The History of April Fools' Day
The history of April Fools' Day goes back to 1582, when
France switched from Julian Calendar to the Gregorian Calendar (the one that is still in use today). The reason that
this change caused April fools' was when using the Julian
Calendar the new year started on the spring equinox
around April 1st, but in the Gregorian Calendar the new
year starts on January 1st. The news of this change was slow
getting around and many people continued to celebrate the
holiday at the end of March through April 1st. This lead to
April Fools' Day coming about as a result of the people who
celebrated the New Year on January 1st poking fun at the
people that still celebrated the holiday in March up to April
1st.

#### Hilaria in Ancient Rome

Historians have also linked April Fools' Day to festivals such as Hilaria (Latin for *joyful*), which was celebrated in ancient Rome at the end of March by followers of the cult of Cybele. It involved people dressing up in disguises and mocking fellow citizens and even magistrates and was said to be inspired by the Egyptian legend of Isis, Osiris and Seth. There's also speculation that April Fools' Day was tied to the vernal equinox, or first day of spring in the Northern Hemisphersphere, when Mother Nature fooled people with changing, unpre-

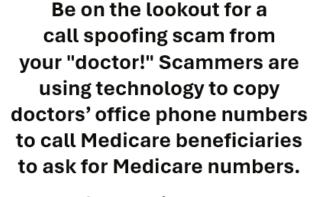

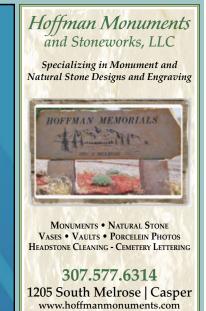

Gardening in Wyoming - What to Plant in Spring & Fall

Understanding Wyoming Hardiness Zones Hardiness zones, sometimes referred to as "growing zones" or "planting zones", were created by the USDA to help gardeners determine which plants are best suited for a particular location. Wyoming encompasses 4 hardiness zones. They are zones 3, 4, 5 and 6. Zone 6 During the spring in Wyoming zone 6, try planting short season produce in March that prefer cold weather, such as <a href="kale">kale</a>, <a href="broccolini">broccolini</a>, and <a href="broccolini">beets</a>. These crops will feel much more comfortable in the moderate temperatures of spring, as opposed to the intensity of a Wyoming summer. And their short growing period means once temperatures begin to rise, they'll be ready to harvest and replaced with plants more adapt to the Wyoming heat. In Wyoming growing zones 3, 4 and 5, spring is considerably cold compared to most other areas. As a result, the viable growing season in these locations is fairly short. Wyoming rule of thumb... Never put any-

#### DO wear high heels.

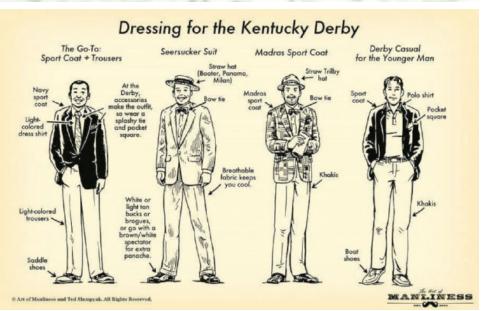

wouldn't wear elsewhere. Plus—don't forget loud and fun socks, snazzy hats, and definitely the very best cufflinks!





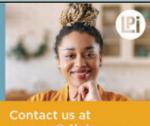
# Volunteer Appreciation Week

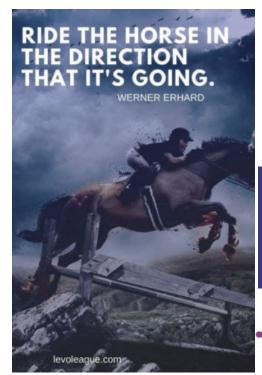

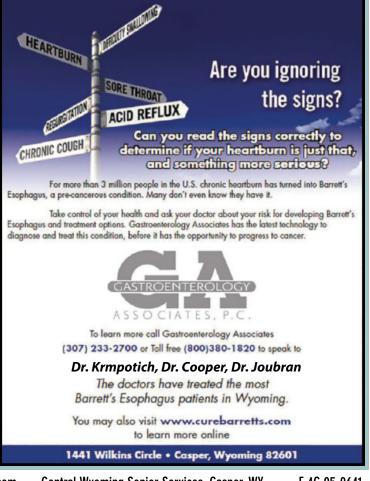

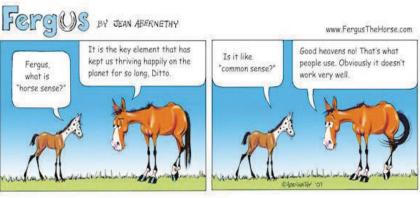




# Who would like to sing and dance??
