

Notes from the Kitchen

The 3 Reasons You Should Rinse Your Canned Beans

I'm a fan of canned beans—they're convenient, affordable, and most importantly, delicious. At least once a week, I use canned beans and legumes like chickpeas, black beans, pinto beans, and white beans in chilis, stews, salads, and more. And though I'm not always one to follow recipes to a T, when the instructions call for draining and rinsing canned beans, I dutifully dump them into a colander, run cold water over them, and drain them.

It turns out there are several good reasons that recipes call for rinsing canned beans. One commonly known reason is that rinsing can remove up to 41% of the sodium (i.e. salt), according to The Bean Institute, a website managed by the Bean Growers Association of North Dakota and Minnesota. To learn more about why you should take those "drain and rinse" orders seriously—plus when you might want to skip rinsing—I spoke to Richard LaMarita, chef-instructor of Plant -Based Culinary Arts at the Institute of Culinary Education. Here's what I learned.

"Rinsing does three things besides reducing salt content," says LaMarita.

- 1. It impacts the flavor of your food: "[Rinsing] gives the beans a cleaner mouthfeel and prevents the gel-like coating from altering the flavors of the surrounding ingredients." This is why you might want to rinse canned beans, even if you are making a dish that calls for additional liquid, as tempting as it might be to use the liquid from the can.
- 2. **Get consistent dishes every time**: LaMarita says another good reason to drain and rinse beans is so you can consistently replicate dishes. "If you rinse your beans thoroughly, you will have a consistently flavored product, but if you do not rinse them, different amounts of salt will remain in the dish each time you cook it, and it will be hard to cook consistently," he says. So if you want your chickpea curry or black bean tacos to taste the same every time you make them, go ahead and give those beans a rinse.
- 3. It may mean you'll be less gassy: "The reason the juice has a gel-like texture is that it is full of soluble fiber," says LaMarita. "A significant and sudden increase in fibe can cause bloating and gas. The fiber in the beans might do that anyway, but rinsing the beans helps." LaMarita adds that for people who normally have a high-fiber diet, the difference between using unrinsed

and rinsed beans might not be that noticeable and that symptoms generally go down over time, but if you are cooking for people who don't eat a lot of fiber, they may feel bloated afterward.

Is It OK To Eat the Liquid?

"The liquid is viscous, and tastes pretty good," says LaMarita. "It is also perfectly healthful to consume, so from a flavor perspective, there is nothing wrong with not rinsing." Indeed, unrinsed canned beans can be great from a culinary standpoint in dishes like white bean soup, where the liquid adds a "starchy richness," as the recipe developer Sheela Prakash notes. Draining but not rinsing canned chickpeas can also make for very creamy homemade hummus. Still, LaMarita comes down on the side of rinsing most of the time. "It depends on how much fiber you want to ingest, and who you are cooking for," he notes.

What if You're Using No-Salt-Added Canned Beans?

If your biggest concern with canned beans is the sodium, you can certainly use no-salt-added or low-sodium canned beans, but LaMarita still recommends rinsing in most cases for the same culinary and gas-reducing reasons you'd rinse canned beans with salt. Regardless of the amount of salt added to the canned beans, LaMarita says, "You still have to taste them and ask—is it the correct amount [of salt] to create a balanced dish?" and adjust for salt accordingly.

The Takeaway

Even if you are not concerned about sodium, in most cases it's a good idea to rinse canned beans. Rinsing beans can improve the flavor and texture of the final dish and can help cut down on how much gas they produce. So, for your culinary success and intestinal comfort, give those canned beans a rinse unless your recipe specifically says not to.



Everything you need to know about the 2024 Kentucky Derby: Date, time, and how to watch

The most exciting two minutes in sports is nearly here.

The 2024 Kentucky Derby is set to get underway in May, and when it does, it will be the 150th edition of the annual horse race. It's the first leg of horse racing's Triple Crown along with the Preakness Stakes and Belmont Stakes in the late spring/ early summer months.

The event is the most-watched and highest-attended horse race in the United States. Each year, hundreds of thousands of people head to Louisville, KY's Churchill Downs for the race as well as the two weeks of festivities at the Kentucky Derby Festi-

Here's everything you need to know about this year's Kentucky When (and what) is the Kentucky Oaks 2024?

When is the 2024 Kentucky Derby post-position draw?

Each year, Churchill Downs decides the starting post position of each horse with a draw. One official will pull a piece of paper with a horse's name out of a pile while another draws a paper with a gate number out of a separate pile. In years past, this draw occurred on the Monday before the race, five days ahead of time. This year, the post-position draw will occur on Saturday, April 27, a full week before race day.

How many horses race in the Kentucky Derby?

Each year's Kentucky Derby features 20 horses. They qualify from the United States as well as the "Japan Road to the Kentucky Derby" and European Road to the Kentucky Derby," according to the official race website.

How long is the Kentucky Derby?

The annual Kentucky Derby is 1 1/4 miles of racing, or 10 furlongs. It is about two kilometers.

What is the Kentucky Derby record?

Secretariat set the record at Churchill Downs in 1973 with a time of 1:59.4.

The Kentucky Oaks, the Derby's sister race, is a stakes race for three-year-old Thoroughbred fillies, or female horses. This year's Kentucky Oaks will take place one day before the Kentucky Derby-Friday, May 3, 2024.



The Kentucky Derby's 1933 'Fighting Finish'

Prior to the 1930s, the Derby and Preakness were often run on the same day, or only one week apart. Therefor, few horses ever raced in both contests. But in 1930, Gallant Fox shocked the racing world by winning The Preakness (which was run before the Derby then), The Kentucky Derby, and The Belmont Stakes back to back. In 1931, the racing establishment set the current Triple Crown schedule in stone, so that the Derby would always precede The Preakness by two weeks and be followed by The Belmont Stakes three weeks later.

Rough riding

Racing was just plain rough in those days—and there is no better example than the 1933 Kentucky Derby, also known as the "Fighting Finish." But as rough as the riding was in that era, I doubt the crowd on hand expected to see 18-year-old jockey Don Meade and 22-year-old rider Herb Fisher street fighting atop two horses down the length of the stretch during the big race.

As the horses straightened out off the final turn, Meade sent Brokers Tip through a narrow seam on the rail and got on even terms with the leader, Head Play, with Fisher aboard. Fisher tried to make it tough for Brokers Tip and pinned him on the rail. The jockeys grabbed and tussled with each other, and Fisher even whipped Meade after the foursome crossed the wire only noses apart.

There were no cameras on the wire to determine a close finish in those days. The winner was determined by the stewards, who announced that Brokers Tip had won the race by a nose. But Fisher was sure he and Head Play had won the race and he also thought he was fouled. His claim was disallowed and the rider was in tears at the decision.

By the time the riders got back to the jockeys room, their emotions boiled over and a fistfight ensued. It was eventually broken up by fellow jockeys and news reporters. Both riders were suspended for 30 days and Fisher received an extra five for starting the fistfight.

Meade would speak of the drama many years later: "I couldn't push him away from me because he had a hold of me, so I had to get a hold of him," he told *The Courier Journal*. "So, from there down to the wire, that's what it was, grab and grab and grab. ... It was more or less everyone for themselves in those days."

As for the top-two Derby finishers, they met up again in The Preakness. Head Play proved superior while romping in the race, and Brokers Tip ran dead last. Head Play would go on and have a productive career and was named 3-year-old champion of 1933. Brokers Tip would never win another race and remains the last maiden to win The Kentucky Derby.

Wallace Lowery, a *Courier Journal* photographer, managed to snap the only head-on picture of the melee, while laying under the rail. Like the race, the photo is known as the "Fighting Finish" and is one of the most famous in horse-racing history. The picture was developed and later printed in *The Courier Journal*. The publication was out on the street within one hour and 40 minutes of the race ending.




