Visitor Center to get New Murals

Douglas Lemke, property owner of the building which houses the Northumberland Chamber of Commerce and Visitor Center in Callao, has commissioned two murals by the same mural artist participating with the Revitalization Project in The property was Callao. originally a Movie Theater. With that history in mind, Mr. Lemke requested the artist use a "movie marguis" theme to announce the Visitor Center. The proposed renderings are shown below.

Mr. Lemke, who purchased the property with his brother to have a permanent place to house the Chamber of Commerce, is looking for memorabilia and pictures of the building from the time when it was a theater. They want to put the pictures and memorabilia on display at the Visitor Center, along with the original movie projector, reels and the player piano.
