A couple of months ago, when I was elected Exalted Ruler of our Lodge, I could not have imagined that I would begin my term of office in a closed lodge. Closed, not because of anything we have done or failed to do, but because of a pandemic. I had anticipated dealing with any number of other issues, but nothing of this nature. Like many of you, I am looking forward to the time when the Lodge can re-open. However, I want to assure you that when we reopen, we will do so in a manner that respects and protects the health and safety of our members.

The COVID-19 pandemic is an unprecedented event. It is different from anything we have experienced in our lifetimes. It has affected or will affect all of us in one way or another. In times like this, our families should come first. However, we must also remember our Obligation as Elks, which demands that we come to the aid of others.

Last month, and on your behalf, the Lodge applied for and received a \$2,000 Elks National Foundation grant for the Harry Chapin Food Bank. In addition, the Lodge building was offered as a possible site for a temporary hospital, should one be needed. The Lodge continues to welcome charitable donations, which will certainly be put to good use during this difficult period.

Although communications have been spotty since the Lodge closed, we have been made aware of at least two of our members who have passed, Mary Lou Eichert and Elisabeth (Liz) Glosser. We pray for both our departed members and for their families.

Dues collections are lagging those of previous years. Part of the problem may be that the Lodge remains closed. It is also possible that the COVID-19 crisis has created financial challenges for some of our members. However, this crisis did not relieve the Lodge of its ongoing financial obligations, like utilities and mortgage payments. With the kitchen and bar closed, dues are the only source of revenue available to us. If you have not already done so, we urge you to promptly pay your dues.

One of the worst things about COVID-19 is that it has forced us apart. In most crisis situations, we would be gathering to comfort and support each other or to worship. We would be coming together to discuss ways to address the problem. Instead, this awful pandemic has separated us, forcing everyone to deal with this in near isolation. It was particularly painful for Anne and me when we were kept away from services during Holy Week.

Times like this should teach us that we do not control everything, and that we take too many of our blessings for granted. As strong as we perceive ourselves to be, sometimes, we need help, just as others need help from us. These are important lessons to learn, even if we have been forced to learn them during difficult times, brought about by horrible and unpredictable events.

God bless you and your family as we weather this crisis together.

My dad served as a gunner's mate on the USS Manley during the Second World War. This photo of his ship was taken in September, 1940, a little over a year before the United States entered the war.

The Manley was launched in August 1917 as DD-74, a 4-stack Caldwell-class Destroyer. The ship was decommissioned after World War I, and then recommissioned in May 1930. After modifications, including removing two of her four stacks and outfitting her with four Higgins landing boats, the Manley was reclassified in 1940 as APD-1, the Navy's first high-speed transport.

Serving in the South Pacific during World War II, the Manley earned five Battle Stars and a Navy Unit Commendation. From August to November in 1942, she landed troops and ammunition on Guadalcanal, and evacuated wounded Marines. She was part of the task force that invaded the Marshall Islands. She made strikes on the Kwajalein Atoll and participated in the invasion of Saipan. During the liberation of the Philippines, the Manley landed elements of the 11^{th} Airborne Division on Luzon. Later, she put troops ashore on Corregidor, in order to block the Japanese retreat into Bataan.

I share this with you not only because I am proud of my father's service, but also because it reminds me that America has defeated formidable enemies in the past. Many of them posed far greater threats to our way of life than does COVID-19. Just as in 1941, an attacker from the Far East took America by surprise. And while this virus represents a different type of adversary, America has overcome worse.

COVID-19 has not created just a health crisis; it has disrupted our lives and toppled one of the strongest economies in American history. As a result, millions of Americans are out of work.

In a free market economy like ours, the recovery of small businesses will have a greater impact on how our nation recovers than either government loans or big business. In other words, the speed and strength of America's recovery will depend largely on the recovery of neighborhood shops, offices, bars and restaurants.

As Elks and as Americans, we did our part to limit the spread of COVID-19. It's now our duty to help our communities recover from the economic carnage caused by this scourge. We must end our self-isolation, as soon as it is safe to do so. We may need to wear masks for a while, and we may have to continue social distancing. But, we must reject a bunker mentality and resume normal activities.

There will continue to be risks, but the greatest risk is that people will remain isolated in their homes for too long. If we don't get out and get the economy re-started, we will contribute to the collapse of even more businesses. The sad result will be that more of our friends and neighbors will lose their jobs.

Past generations of Americans overcame many challenges greater than those posed by COVID-19. It now falls to our generation to repair the economic damage inflicted by this horrible virus. We must emerge from our homes and patronize the bars, restaurants and retail establishments that have served us so well and for so long.

Only when we get out and get moving, will the economy begin to move again. And as we return to life as we knew it, don't forget to visit your Elks Lodge. You've been missed!
