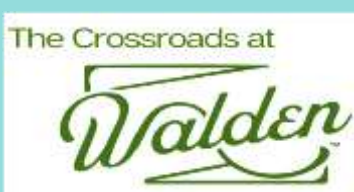

MEET 'N TWEET: WHITE-THROATED SPARROW

Today, I'd like to write about a bird that captivated me this past spring with its beautiful song: the White-throated Sparrow! Their clear whistle is described as sounding like "Oh sweet Canada, Canada, Canada" and is a lovely backing track to spring mornings.



One unique fact about this bird is that it comes in two color morphs, equipped with varying personalities. Sparrows with bright white-striped heads are often bolder and more aggressive. Those with tan-striped heads are less aggressive

and more nurturing. Both morphs occur in males and females and even more interesting is...opposites attract! The bold white-striped birds pair with the gentler tan-striped birds and vice versa. This coloring and behavior stems from their genes and affects everything from singing behavior to parenting style.

White-throated Sparrows love to scratch for seeds and insects on the ground, so always be sure to glance below your feeders. They use a distinctive double-scratch technique where they jump forward and scratch backwards with both feet at the same time. Though they migrate, they often return to the same sites year after year, so the sparrow you see at your feeder might be an old friend.

Another fascinating fact is that they can alter their song. At one point, researchers discovered a newer version of the White-throated Sparrow song and watched it gradually replace another over thousands of miles, like a hit song going viral. Seems humans are not the only species to get caught up in what's trending!

Be sure to listen for their beautiful song the next time spring comes to

Walden. You might also see them calmly hopping around gardens, along the woodland edges, and below your feeders. These sparrows might not be at the top of everyone's radar for backyard birds, but they certainly deserve to be with their special songs and unusual genetics!





SILVER SPRING TOWNSHIP NEWS

Welcome to the middle of summer. It is hot and prime time for projects to be in full swing around the Township.

First, there are two updates on Woods Drive. The segment between Silver Spring Rd. and Mulberry will see some repairs over the next few months. By the time the newsletter is published, there should be some repairs completed near the intersection as some of the pavement there is unexpectedly failing. Also, the Township Manager mentioned that the developer for Spring Creek Farms (past the 4-way stop at Mulberry) is going to be doing some further road improvements as well. (I was not able to get more details on these improvements.)

On the other end of Woods Drive, the segment between Hogestown Road (Route 114) and Carlisle Pike is also going to be widened – they will add more width to each lane and create walkable shoulders. The specifics are still under development but expect this major work in 2027 or 2028.

Finally, Paul Walters Park is expected to open in October but no specific date has been set yet according to the Township Manager. Until that time, **please stay out of the park grounds so the construction crews can finish their work quickly and safely.**

National Night Out, an annual event promoting partnerships between emergency services (police, fire, and EMS) and the community, took place at Stony Ridge Park on Tuesday, August 4th. There was free food, interaction with safety equipment, bike safety events, and a variety of other things to do.

NEW WALDEN BOARD SAFETY RESOLUTION

As part of the ongoing commitment to keeping Walden a safe place to live,



the WNA Board of Directors recently adopted a new “Property Identification and Safety Resolution”. The primary goal of this resolution is to ensure that emergency first responders (i.e. police, fire, and medical personnel), delivery

services, and Association vendors can quickly and accurately identify your home, especially from rear access points and common areas. This update is primarily aimed at the many homes in our community with **alley-facing or rear-access garages** that currently have no identification on them. If your home has a **front-facing garage** and you already have visible address numbers on the front of your house, you are already in compliance.

What You Need to Do:

To maintain a uniform look throughout Walden, the Board has established specific guidelines for address numbers on rear garages:

- **Location:** Numbers must be installed directly onto garage door trim.
- **Required Style:** Black 4-inch nail-on house numbers are recommended, but you may use an alternative installation method if nails won't work on your trim or the trim is too narrow. A narrower font or slightly smaller numbers may be used to ensure a proper fit. Please note that sticker numbers are not acceptable, as they peel and fade over time.

Compliance Timeline:

Now through December 31, 2026 is a friendly reminder period to give you time to purchase and install your house numbers. **On January 1, 2027** official enforcement begins. Properties not in compliance after this date may be subject to violation notices and fines in accordance with the Association's governing documents.

LIVING IN WALDEN

Calling All Walden Landlords

Walden Neighborhood Association (WNA) does not have a limitation on the number of units that can be rented but it does have rules regulating rentals in the neighborhood. So if you are considering renting your home in the short term or over the long term, understanding the WNA Rental rules related to notification/disclosure and payment of fees will avoid inadvertent issues for you or your tenant. The Basics

1. All leases must be in writing and must provide that the lease is subject to the rules and regulations of WNA.
2. A Member is defined as an Owner of a unit in Walden, as shown on a deed.
3. The definition of Tenant does not include an immediate family member of a Walden Member.

The Paperwork

4. Current copy of the Lease and any addendums must be filed with the WNA management company.
5. A WNA Lease Addendum must be incorporated into a Lease and filed with the WNA Management company.
6. A Tenant Registration Form must be filed with the WNA management company not less than 30 days prior to the effective date of the lease and annually thereafter.
7. A Member who fails to provide the **Lease**, the **WNA Lease Addendum** or the **Tenant Registration Form** shall be subject to an initial penalty of \$100. After Notice of a violation to a Member by the WNA, if the information is not provided within 10 business days, the Member shall be subject to an additional monthly fine of \$350/month until the information is provided to the WNA.
8. The Annual Registration Fee of \$100 shall be imposed on each Member per Lease. In any year in which the Tenant does not change or if there is no lease renewal, the Annual Registration Fee is \$50.00. Failure to submit the annual rental fee shall result in a late penalty of \$50/month.
9. All fees will be assessments against the unit.

PET BOYS: A DOG’S BEST FRIEND

Walden is fortunate to have a dog grooming business in our community which is conveniently located in the Walden Crossroads at 142 Walden Way. **Pet Boys**, founded by John Dunstan and Charles Heck in Camp Hill, has been a longstanding member of the Shops at Walden since 2014. After John passed in 2025, Heather Lang bought the business on May 1, 2026. Although she is a new owner, Heather’s been grooming dogs since she was 18, has worked at Pet Boys since 2023, and honors the business model.

Pet Boys offers grooming for dogs only, without limitation as to size or breed. Grooming is performed by Heather and Andy Gemmer with a total of 25 years grooming experience. Pet Boys is an open run shop; the dogs are not put in kennels. The charge for grooming is all in---no add on fees.

When asked for tips, Heather recommended brushing regularly as the best way to keep your pooch looking the best. (If you wonder if dogs like to be groomed, consider that there is one dog, who will remain unnamed, who escapes from home periodically and comes to the shop to visit.)

When asked how the community can support Pet Boys, Heather advised that any activities that bring more people into Walden are helpful, as are referrals from dog owners who have used their services.

WALDEN LANDSCAPING COMMITTEE

Late Summer and Early Fall Landscape Health

As summer transitions into fall, many trees and shrubs begin to show signs of seasonal stress. Extended heat, dry conditions, and insect activity can cause leaves to yellow, develop brown edges, or drop earlier than expected. While some of these changes are a normal part of the season, residents should continue to monitor their landscapes for unusual dieback, discolored foliage, or signs of disease. Providing deep watering during extended dry periods and applying mulch around the base of trees and shrubs can help plants remain healthy as they prepare for winter.



Early fall is also an excellent time to inspect landscapes for broken branches, dead plant material, and invasive weeds. Removing damaged limbs and cleaning up fallen leaves around susceptible plants can reduce the risk of disease and improve the appearance of the community. Residents are encouraged to continue routine maintenance

of their landscape beds throughout the season to keep plants healthy and the community looking its best.

The **Walden Pool Committee** has been hard at work throughout the season to keep our community pool clean, safe, and enjoyable for everyone. Every evening, our dedicated volunteers close the pool, tidy the facility, and prepare it for the next day's visitors. Their commitment helps ensure that the pool remains one of Walden's favorite amenities.

We ask all residents to do their part by leaving the pool area better than they found it. Please dispose of all trash, clean up after your family, and close umbrellas before leaving. Small efforts from everyone make a big difference and help our volunteers tremendously.

We're also excited to share that the Pool Committee has recently purchased 15 new lounge chairs and is working to add two new tables with chairs and two new umbrellas to enhance the pool experience for all residents.

Some Important Pool Reminders:

Updated Pool Hours

Beginning July 27, the Walden Pool will be open daily from 6:00 AM to 8:00 PM. The pool will remain open through September 7, so there's still plenty of time to enjoy the remainder of the summer!

Youth Supervision Policy

One of the most frequently violated pool rules each season involves youth supervision. To ensure the safety of all children and remain in compliance with association guidelines, the following rules will be strictly enforced:

- Children ages 15 and under must be accompanied by a Walden member who is 18 years of age or older at all times.
- Members who are 16 or 17 years old may use the pool without adult supervision with parent or guardian approval; however, they may not supervise younger swimmers.

Please review these rules with all children and teens in your household before they visit the pool.

Sign-In and Guest Policy

To help maintain accurate occupancy and security records, all residents must sign in and sign out each time they use the pool. When signing the log, please include the last four digits of your access keycard.

Each Walden household may bring up to two guests. Guests must be accompanied and supervised by a household member who is 18 years of age or older for the duration of their visit. There are cameras monitoring the pool at all times.

Access and Property Care

Please remember that the front gate is the only authorized entrance and exit to the pool area. Climbing over the fence is strictly prohibited. The pool fence is essential for community security and insurance compliance. Any damage caused to the fencing will be charged to the responsible homeowner.

If your access keycard is not working, do not force the gate or attempt to climb the fence. Instead, contact CAMCO Management to verify your account status and have your access card checked.

CAMCO Management reviews the submitted applications for architectural changes to ensure they are complete and then provides the completed submissions to the NACB to verify the project is consistent with standards and appearance of Walden set forth in the Walden Guidelines for Architecturally Controlled Improvements. The NACB conducts a thorough review of the project and application. Three NACB members are appointed to a one-year term. These members do not need to be Unit owners, tenants, or residents of the Walden Community. A member may also be a member of the Walden Neighborhood Executive Board.

Walden Newsletter Committee confers every other month to prepare for the coming issue. Walden Neighborhood Association Executive Board is responsible for maintaining, replacing and repairing when required all of the Common Facilities and for maintaining the Controlled Facilities. The WNA Executive Board is made up of 9 members representing 4 classifications of Units in Walden: (2) Detached Dwelling (Single Family),(3) Interior Space (residents above Crossroads), (2) Attached Dwelling (Townhomes) and (2) Tract Units (commercial spaces). Each term is 3 years and members are elected by the homeowners of Walden in accordance with the Bylaws of the Association. The Tract Units automatically renew with Charter. The Executive Board will be constituted and organized and will operate in accordance with the Bylaws of the Association.
