2024 Happenings and Reminders

2024 NRHA Oceania Affiliate Championship: September 23-28 in Tatura

In 2024, our Oceania Affiliate Championship will be graciously hosted by the Victorian Reining Horse Association in Tatura, Australia, September 23–28. The qualifiers list will be posted mid-summer. 2024 New Rule Changes

Every other year, NRHA members in good standing can submit rule changes to the NRHA Board of Directors for review. If passed, the rule changes go into effect the following year. Please log in to the library in your ReinerSuite account to check out the 2024 rule changes that go into effect starting January 1! To submit a rule change for 2026, go to nrha.com/forms. 2026 rule change proposals must be submitted by December 31, 2024.

2024 NRHA Oceania Restricted Eligibility

The 2024 NRHA Oceania Restricted Eligibility Policy is posted on nrha.com/eligibility. The ReinerSuite Eligibility tool and ranking lists will be updated at the start of the new year. Do not forget to take a look before entering your first NRHA event of the 2024 season!

2024 Fee Updates

Each year, the NRHA Board reviews fees for member services and transactions. Visit nrha.com/fees to see the list of fees for the coming year.

2024 Deadline Reminders

If you or someone you know is an NRHA event secretary, please remember the deadlines for NRHA event approvals and show results! Moving efficiently helps to make event results available faster for NRHA members. These deadline reminders are found at nrha.com/showsec under Secretary Resources. Please remember that the currency exchange rates will be updated at the start of the year, and all recorded fees and payouts must be turned into NRHA in USD.

2024 Affiliate Renewal Deadline

Starting in 2024, all renewing affiliate paperwork is due by January 31, 2024, regardless of affiliate level (developing, regional, or national). If you or your affiliate need assistance submitting this paperwork, please reach out to NRHA, and we will be happy to help!

Who is the NRHA Oceania Affiliate Council?

They are responsible for guiding reining in Oceania and bringing their members' voices to the meetings while considering what is best for reining across Oceania. They suggest policies, submit and provide feedback on rule changes, review the NRHA Oceania Affiliate Championship event conditions, select the NRHA Oceania Affiliate Championship event location, approve the Oceania restricted eligibility policy, and so much more!

Better Your Backup

Avoid having a sticky backup with these tips from NRHA Professional Horseman Peter DeFreitas.

Picture this.

You're in the show pen and near the completion of a first-place pattern. But when it comes time to stop and back, your horse gets sticky, and instead of having a nice fluid backup, it requires you to pull and kick to get your horse to move his feet.

The last impression the judge has of you is you fighting with your horse to get him to back up, and that manoeuvre probably took you from having a winning run to being in the middle of the pack.

If you find yourself struggling to move your horse's feet when it comes time to back up, I have a few tips you can try at home to help him.

Back a Circle

To have total control of your horse's feet, you need to be able to move him around in any direction while keeping that backward motion. This is why I incorporate lots of circles into my backing at home.

You should be able to ask your horse to back and push his hips around without losing any movement. If you go to move his hips around and he locks his front feet before swinging his hind end around, take a hold of his face and ask him to move backward. Continue to use your outside leg to push the hip around, and fan your inside leg to create energy in your horse's feet.

The goal is to be able to do a complete circle without losing any momentum or having your horse's legs lock up as he manoeuvres his body around.

This drill can also help you in the show pen. If you go to back and find your horse backing crooked, you can support him with your leg and ask him to move his hips in the other direction to help straighten him back out.

Make It Quick

Having a horse that willingly backs up with speed is an easy way to gain points in the show pen and leave a lasting impression with the judges.

Ask for more speed in the back by going to your hand. If he's still sticky or not moving his feet quick enough, fan your legs in a steady rhythm to encourage more movement. This is where you must use pressure and release. When you go to your hand and ask for more speed from your horse, release your hand when you feel him speed up. That's going to reward him and let him know that when you go to your hand, if he speeds up, you'll release your hand.

Use Your Legs

Just like how your horse should be able to stop from your voice, leg, and hand cues individually, he should also be able to back using different leg, hand, and voice cues individually. After I stop, I will keep weight in my heels and fan my legs to ask for my horse to back.

The first couple of times you attempt this, your horse might be confused by the lack of hand cues. If your horse does try to walk forward, go to your hand, ask for the back, and then release when he backs up. Continue fanning your legs; if he tries to walk forward, go to your hand. He'll start to understand that the weight in your stirrups and how you're moving your feet is the cue to go backward.


