

DO YOU GROUP CONSCIENCE??

Tradition Two tells us that "for our group purpose there is but one authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants—they do not govern." But what is a group conscience? How can it be achieved?

A group conscience determines in advance who votes and if decisions will be reached by a simple majority, two-thirds of the votes, or three-quarters of the votes. An informed group conscience is obtained when everybody has access to all the information before discussion. If someone disagrees with the decision, Concept Five reminds us that members have the right of appeal and can express their opinion, which members will consider before deciding whether to revote or proceed.

Working towards recovery

Having a partner in a 12-step program of her own, I had heard of the steps and even knew of them. I started going to Al-Anon because I am the child of an alcohol. I have been told over the years that I could not blame my parents for how I was - it was just my fault and the ways things were. So that is what I thought.

I had sat through about four months of meetings when I was told I really needed to get a sponsor if I wanted to get recovery in Al-Anon. The meetings were working, but I was only attending one a week and did not feel like I was getting everything out of them that I should. I approached a member with excellent program and fortunately she took me under her wing. But she made it very clear that if I was going to be her sponsee I had to work for it. I knew I wanted to stop feeling the way I did so I was ready to dig in.

Working the steps with a sponsor helped me realize that I am only in control of myself. I did not cause the alcoholism in my family and I certainly cannot cure it or control it, as hard as I try. My sponsor and the steps made me take a hard, deep and sometimes painful look at myself and my role in recovery.

Recovery is a continual process. Missing meetings, not doing step work and not being in contact with my sponsor all make me slip in my recovery and I fall back into my old patterns. But since I do have recovery, getting back on track is so much easier that it was in the beginning.
