for which the bill is rendered, and the service period covered. (This article is not intended to defend nor criticize the billing practices of the Township or the Authority; it's just to explain them.)

Let's start with some definitions, which sometimes are understandably confusing: *Sewage* (White Bill) is made up of solids and fluids which flow

from our toilets, sinks, washing machines and bathtubs. In Walden sewage service is provided by the Silver Spring Authority and is billed quarterly in arrears (after the service is provided). The Sewage bill consists of two components. First, the base bill per quarter is \$120 and includes an allowance of up to 9,000 gallons. Second, if a customer uses more than 9,000 gallons of water per quarter, the sewage bill will also include a volumetric charge at a rate of \$8.00 per 1,000 additional gallons of water used. So, if a customer used 12,000 gallons of water in a quarter, the bill for sewage service will be \$144; the base 9,000 plus the extra 3,000 used [\$120 + \$24 (\$8.00x3=\$24)]. Because of the Sewage Bill structure, if a customer's water use in a quarter is less than 9,000 gallons, the bill will still be \$120. Customers on private water wells are charged a flat rate of \$158.00/quarter. Sewage bills are charged quarterly in arrears because water usage must be provided by Pennsylvania American Water to the

Authority before it can calculate how much to bill for sewage service. Sewage bills are issued in January, April, July and October for the prior Stormwater (Blue Bill) is rainwater and everything that it collects as it flows into a stream or river. In Silver Spring Township, Stormwater Service is provided by the Township and is billed quarterly in advance of service. The stormwater fee is a flat rate of \$27.00 per quarter for each residential property. In some older communities sewage and stormwater flow into the same pipes which are commonly known as a combined system. In newer systems like the system serving Walden, pipes are separated, i.e., the pipes that carry sewage carry only sewage and the pipes that collect and carry stormwater, carry only stormwater.

Trash and Recycling (Blue Bill): Effective January 1, 2024, our Trash and Recycling services are contracted for and billed by Silver Spring Township for all residents, including Walden. Trash and Recycling is provided by a private hauler, Penn Waste, and is billed quarterly in advance along with Stormwater Service. Effective January 1, 2025 the fee for trash/recycling services was increased to \$82.02/quarter for low volume service (small \$95.16/quarter for and regular volume Trash/Recycling and Stormwater Bills are issued in March, June, September and December for service to be rendered in the next quarter.

To make life a bit simpler, customers can choose electronic payment for Sewage and Trash/Stormwater by visiting SSTWP.org and clicking on the "How Do I?" tab.

Something to Remember: If you are selling or buying a house, check to be sure at closing that both the Trash/Stormwater and Sewage charges are pro-rated correctly.

Meet Your Walden Neighbor, Roland Finch

If Johnny Cash was the Troubadour of Travel inside the USA, Roland Finch can claim the title internationally. He too had been everywhere, man. Born in Alaska before it became a state, he spent the first decade of his life traveling the world with his Air Force family. His father was an engineer who set up early warning and air defense systems in Japan, Spain, England, Germany and the Netherlands. When asked about his memories of that period, Roland said, "Everywhere was different, but all in the same way".

The Family Finch finally put down roots in Omaha, Nebraska when dad was assigned duty at the headquarters of the Strategic Air Command. Roland grew up there, attending Catholic Schools. He played fullback on the football team, became an expert on military history and found his true passion in music, playing guitar in a garage folk band, "The Prairie Men". He dabbled in songwriting, penning several songs celebrating, in his words, "wicked winds, gloom and despair". After earning a business degree from Minnesota State University, Roland spread his wings and flew off to New York City where he worked in an advertising firm on Madison Avenue. After a few modest successes, Roland hit it big with his famous "wonder where the yellow went" jingle. But, unhappy in the atmosphere of cutthroat competition and loose morals, he got a degree in International Relations from CCNY night school, landed a job in the Foreign Service, and began his second Odessey around the globe. His postings included Vietnam, Iran, Syria, Nicaragua, Iraq, Poland and Germany. The hotspots on his professional resume begged the question of his potential connection to any of our national security agencies. When asked, he said, "I can neither confirm nor deny that. But the day after the Berlin Wall

After retiring from the Foreign Service, with his children grown and his wife busy in her job as a public interest lawyer, Roland began a new career as a writer of science fiction romance novels under the nom de plume "Lorenzo Fortunato". Critics derisively described them as stories "where Star Trek meets Jane Austen", but the reading public became intrigued. Currently, he is in negotiations with the Hallmark Channel which has expressed interest in bringing some of his "sci-roms" to television.

we no longer need to put up and take down umbrellas. We will be installing gazebos this season and would welcome help from the community to assemble them when they arrive. The Board Liaison is Dee Clippinger and the Chair is Jim Campbell. Contact information will be provided in the spring when the committee reorganizes for the new season.

Walden Road Safety Committee met on Monday evening March 10. The committee discussed the following key items and will make several recommendations to the WNA Board at the Annual Meeting on March 27: Several handicapped ramps need to be repaired in the Crossroads area on Bryant Street. Additionally, a recommendation for installing two new handicapped ramps at the corner of Line Road and Walden Way will be made along with a recommendation for the Board to conduct an ADA study for the community.

The Committee will recommend that all 18 main street speed limit signs be changed to 20 MPH, and that 8 additional speed limit signs be installed in areas of the community where signs currently do not exist.

The committee discussed sending notifications out to residents to remind them that vehicles are not permitted to park within 15 feet of any intersection, which is required by the WNA Vehicle Rules and Regulations. This is critical for first responder vehicles to navigate Walden's narrow roads during an emergency.

Other items will be presented at the Annual Meeting. The Board Liaison is Mark DiRocco.



WALDEN HOMEOWNERS' SPRING CHECKLIST

Spring is in the air! Here are some tips from Mark Pedersen for making your Walden home ready for the season:

- ✓ Pick up sticks, grass, clippings, and yard debris from winter storms.
- ✓ Weed and mulch flower and vegetable garden beds (black-dyed mulch is the only approved one for the development).
- ✓ Trim perennials, plants, and bushes to allow for spring growth.
- ✓ Remove winter covers from hose bibs. Fix any leaking hose bibs and then hook up hoses & nozzles.
- ✓ Replace all burnt-out bulbs on your front porch lights, lamppost light, and twin garage lights; fix or replace any inoperable auto eye light sensors.
- ✓ Identify sidewalk gaps or unevenness on your sidewalks so that they can be repaired. Each homeowner is responsible for your sidewalk repairs. HOA is responsible for fixing the common area sidewalks.
- ✓ Place all trash cans in the garage. It is against HOA rules for trash cans to be stored in the yard, on porches, or on the driveway.
- ✓ Put all empty planters or containers in the garage.
- ✓ Make sure dog-poop containers are in the garage.
- ✓ Put all bicycles, skateboards, trikes, big wheels, battery operated kid cars, scooters, balls, and sports equipment in the garage every day after use.
- ✓ Remove unauthorized flags no country flags other than the U.S.
 Flag, and no state flags are allowed. Small decorative, non-political yard flags are allowed.

 ✓ Paint or touch-up subgrade foundation.
- ✓ Wash and clean vinyl fencing to remove black marks, mildew, and
- bird droppings.

 ✓ Sealcoat your asphalt driveway if needed.
- ✓ Power wash dirt & mildew on siding, windows, gutters, and shutters.

- ✓ Repair any broken or missing Hardie Board siding.


