



Prayer involves a personal and trusted relationship with God. gave a simple and short outline for prayer: praise God; pray for God's kingdom to be evident in First, he prayed often, something that is especially noted in the Gospel of Luke. Second, Jesus How can one comfortably and confidently speak to the Almighty? Jesus' followers wanted to vulnerability. When Jesus taught the disciples the Lord's Prayer, he did two important things. learn how to pray. Whether we are a person in the role of leadership in the congregation or ife; ask for food to stay alive; seek forgiveness; and ask for help to avoid times that test our one who participates regularly in worship and other activities, many of us feel ill-equipped when asked about our prayer life. It is normal to feel that way. There can be a feeling of Prayer gives praise and thanksgiving to God and requests for the basics in life, including character as a follower of Jesus.
